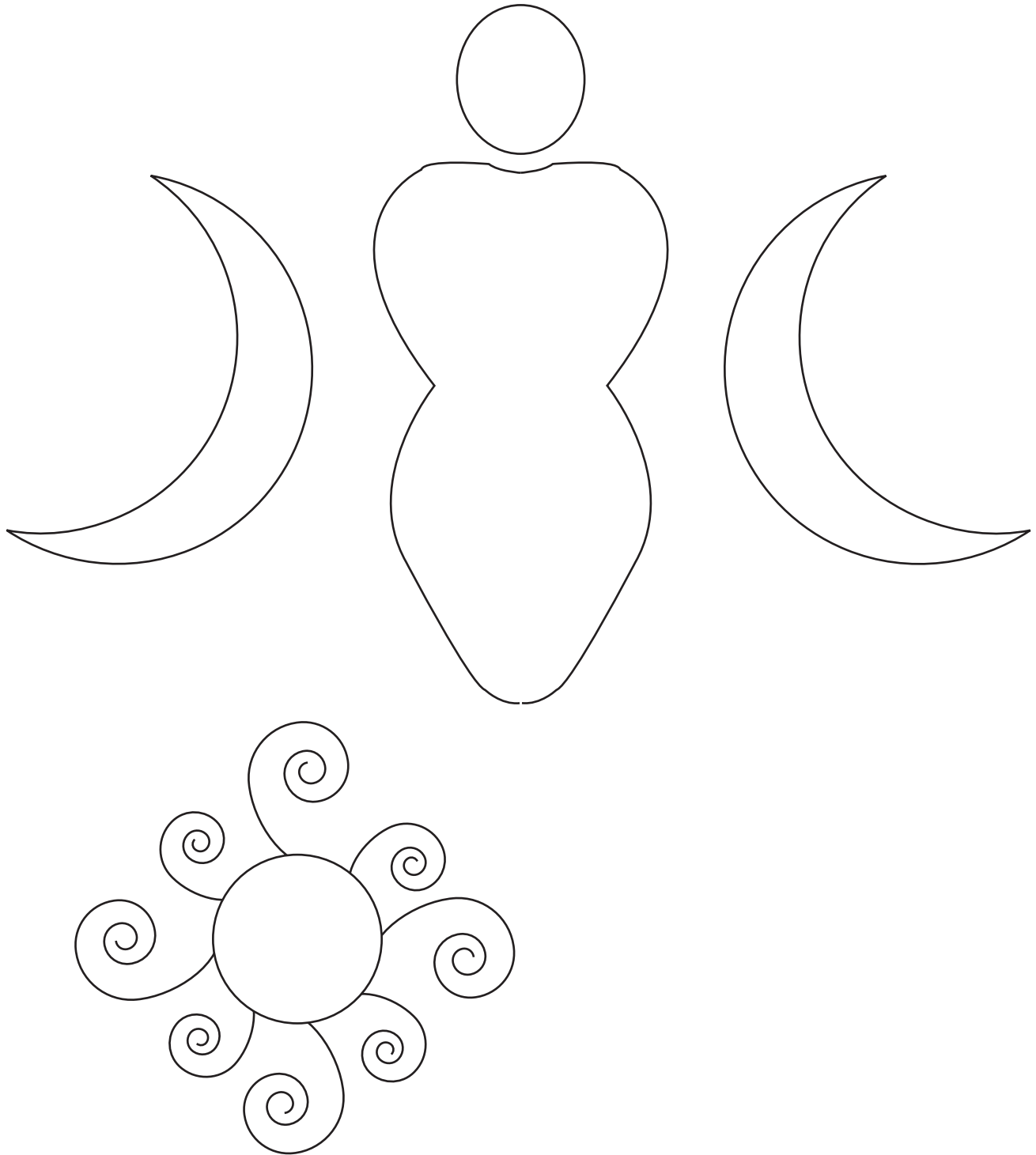


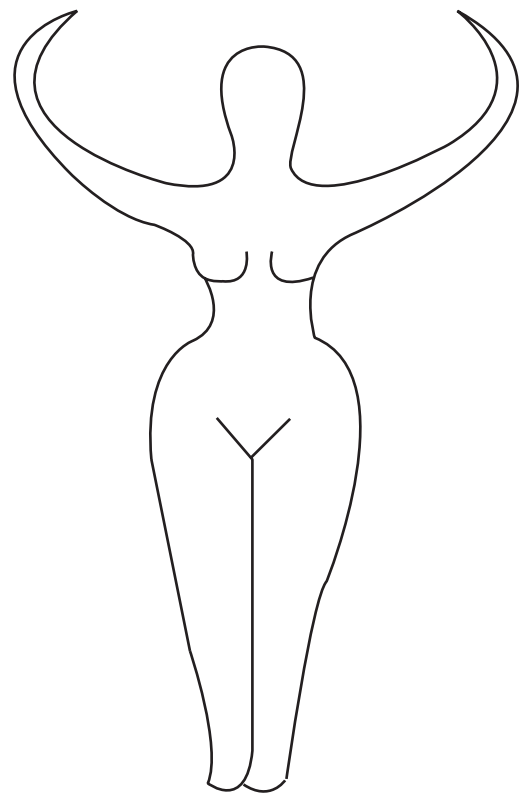
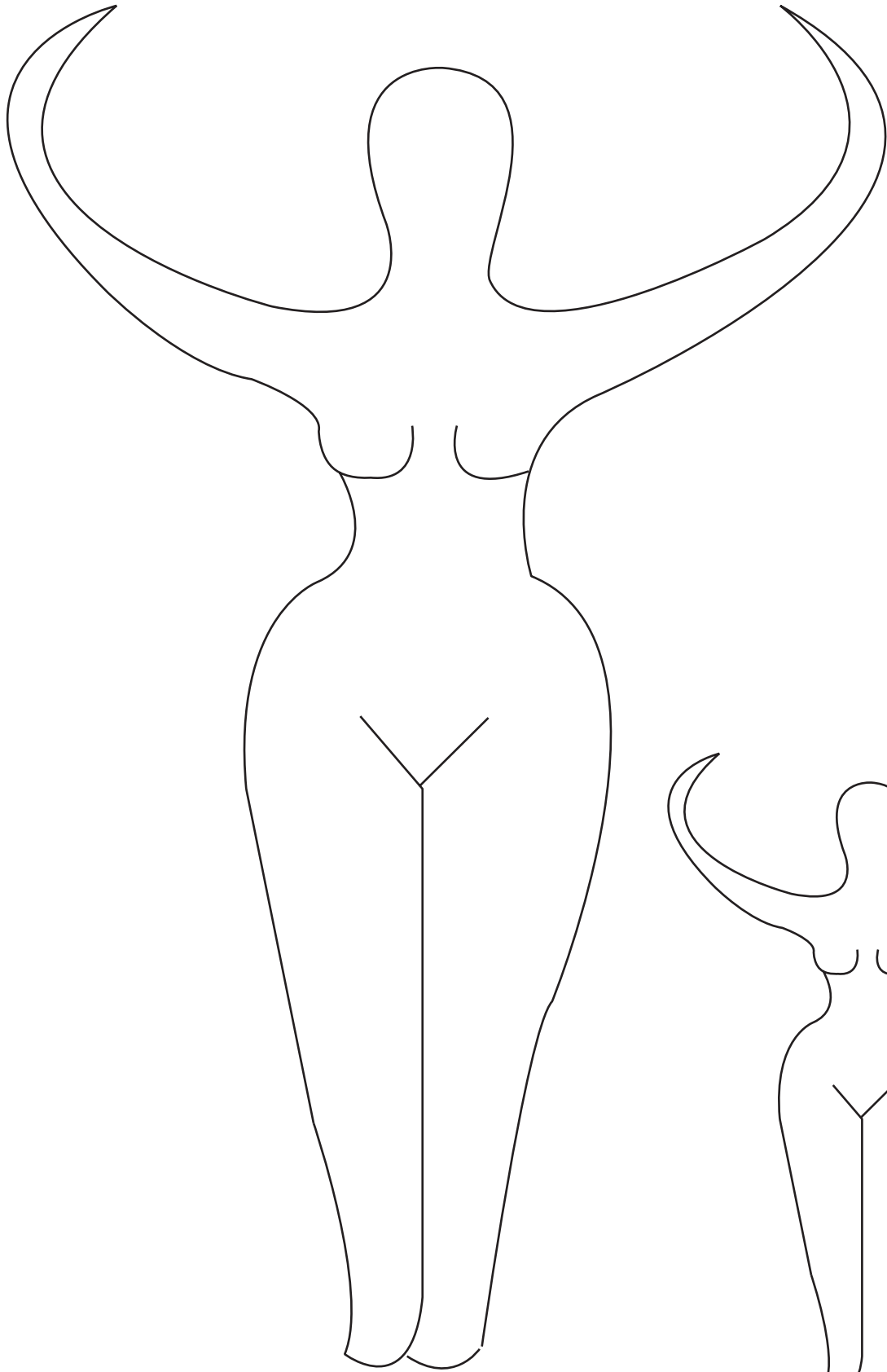
Patterns can be made into appliques and embroidery thread can be used as embellishments.

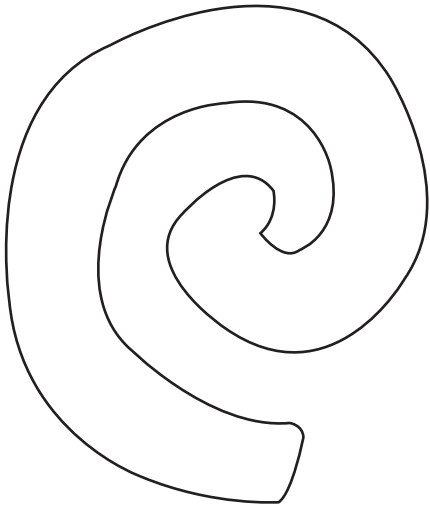
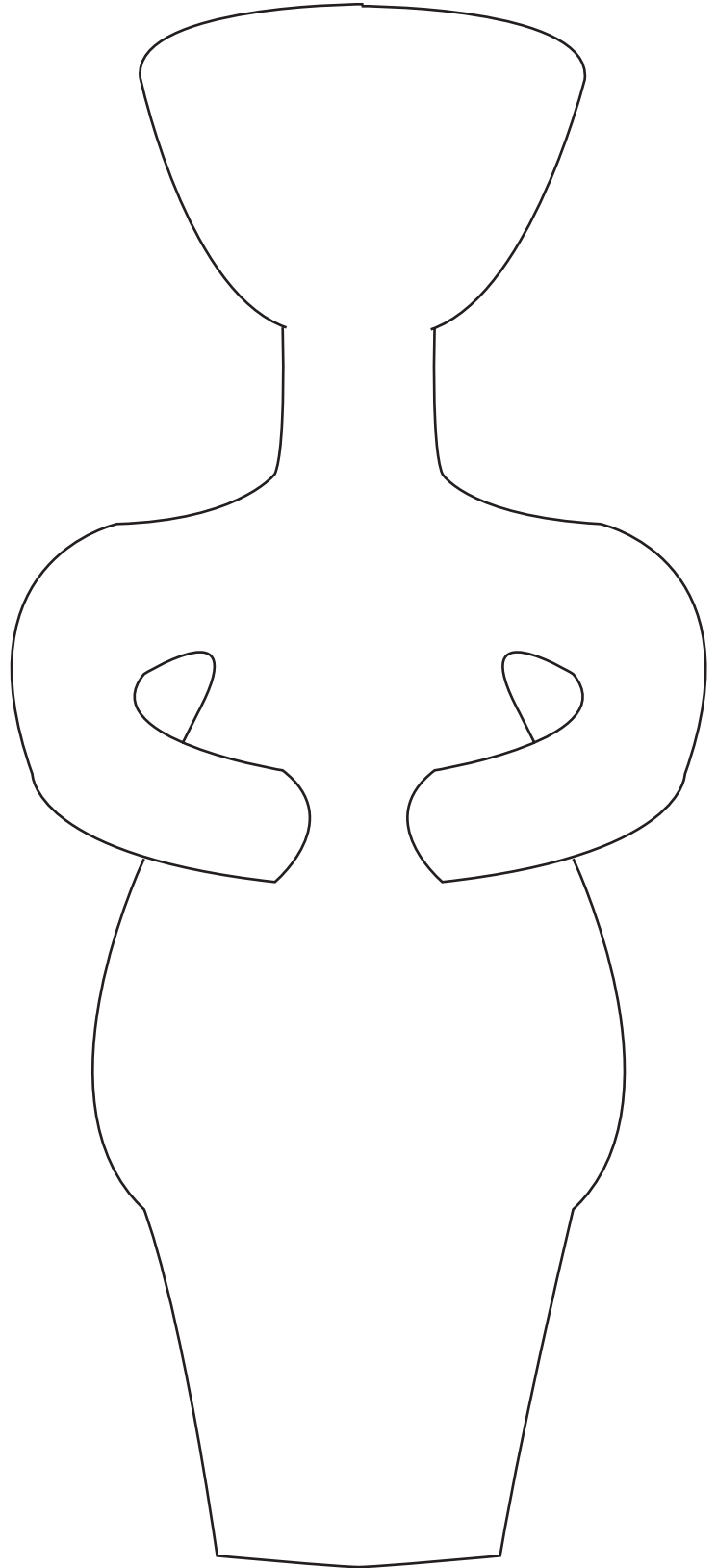
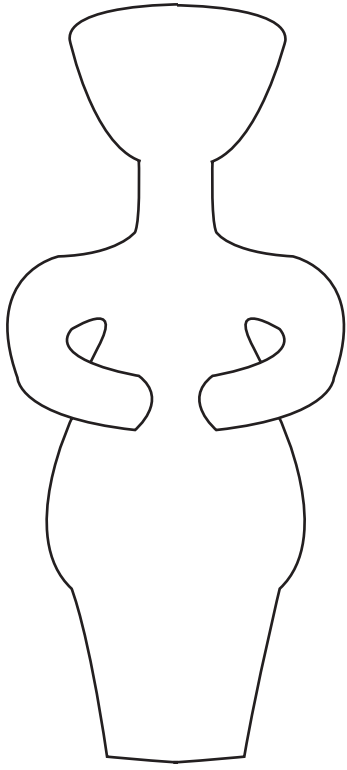




Altar cloths can be made by applying patterns onto a square piece of cloth. Felt works well for this and can be made into simple wall-hangings.

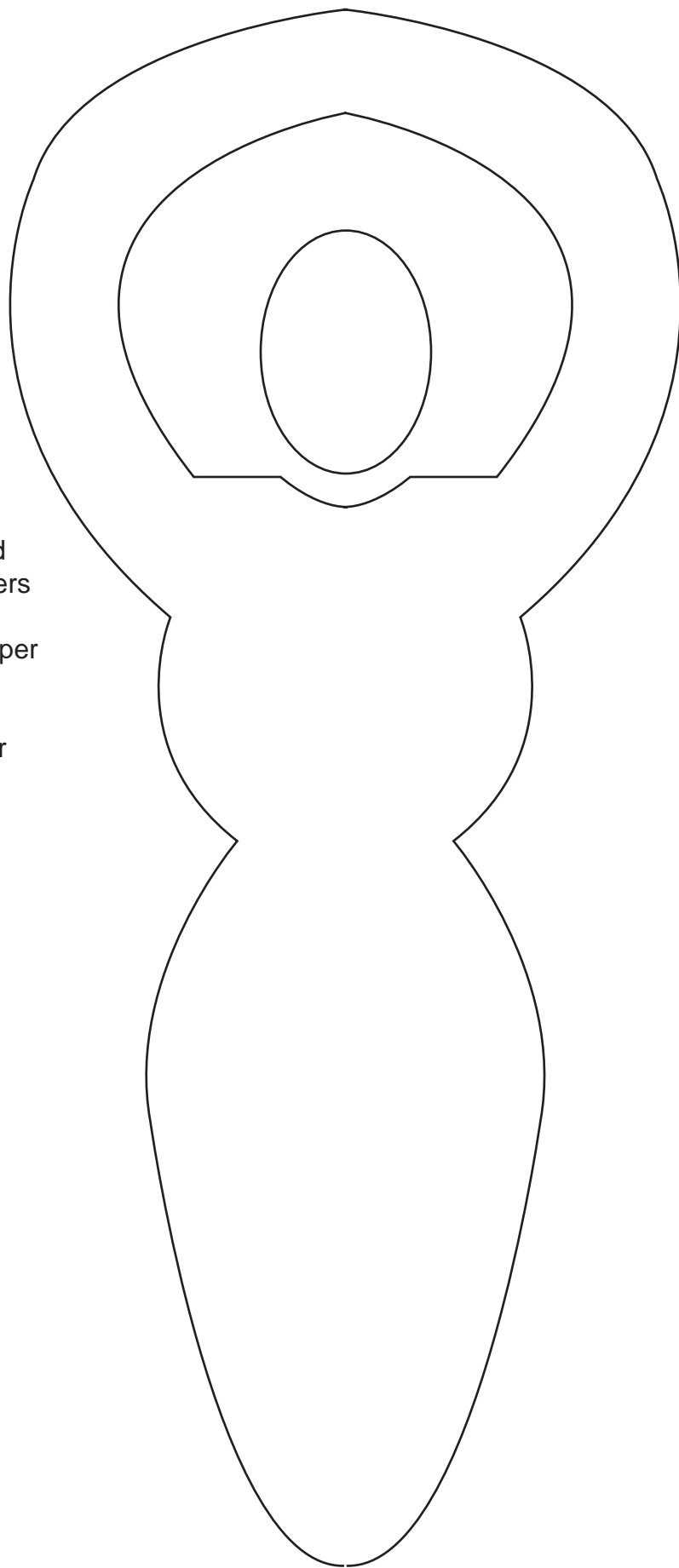
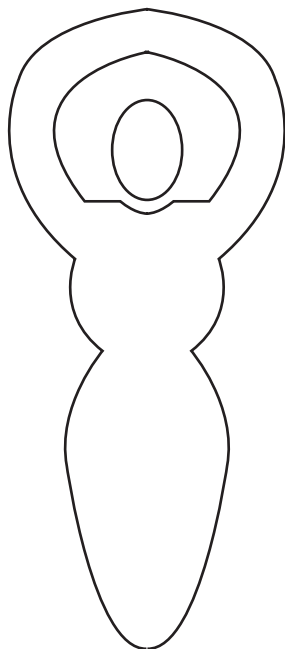


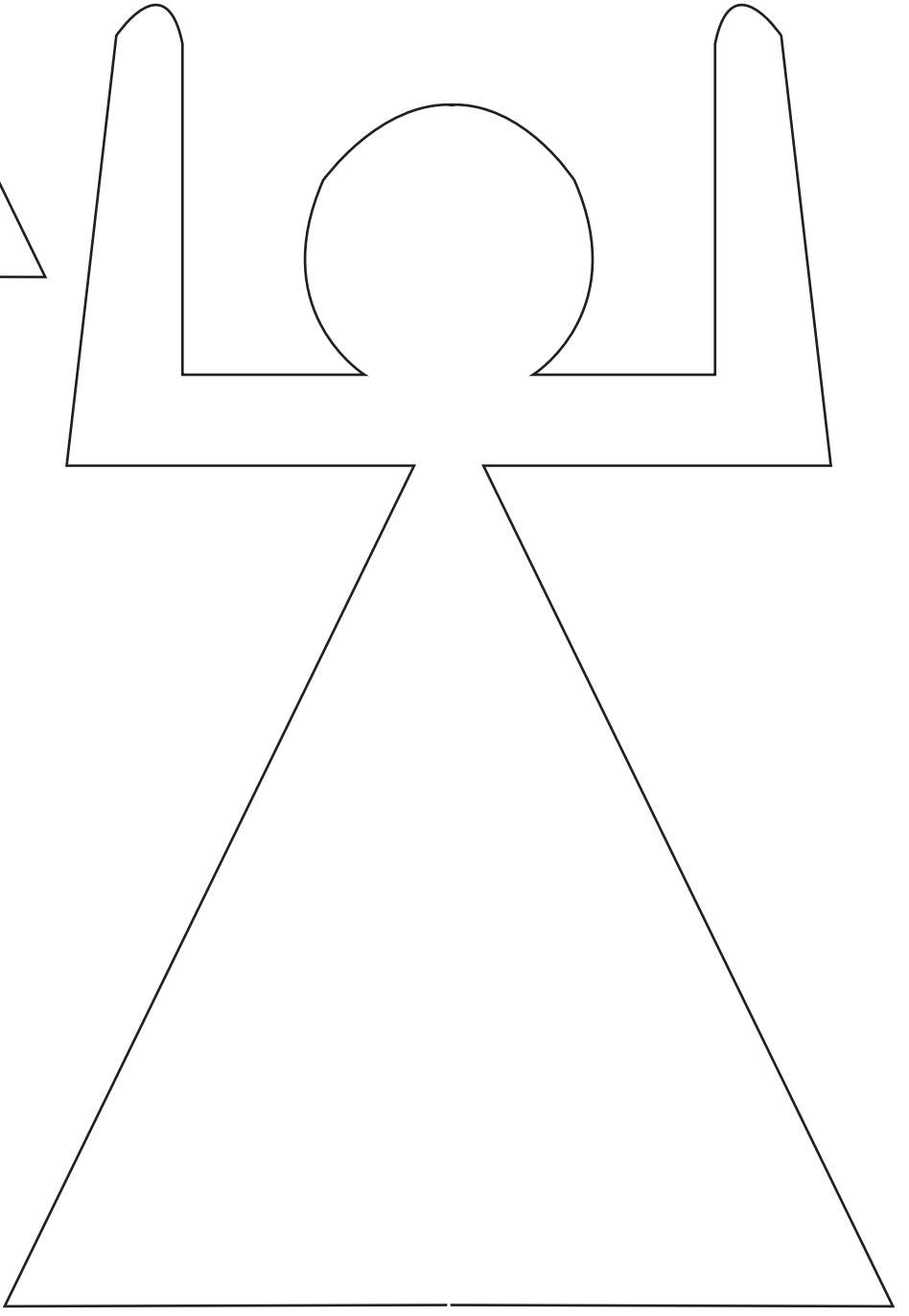
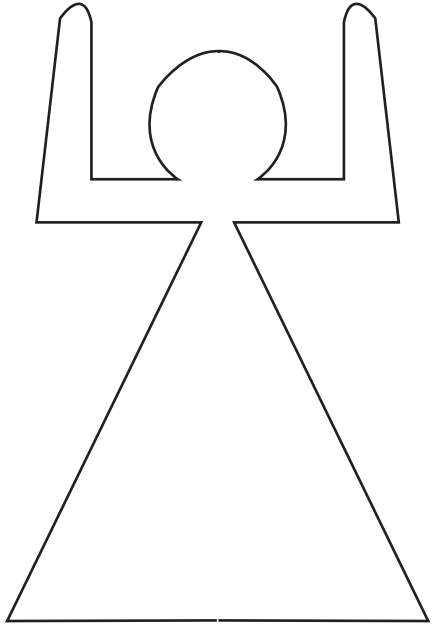


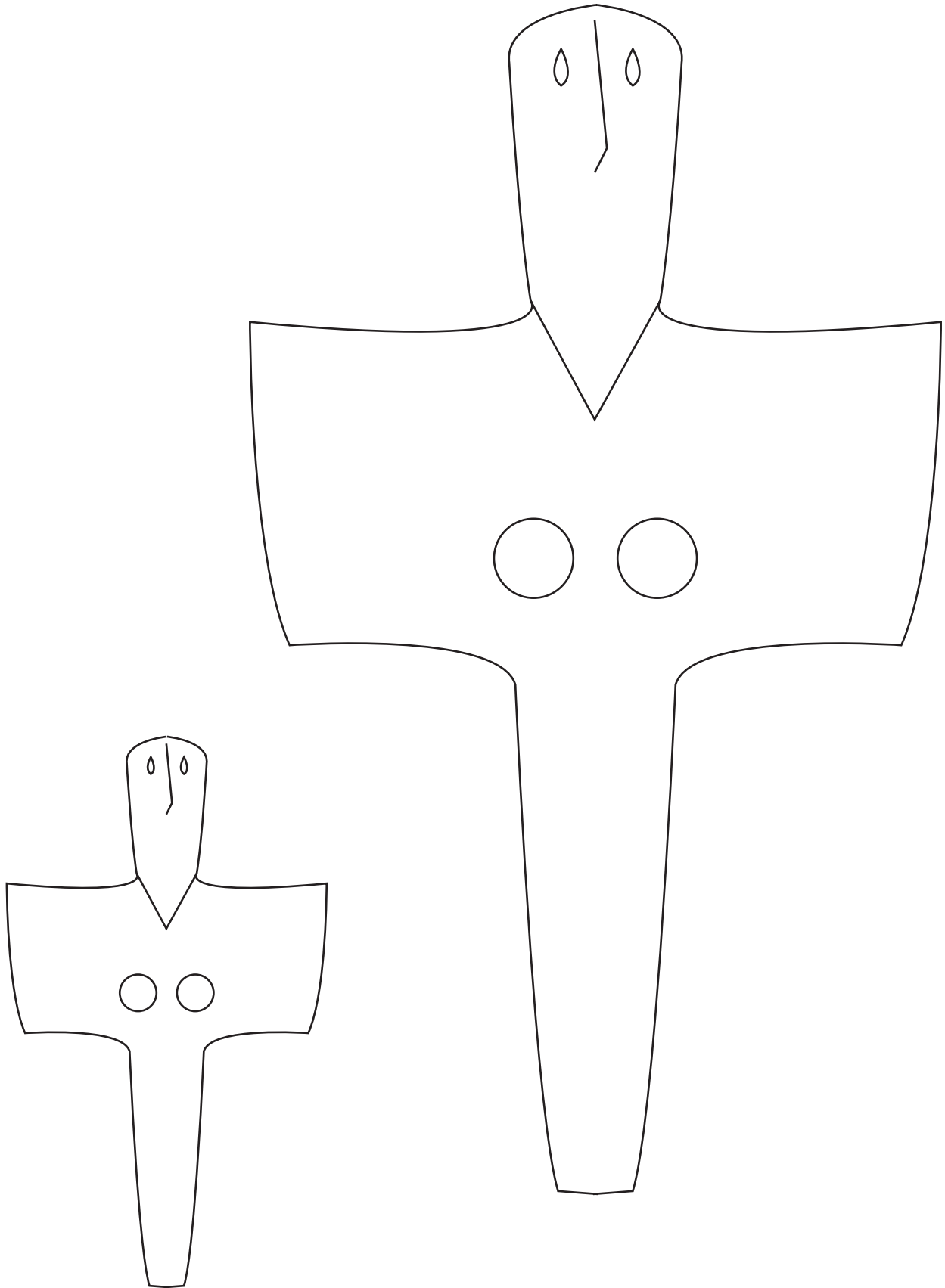


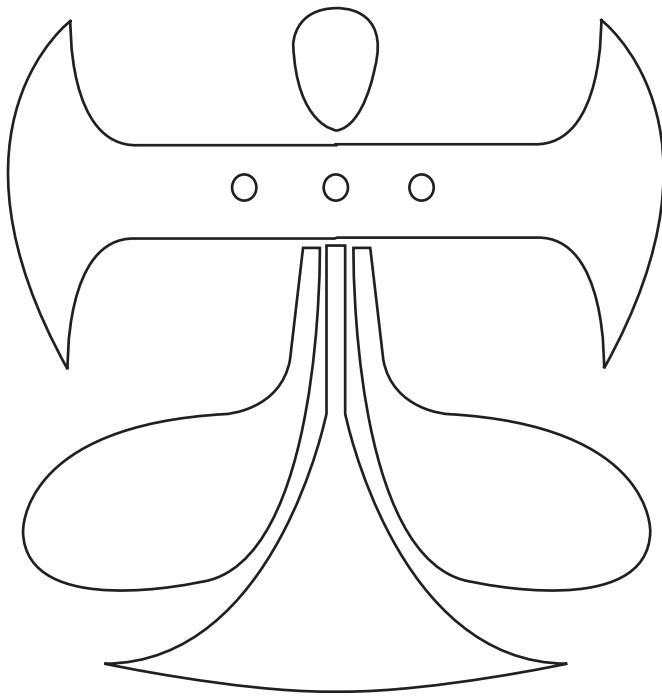
I have used the Goddess pattern on this page many times for making paper mache wall hangings. Just add two straight lines for Her neck and the pattern is in one piece.

Cut Her image out of either cardboard or pressed board. Cover her with 3 layers of stripped newspaper that have been dipped into a paper mache solution. This is usually an equal blend of water and flour or wallpaper paste.

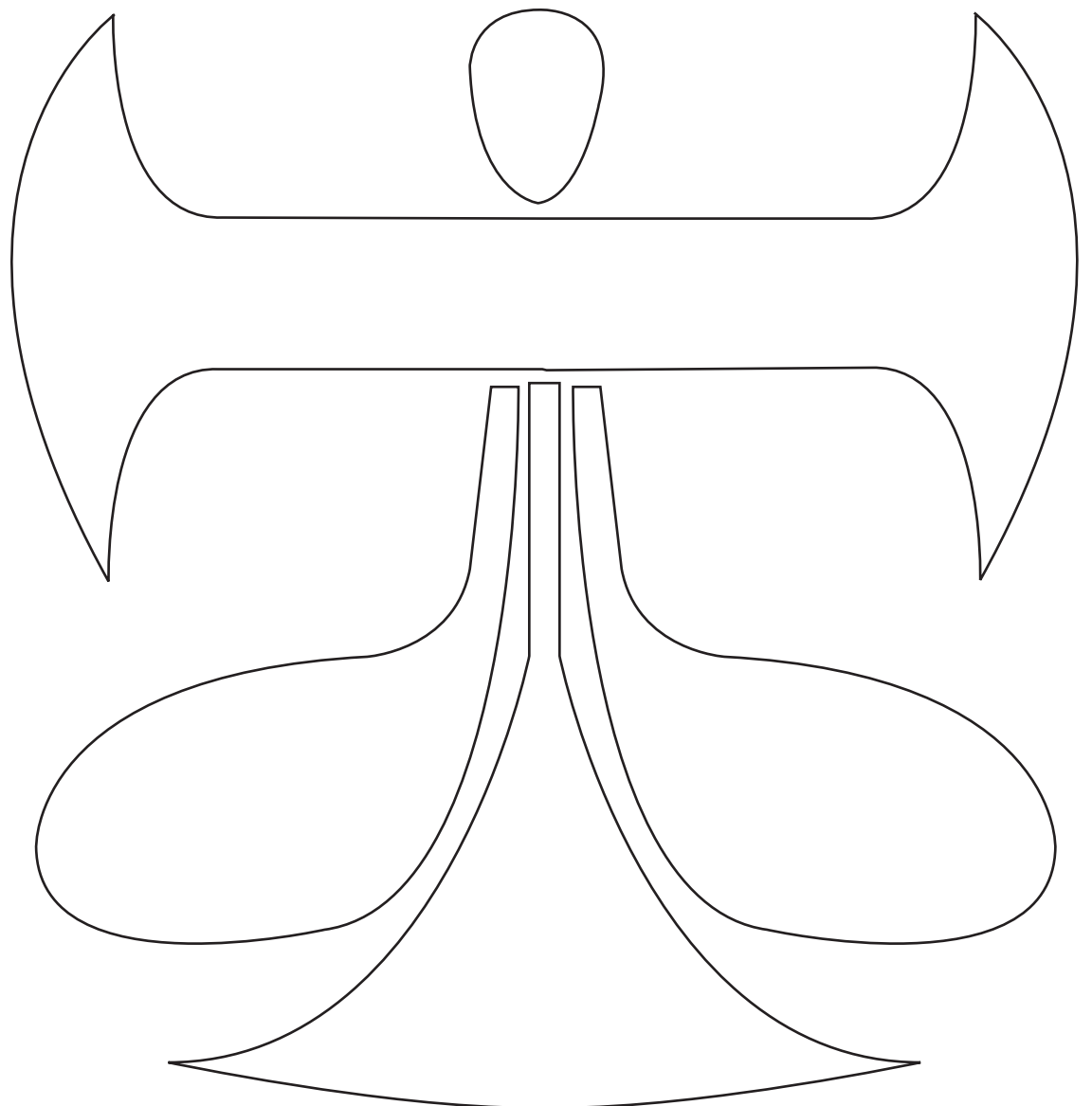


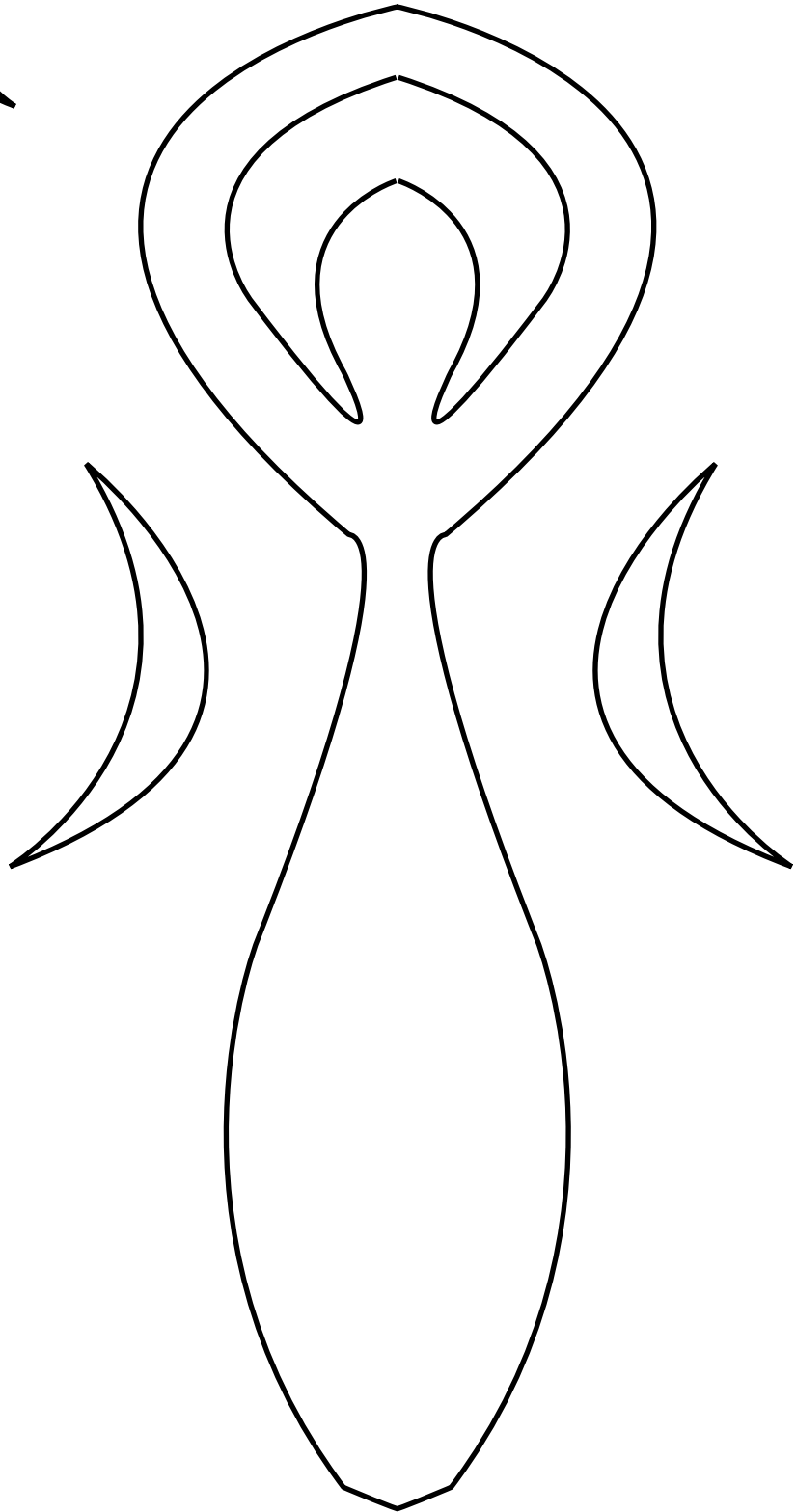
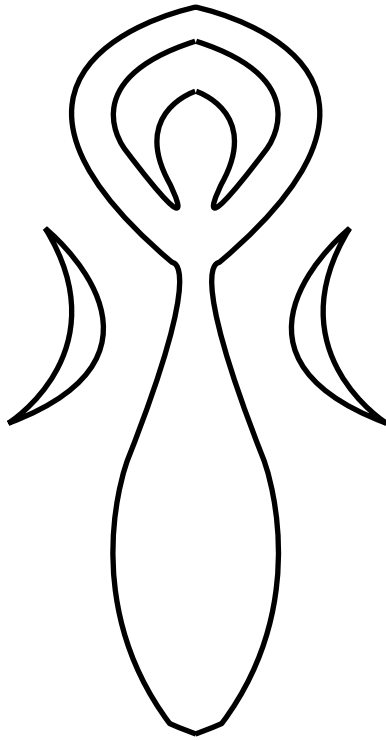


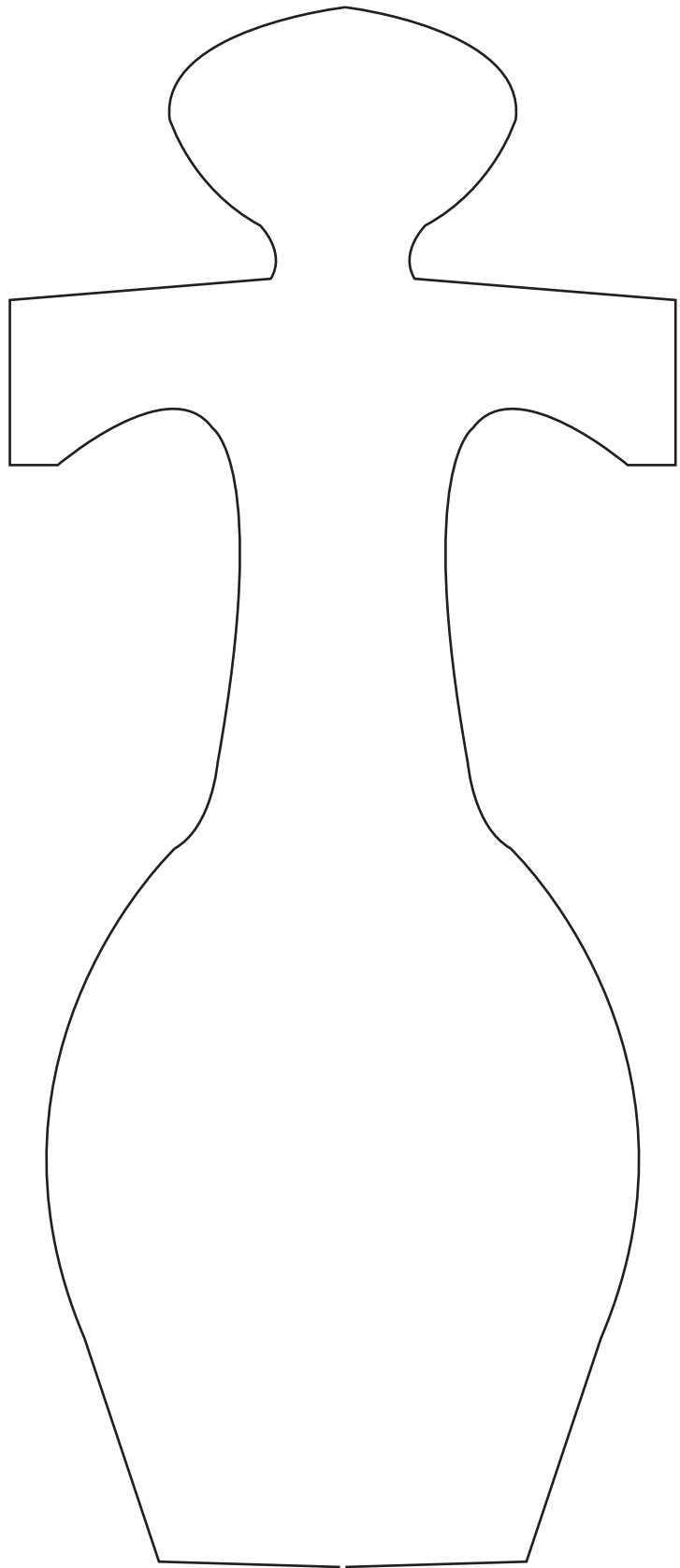
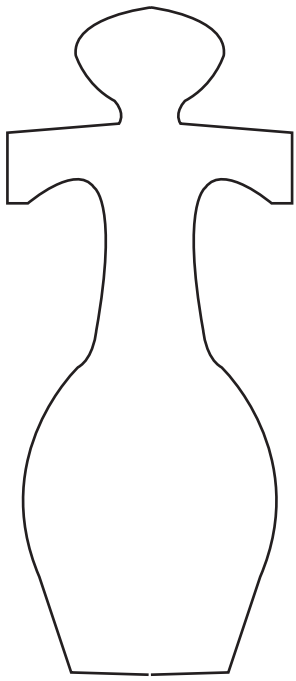


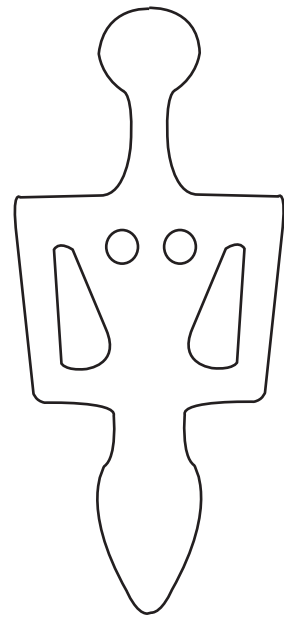
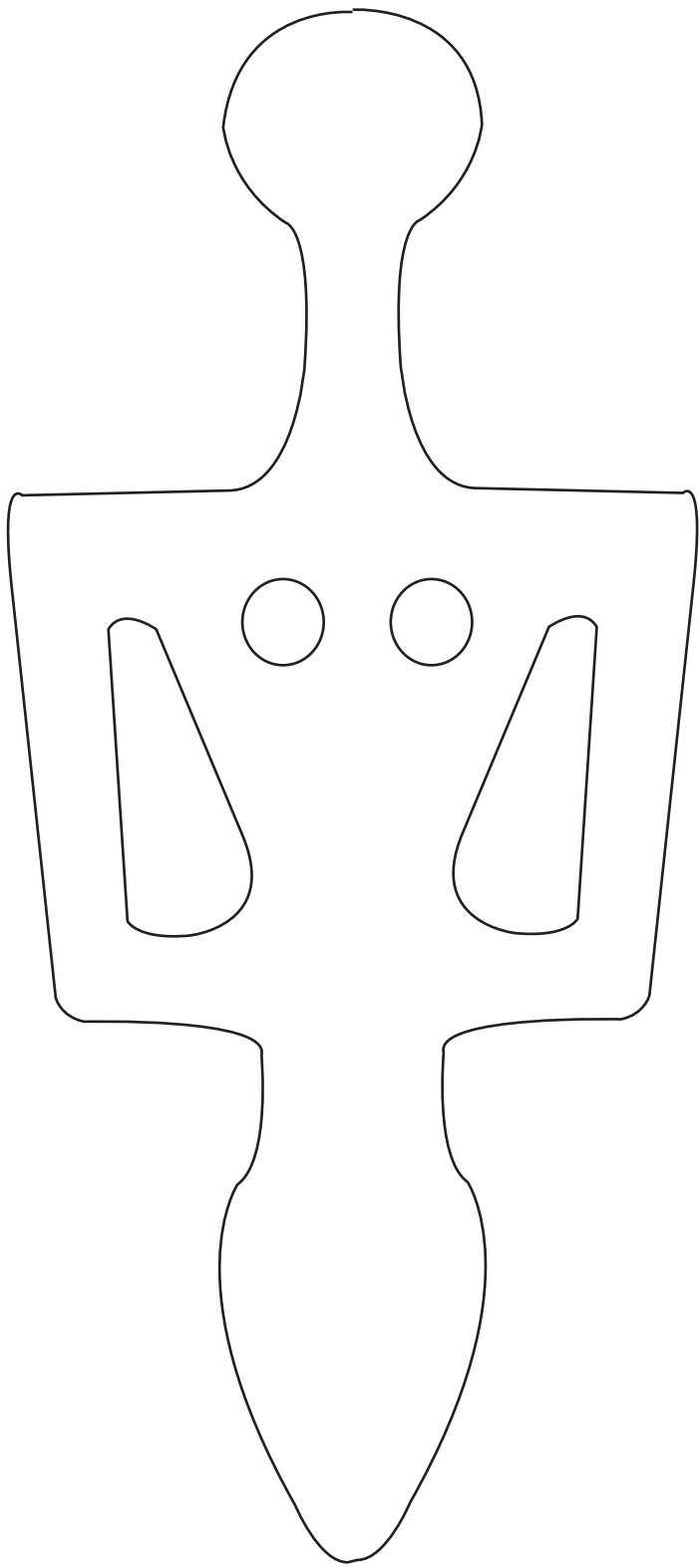


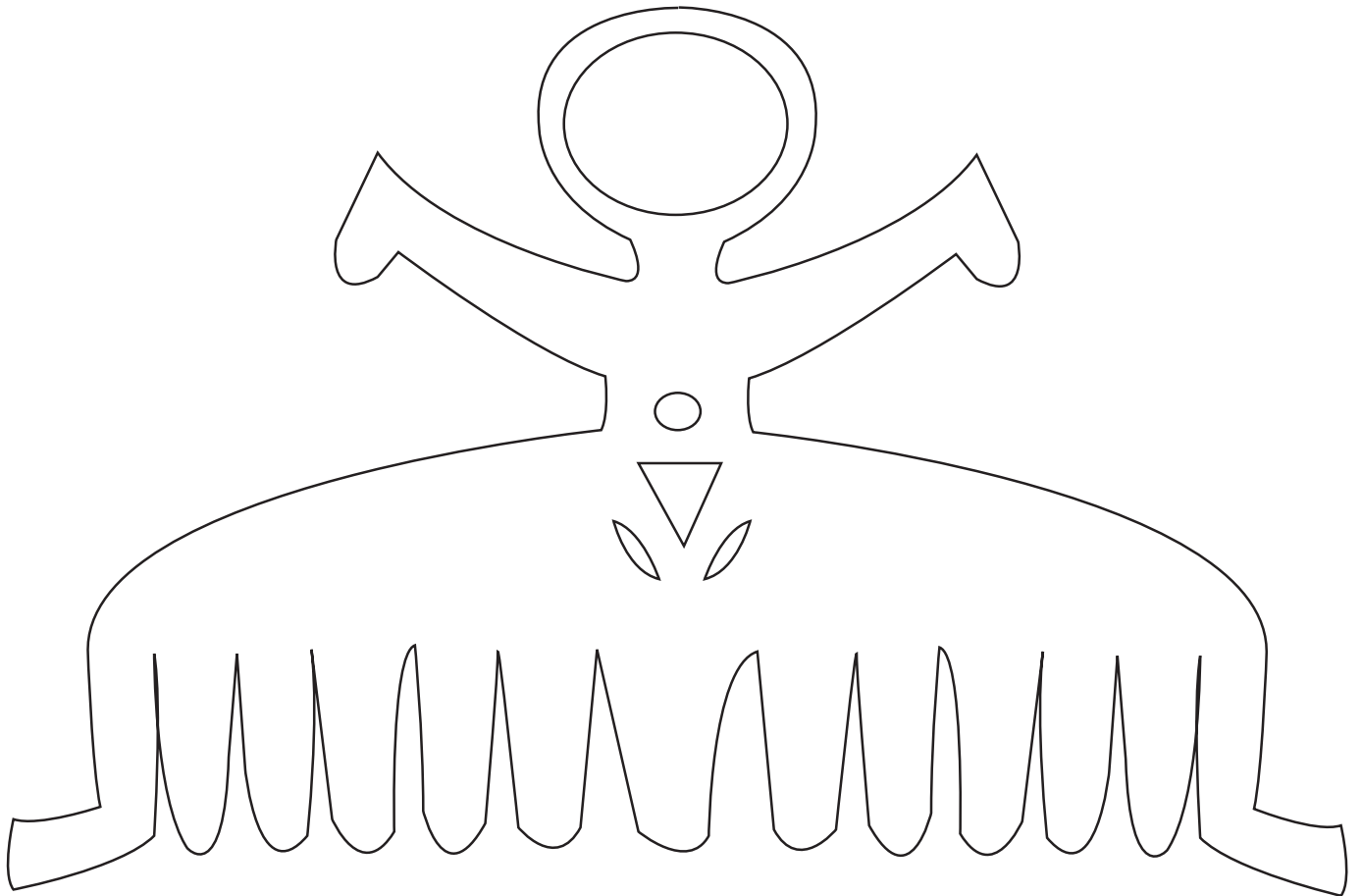
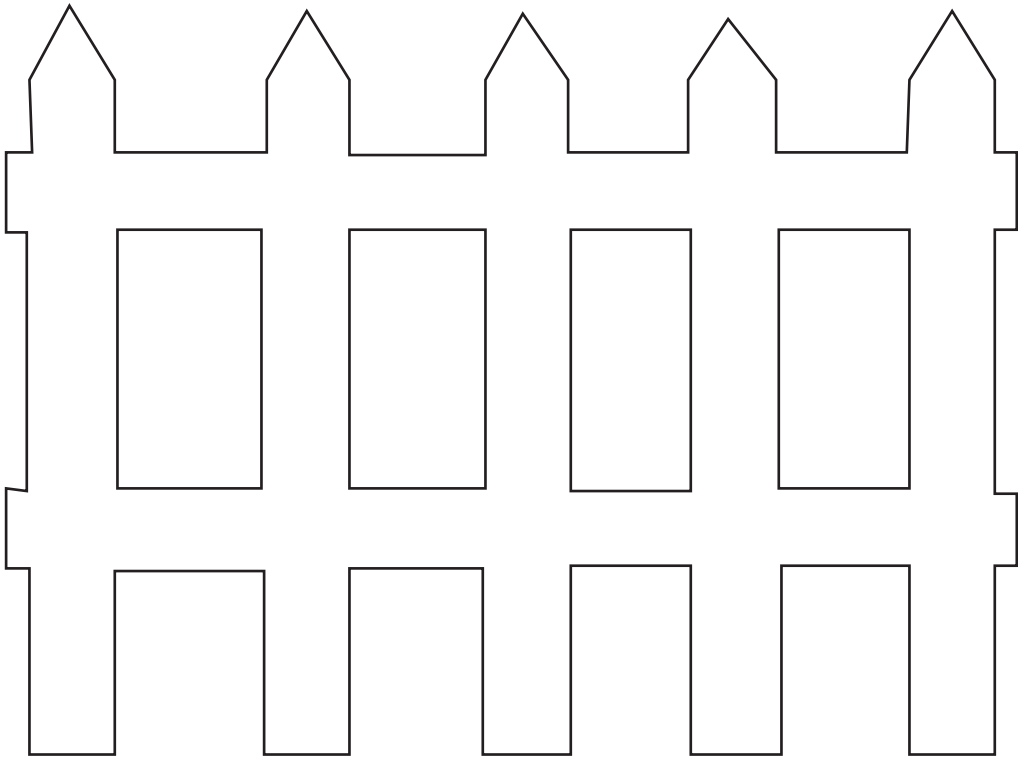

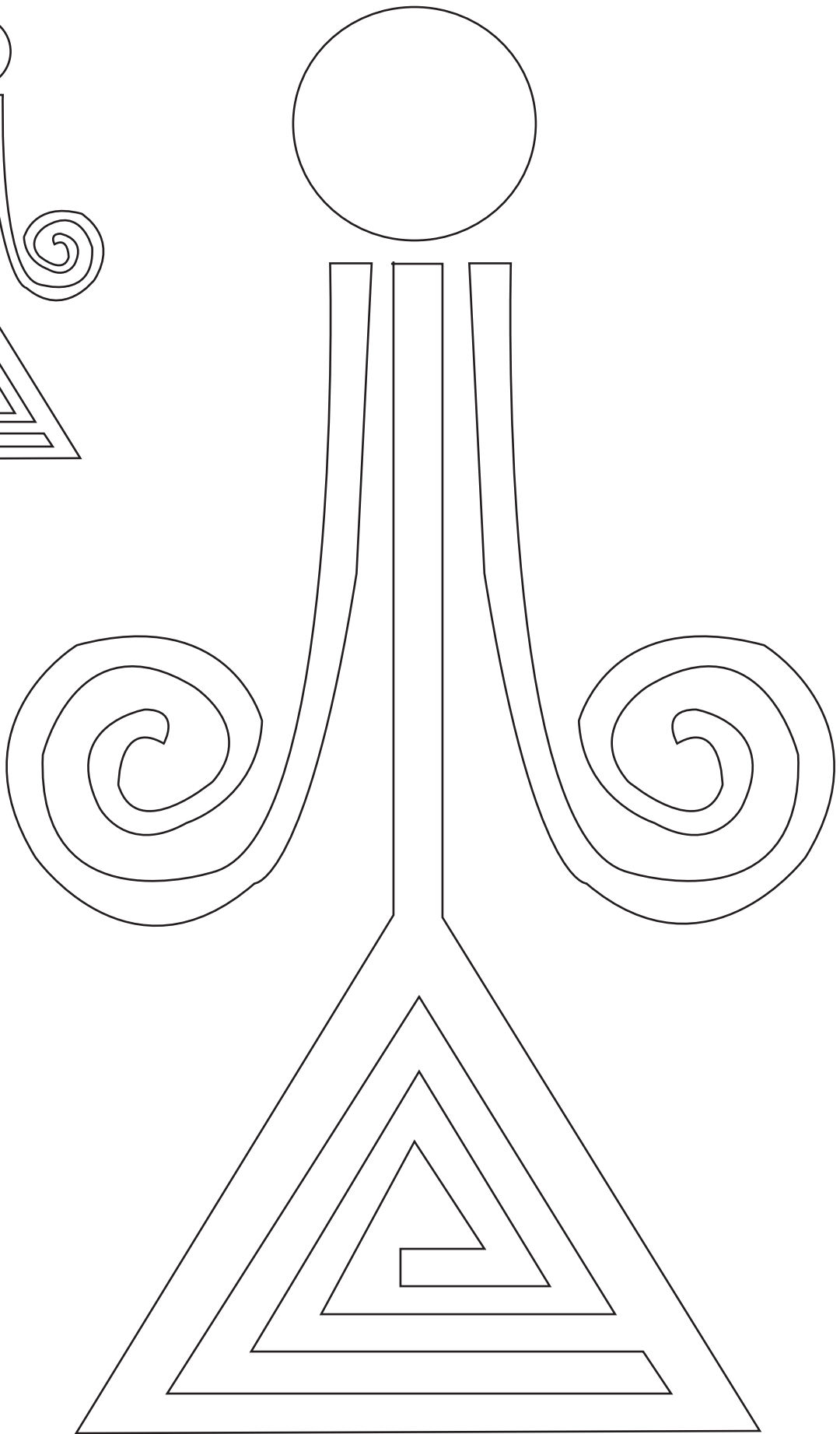
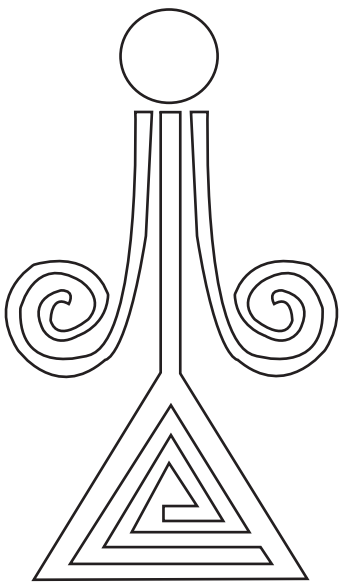


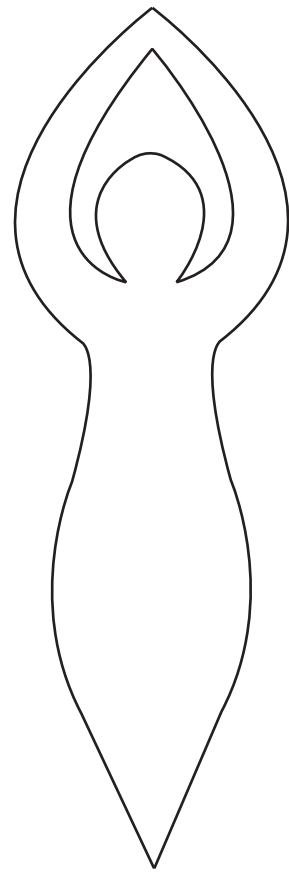
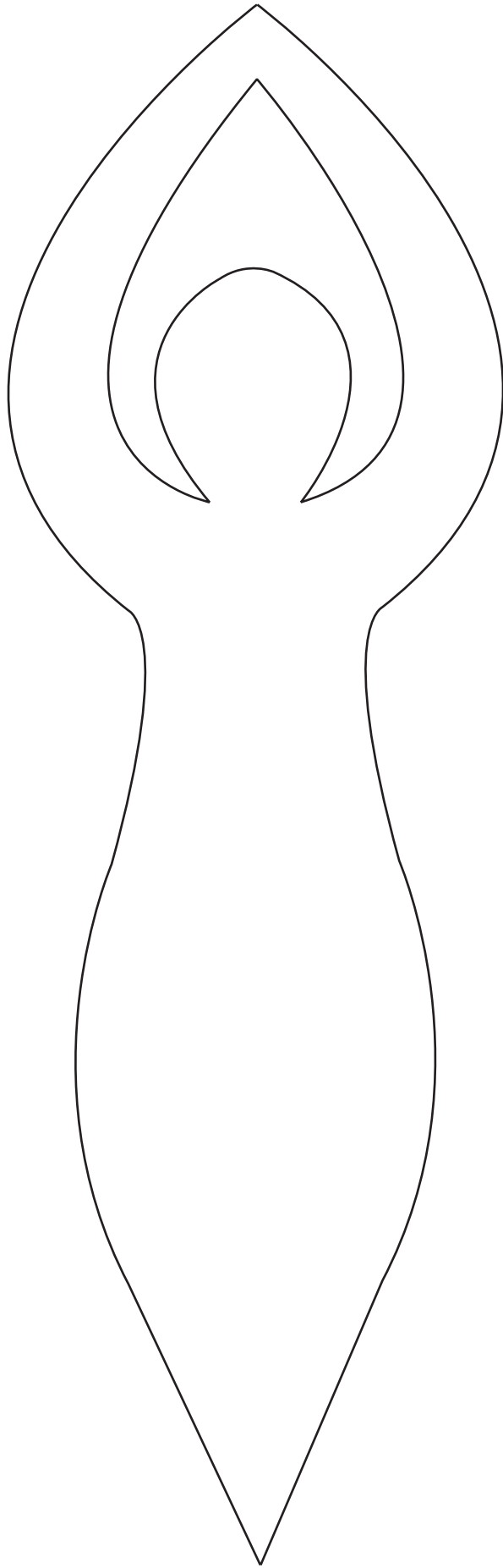


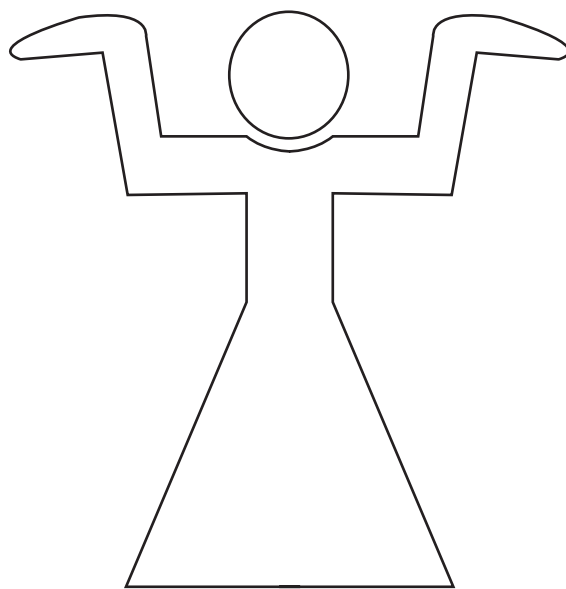
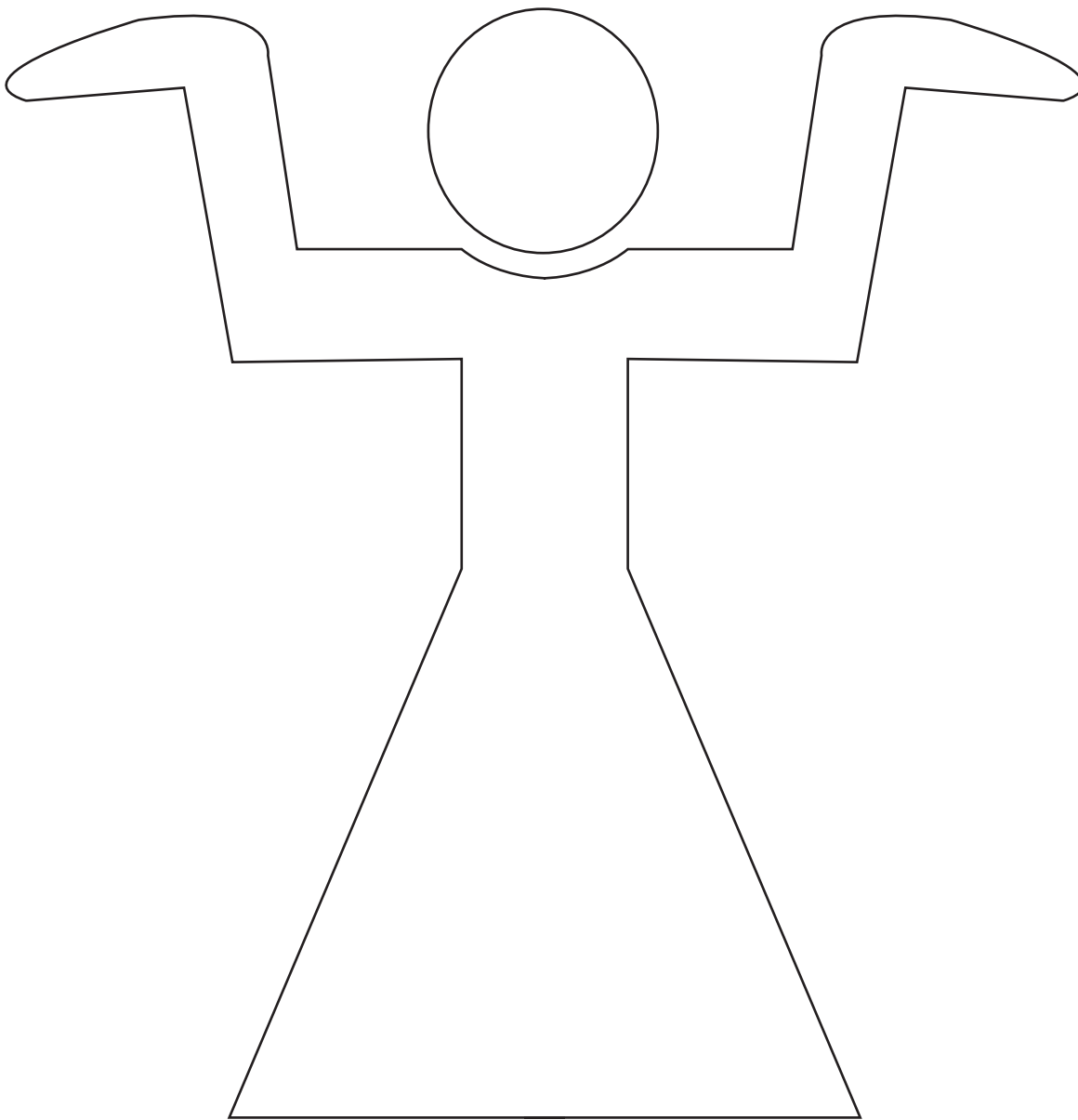


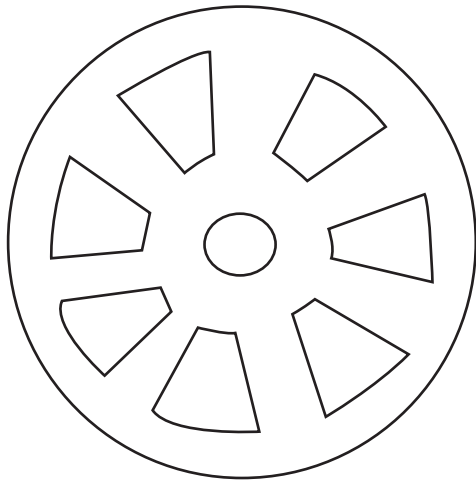
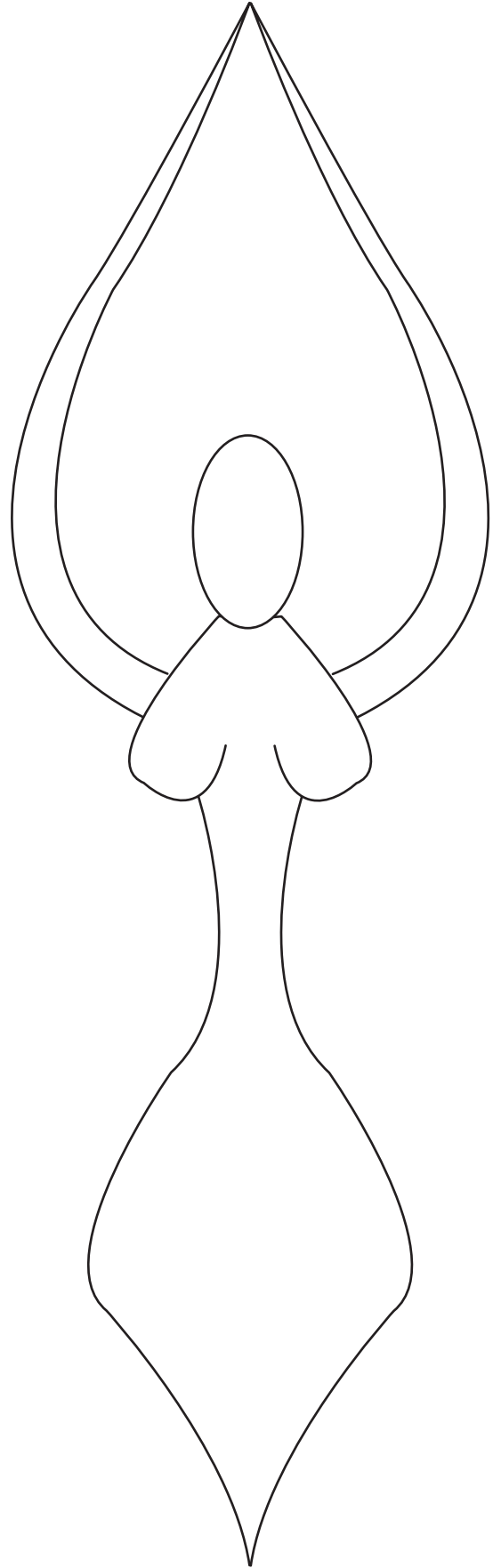
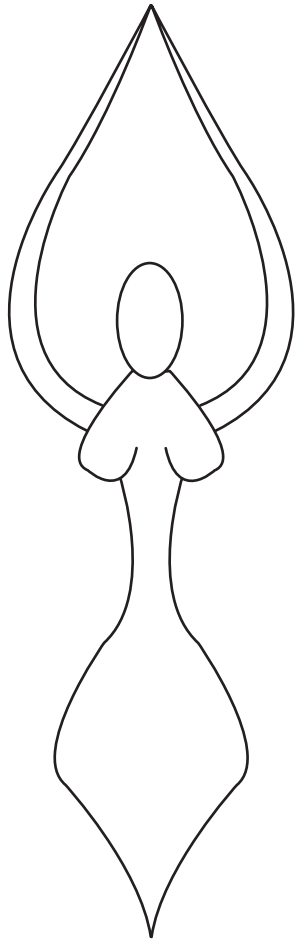


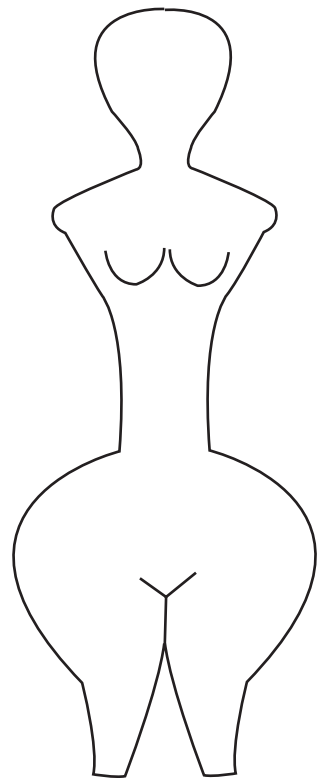
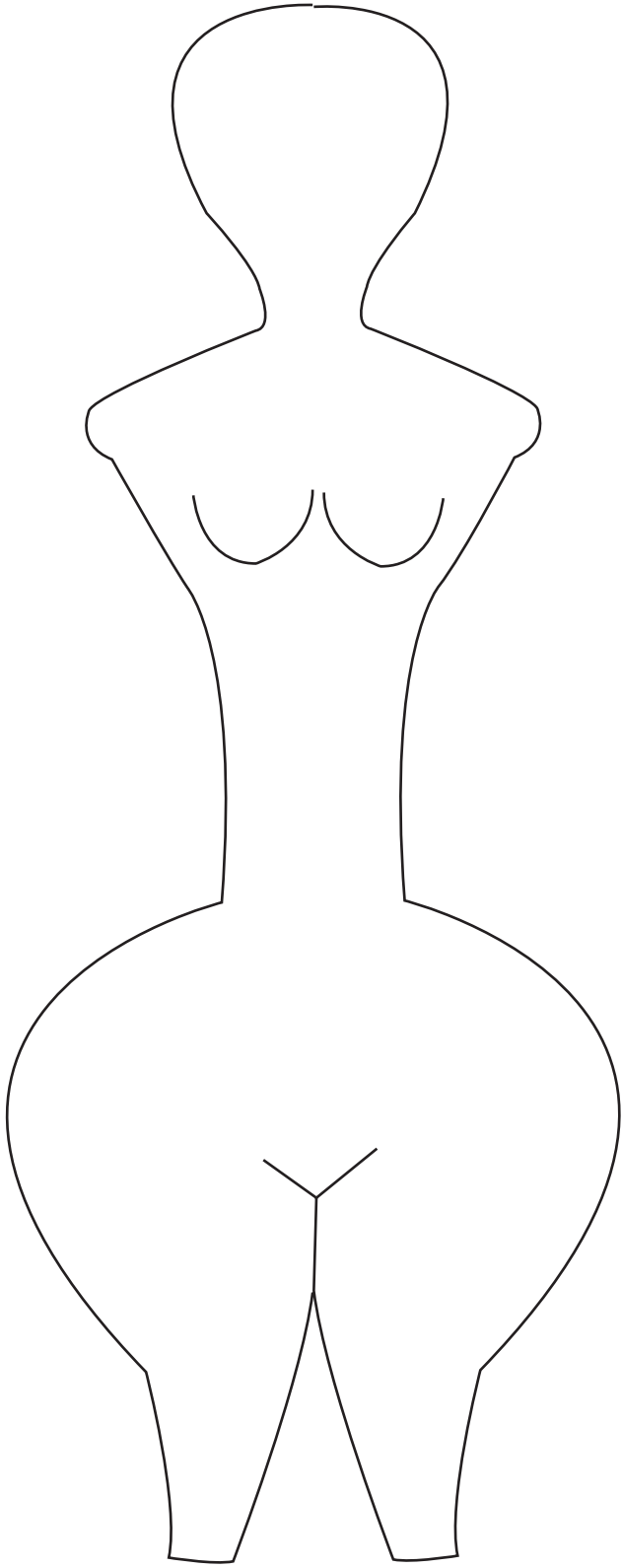


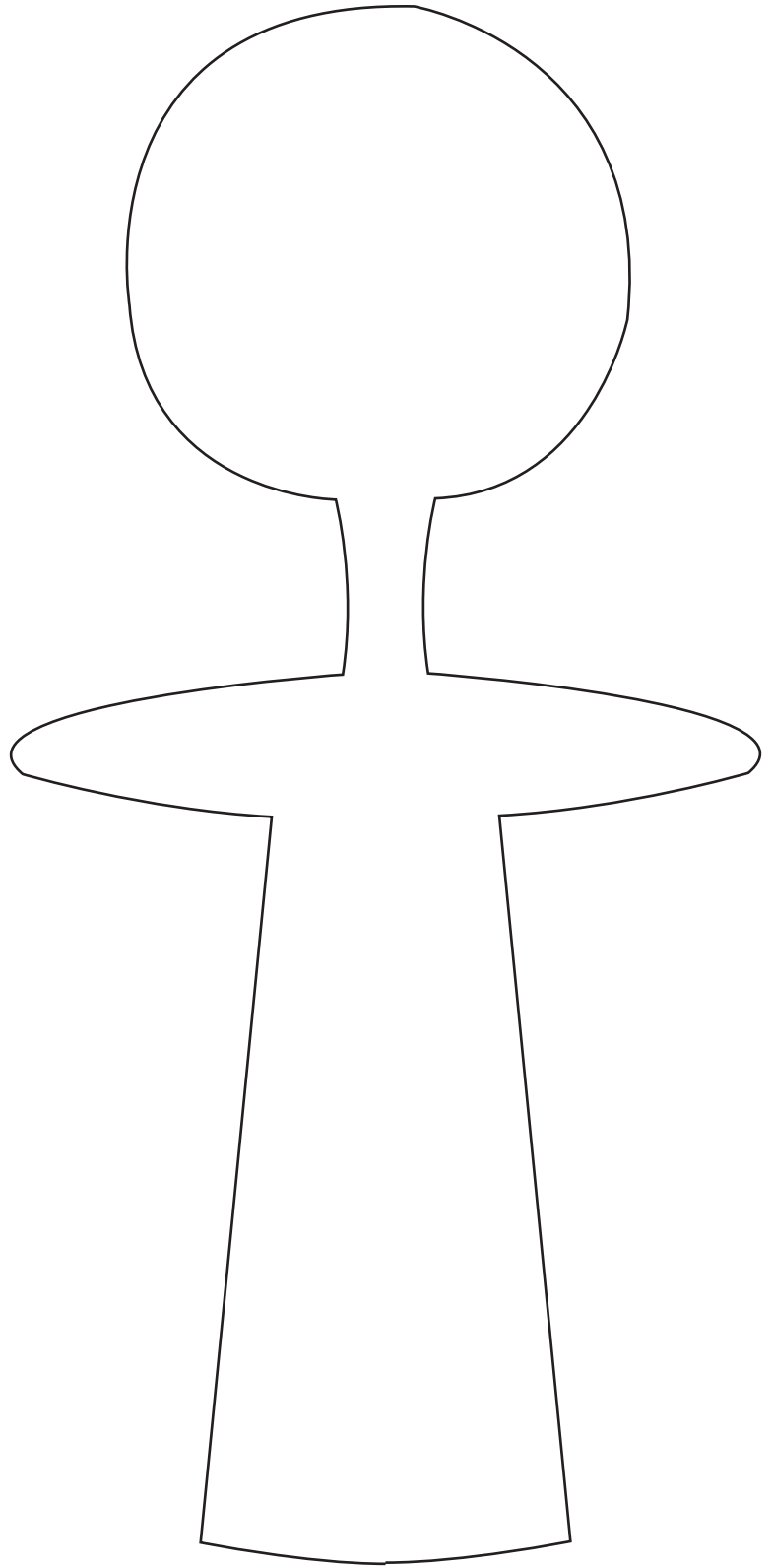
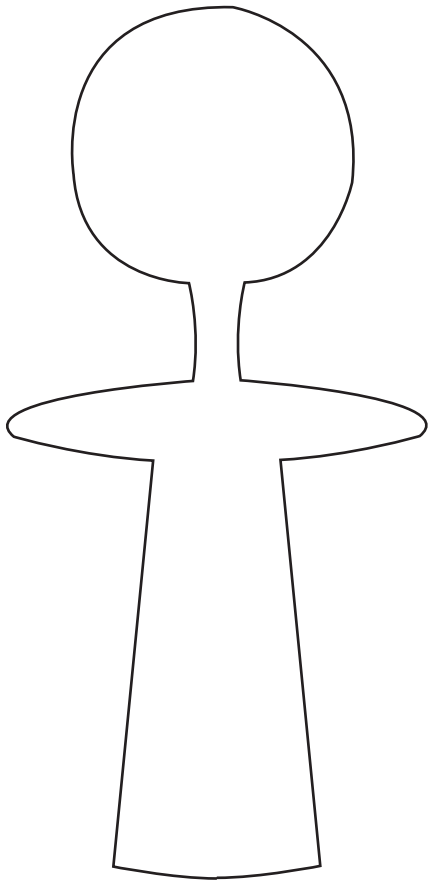




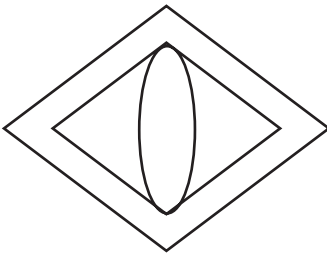
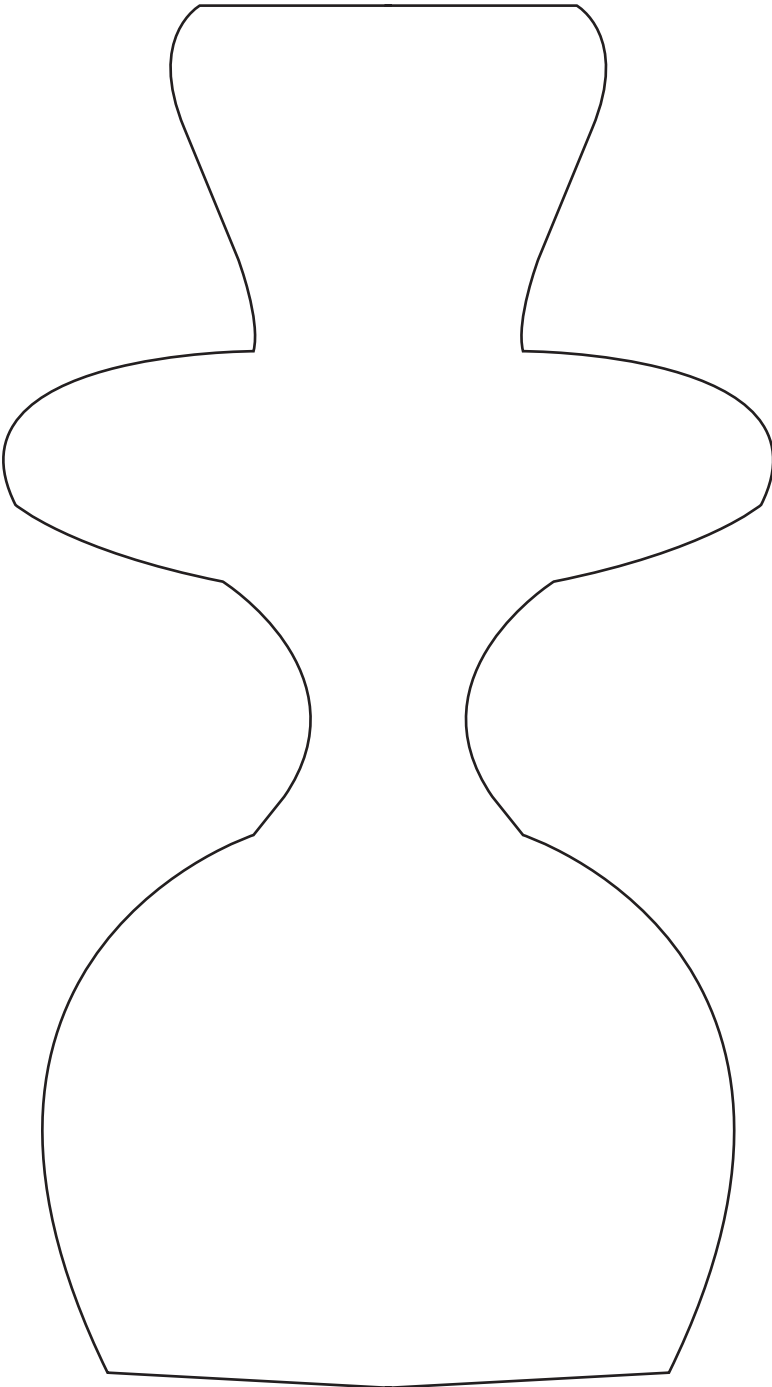
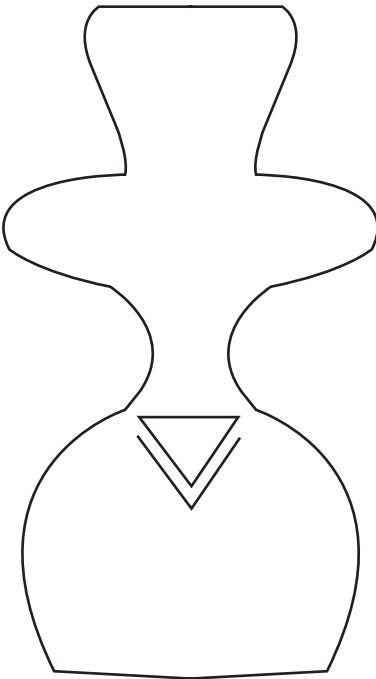


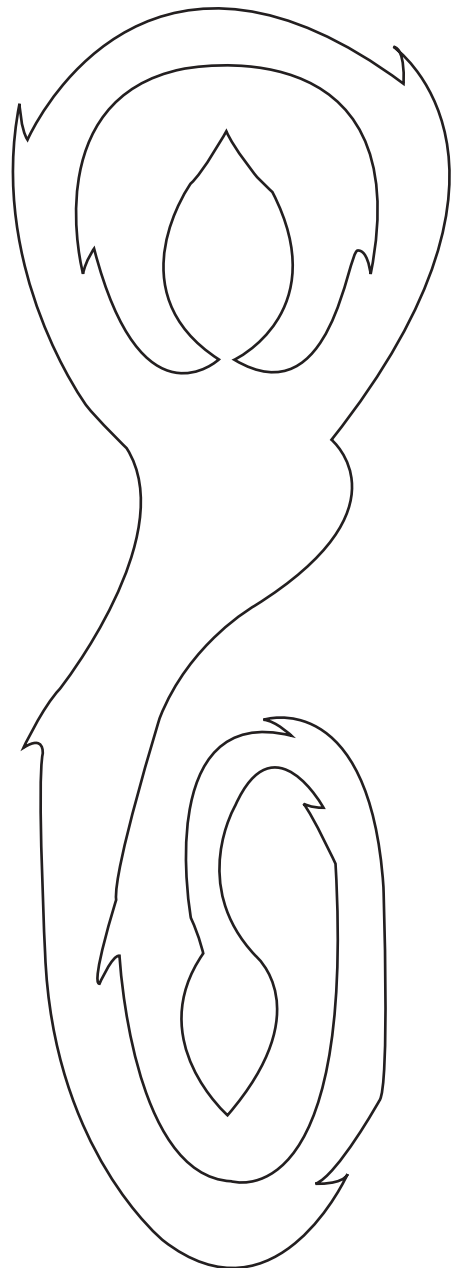
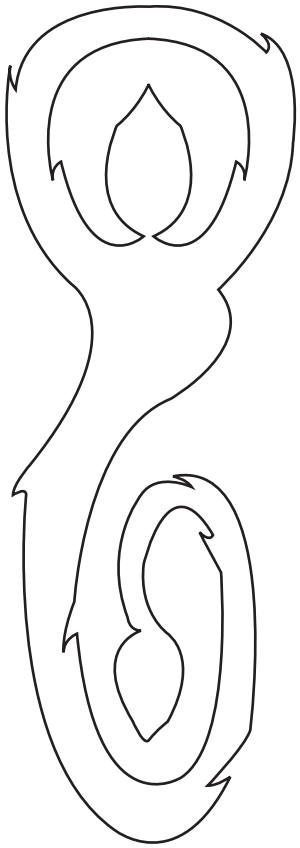


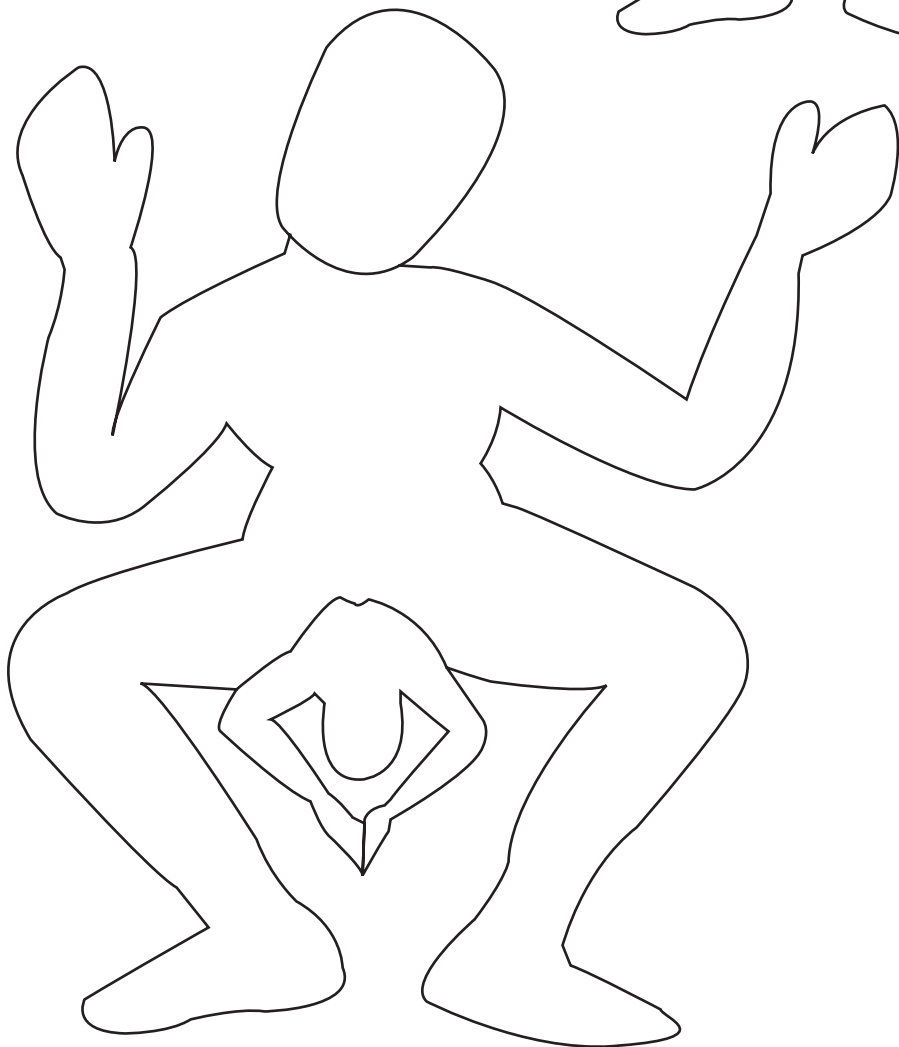
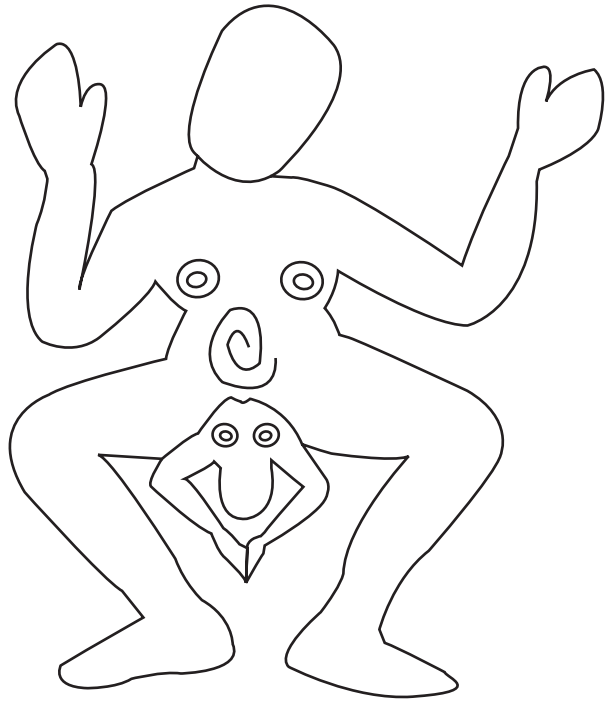




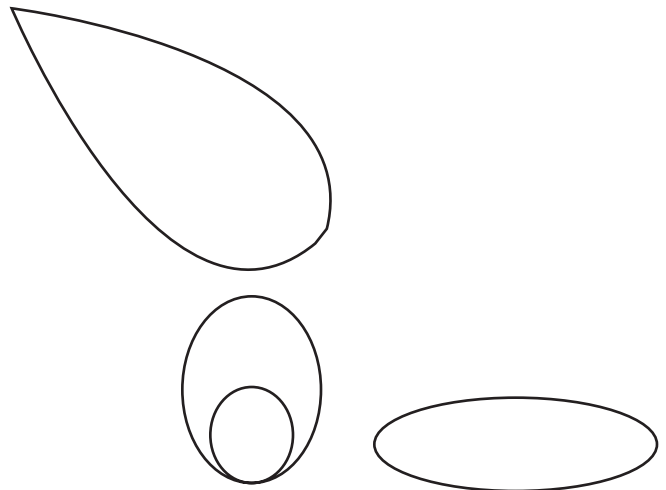
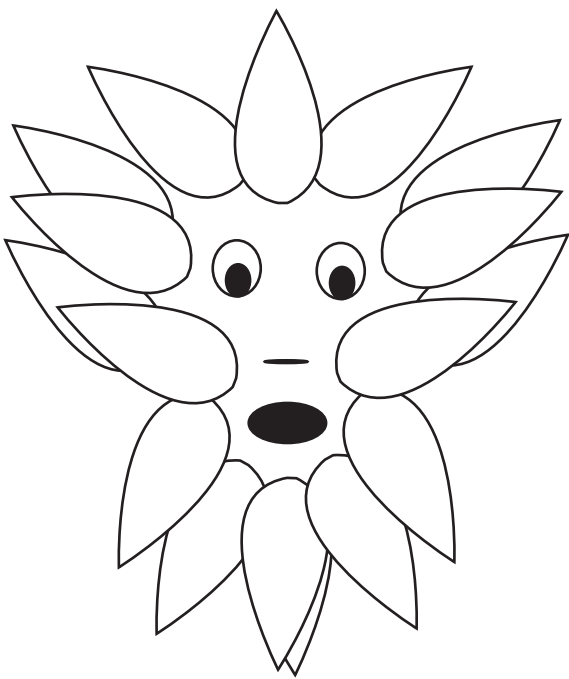
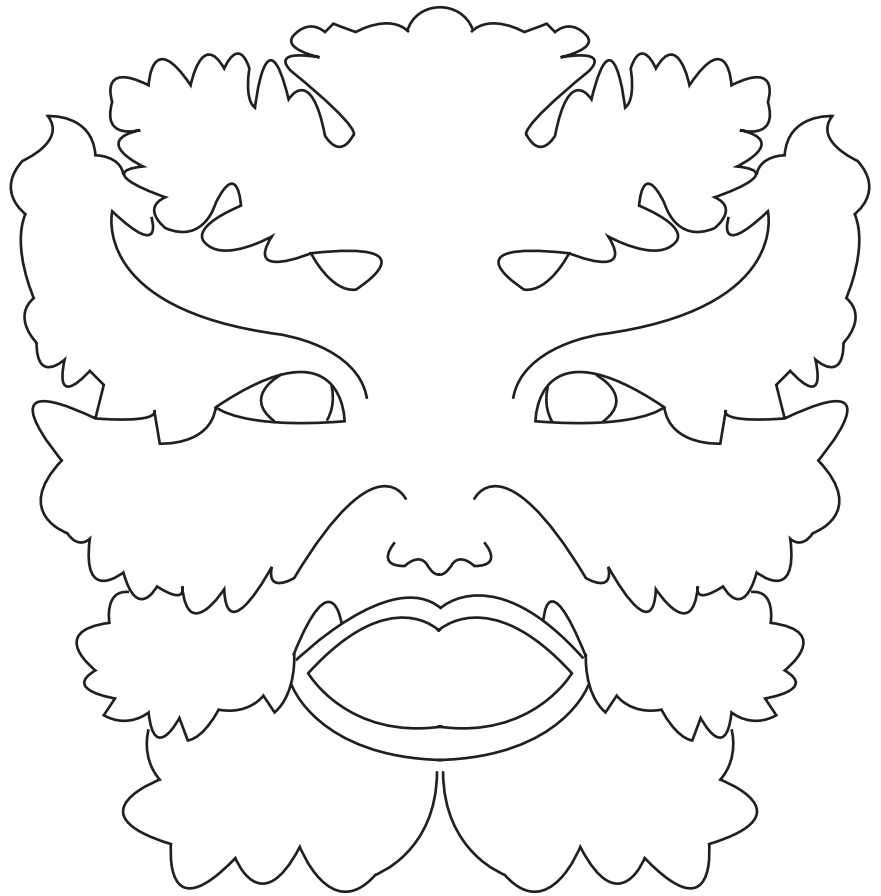
These patterns can easily be rendered 3D by cutting them out of wood or by molding them from clay.





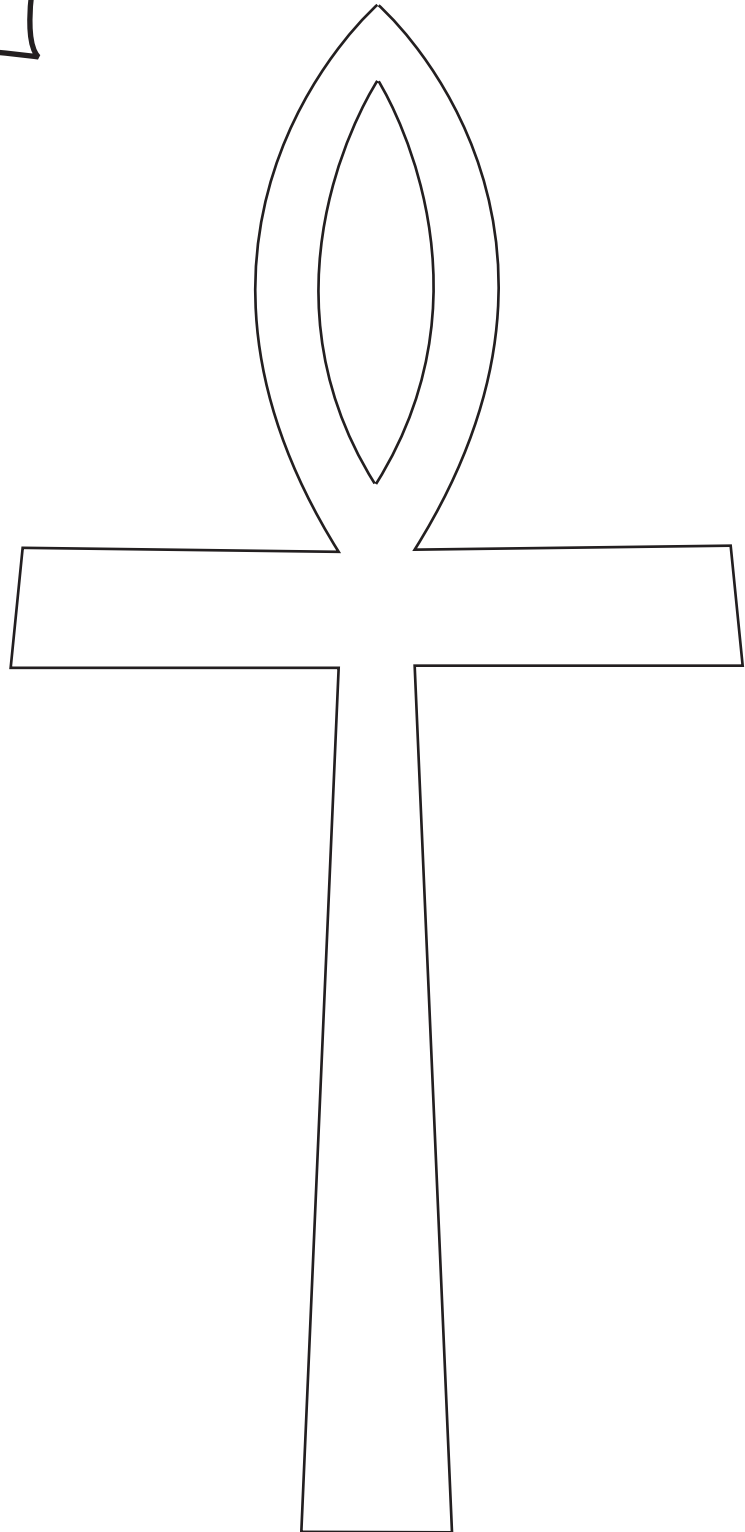
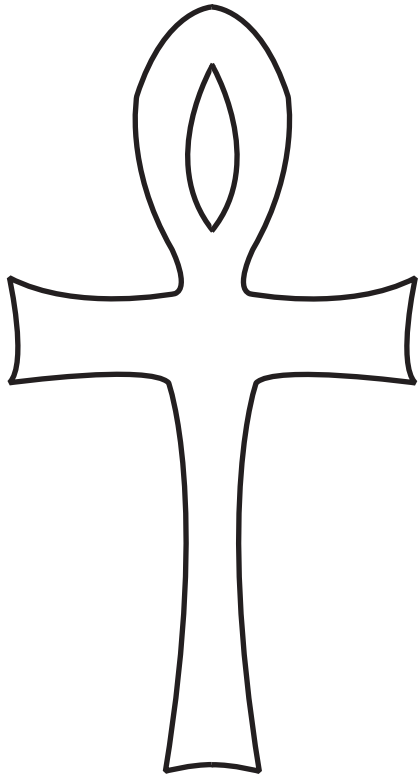


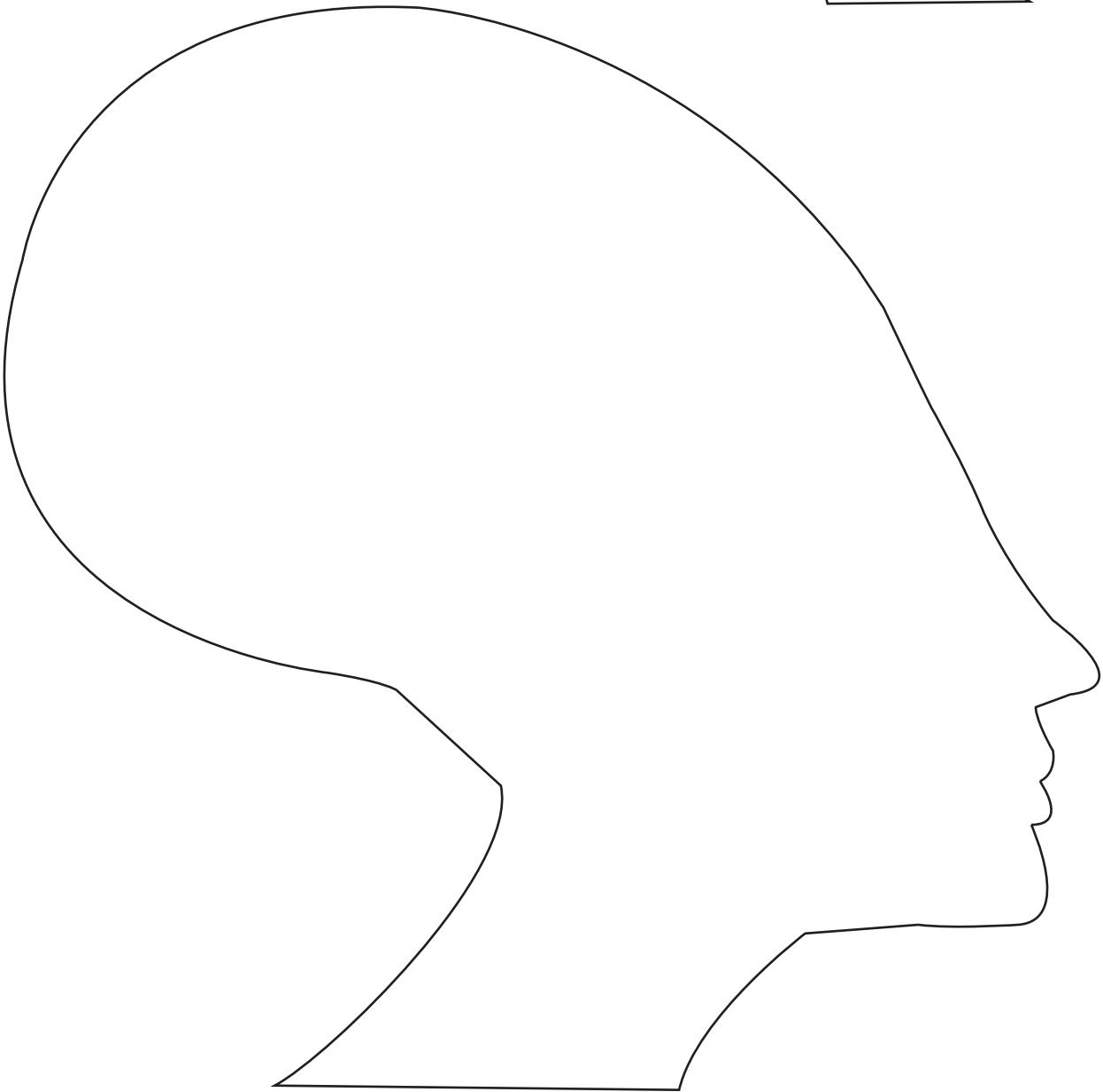


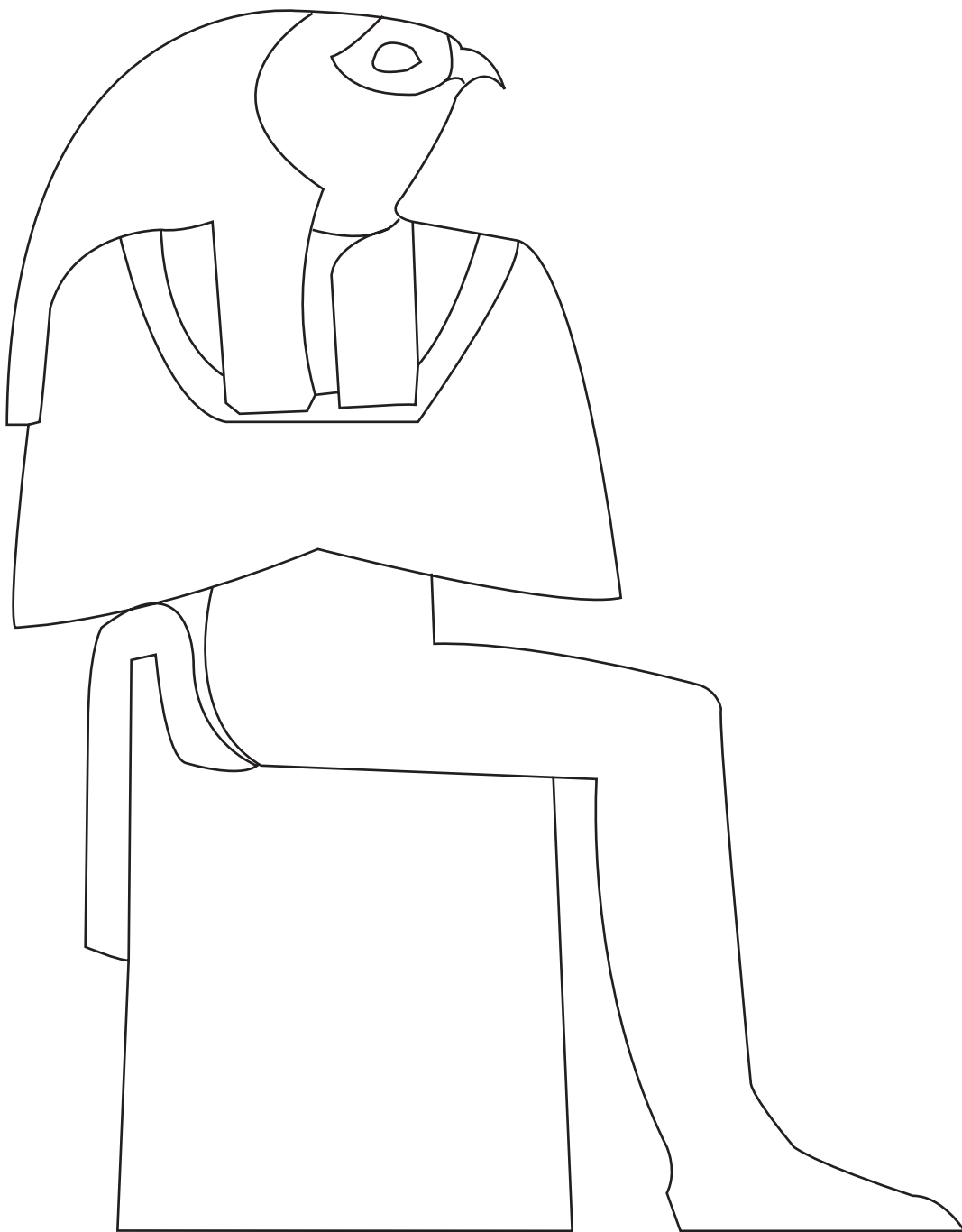
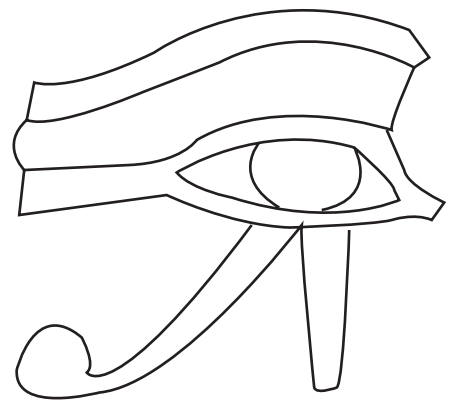


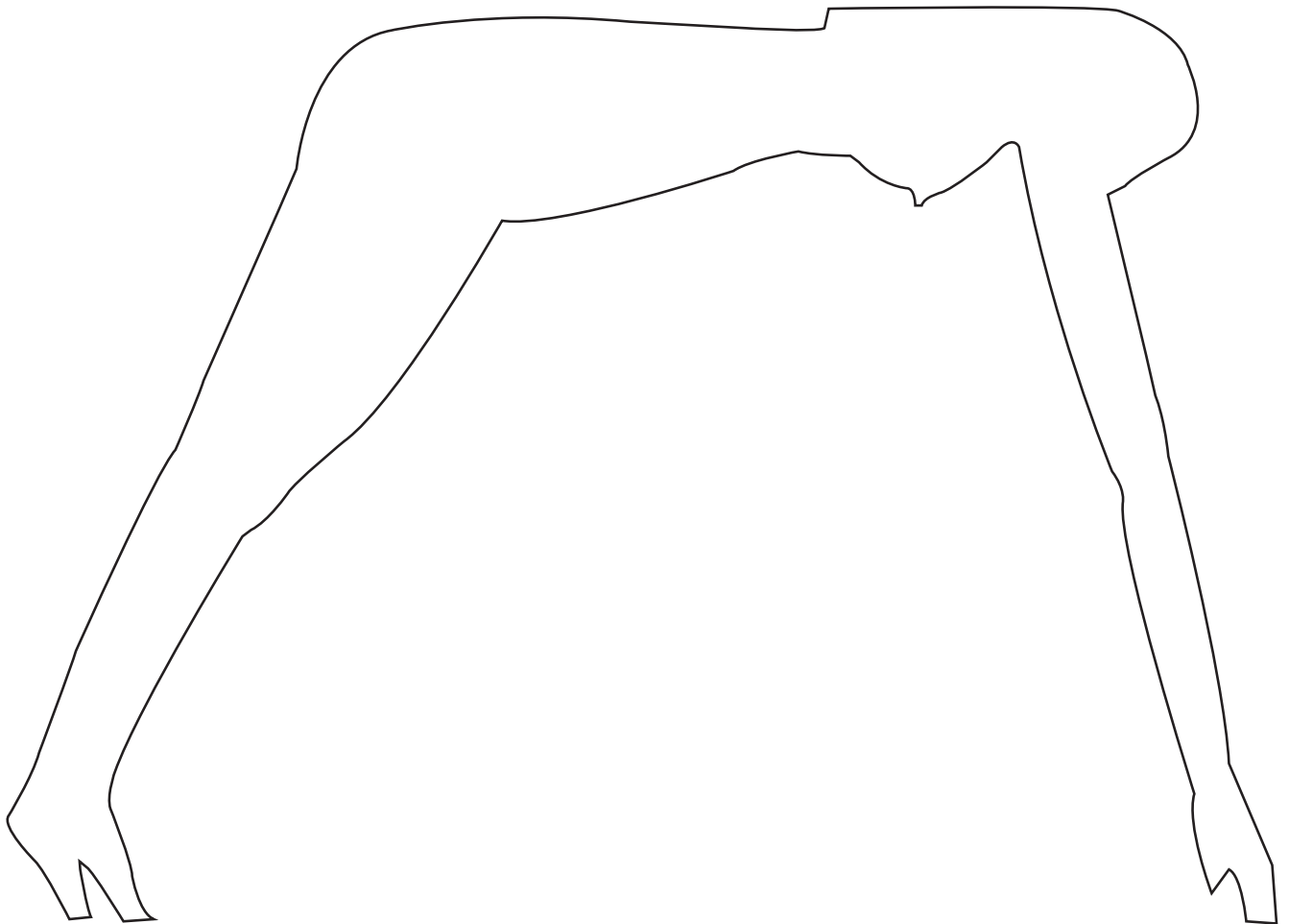
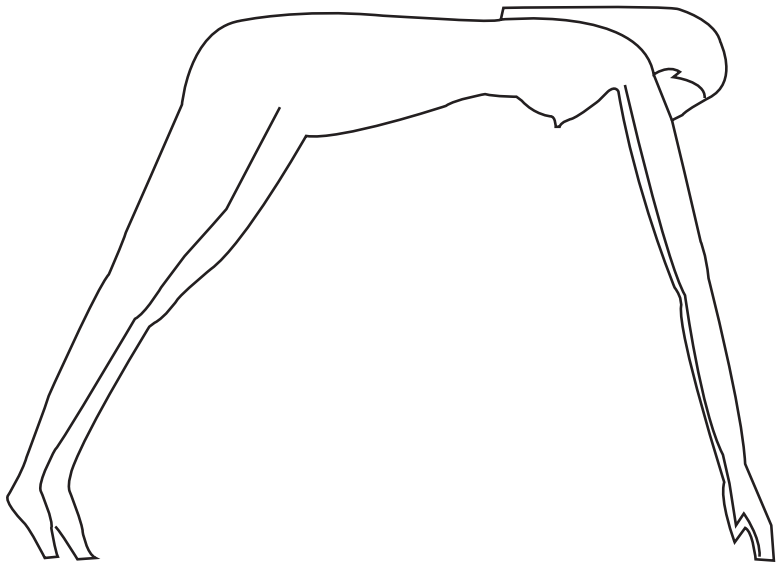


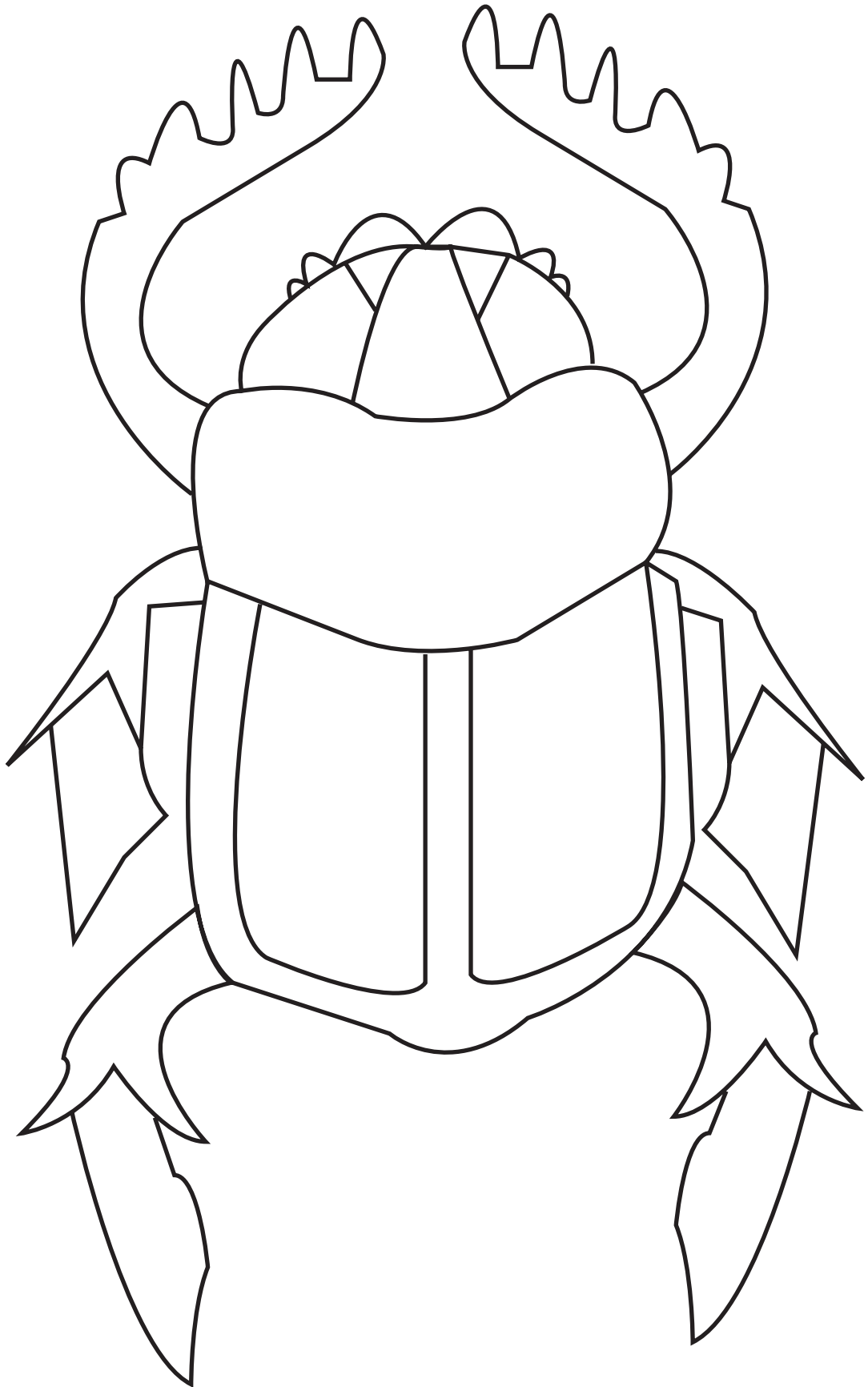


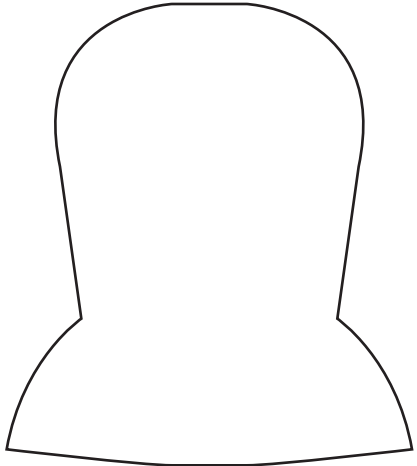
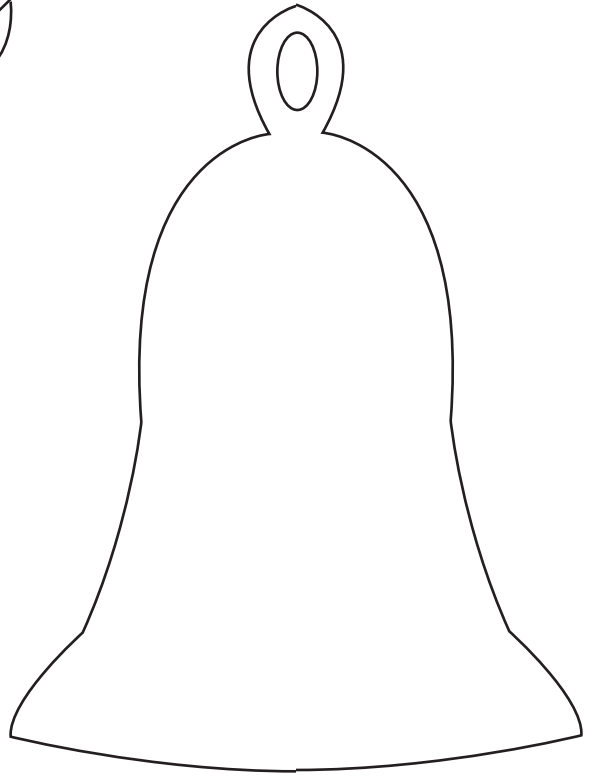
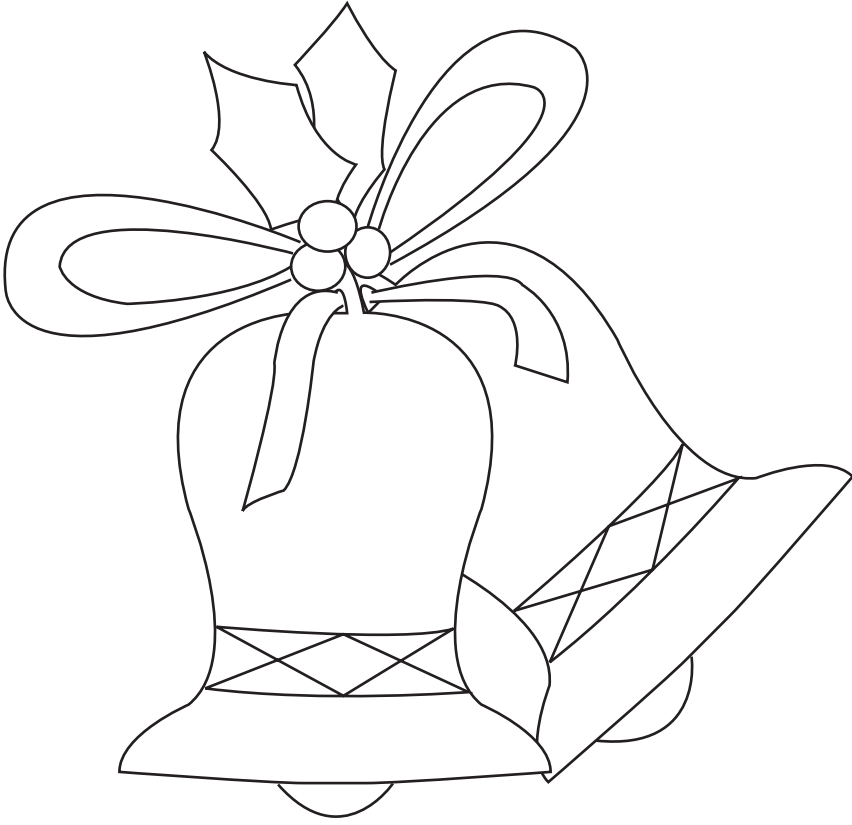


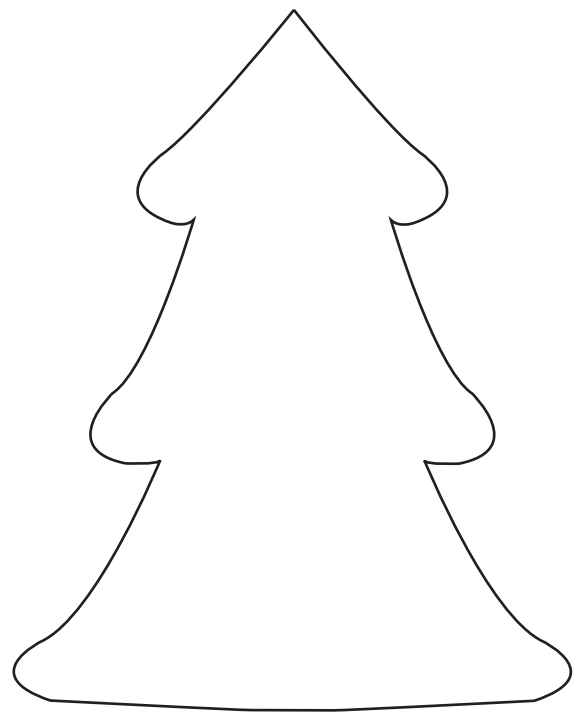
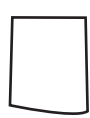
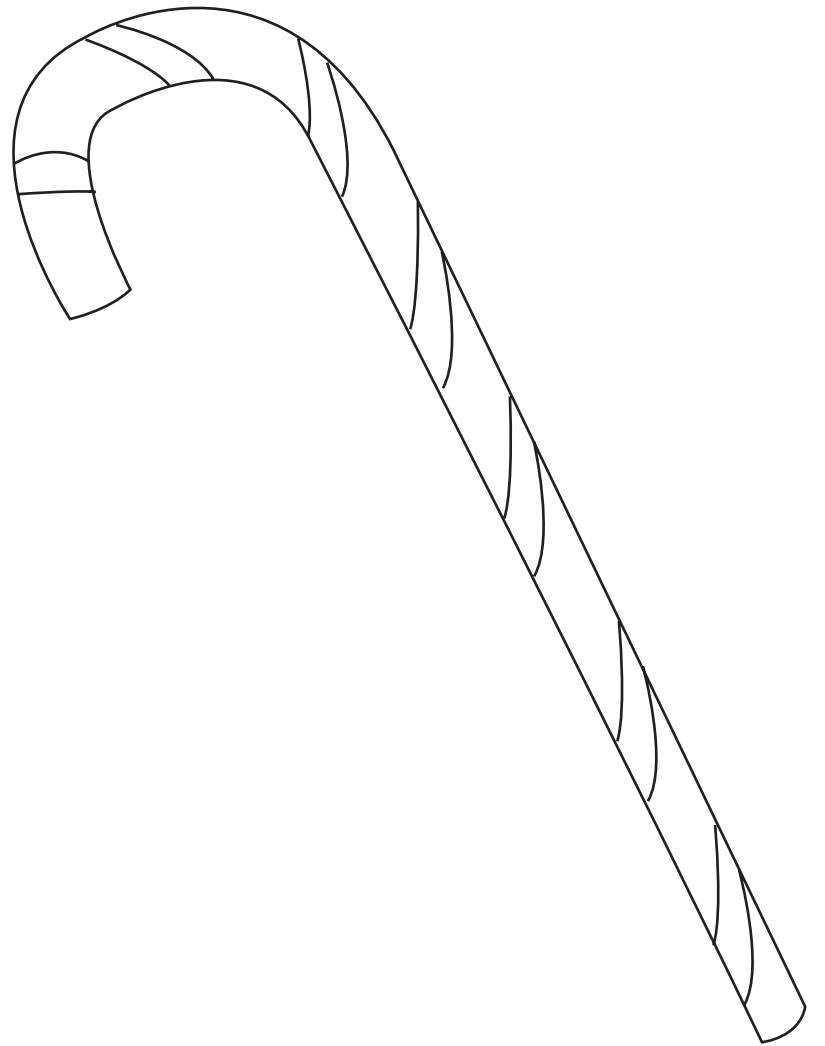
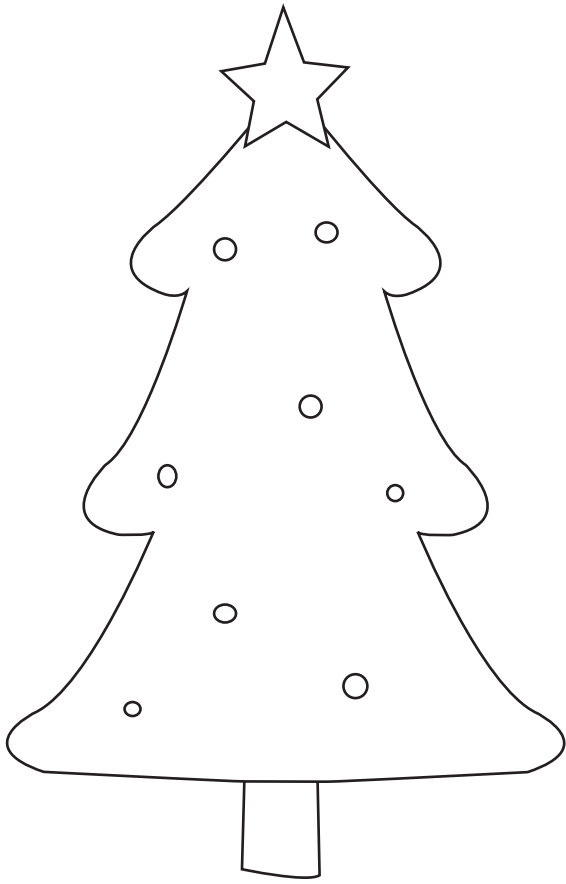


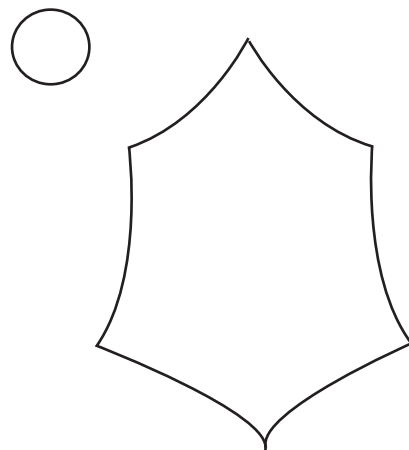
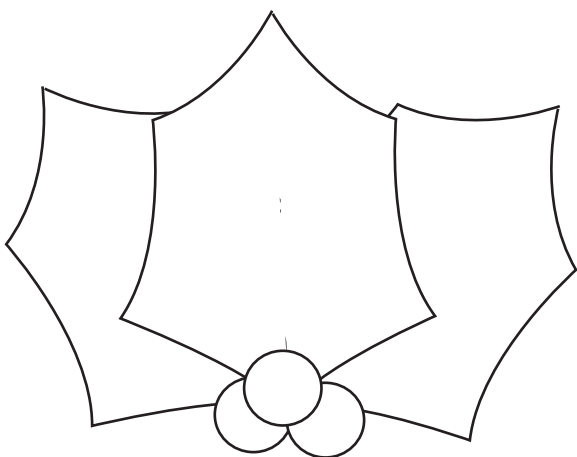
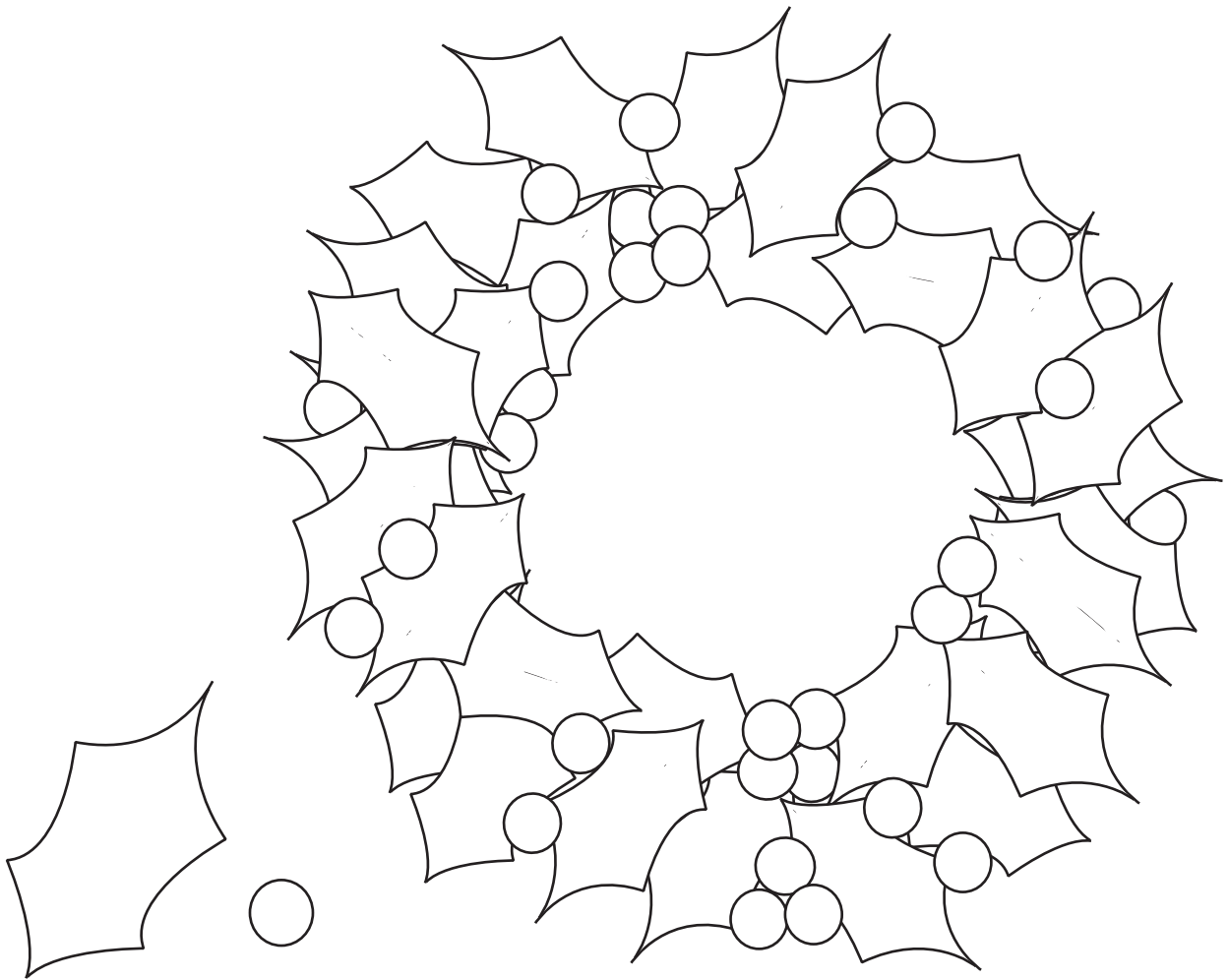


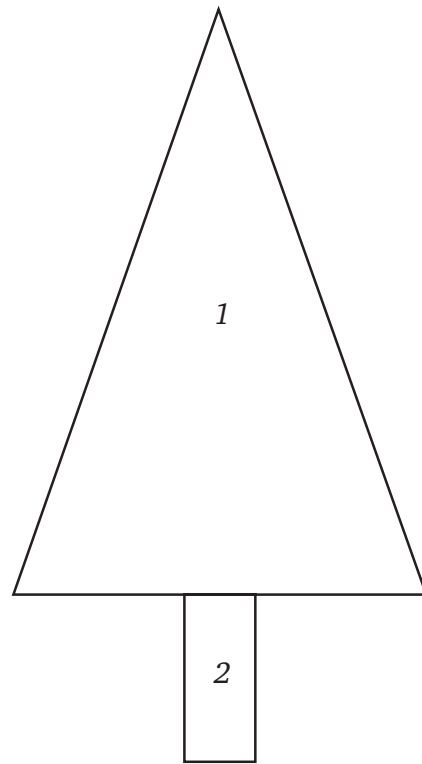
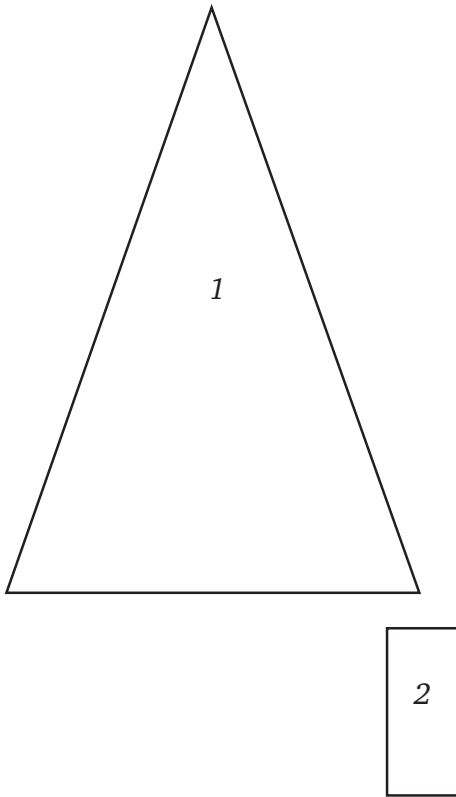
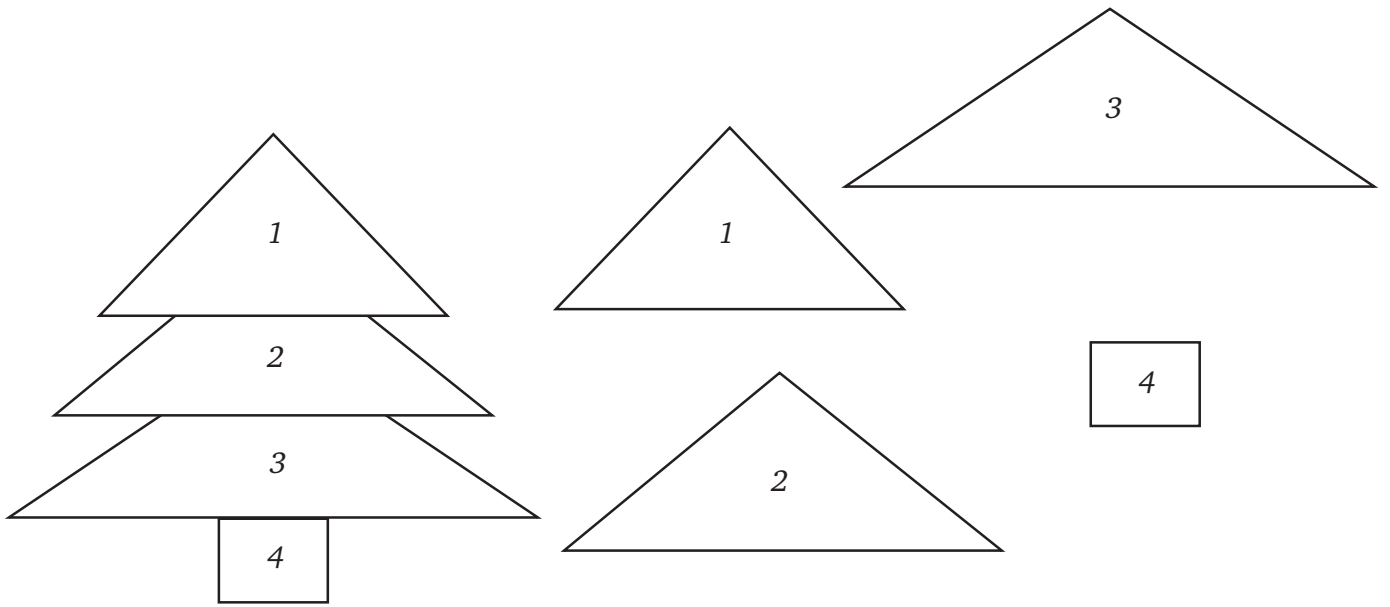


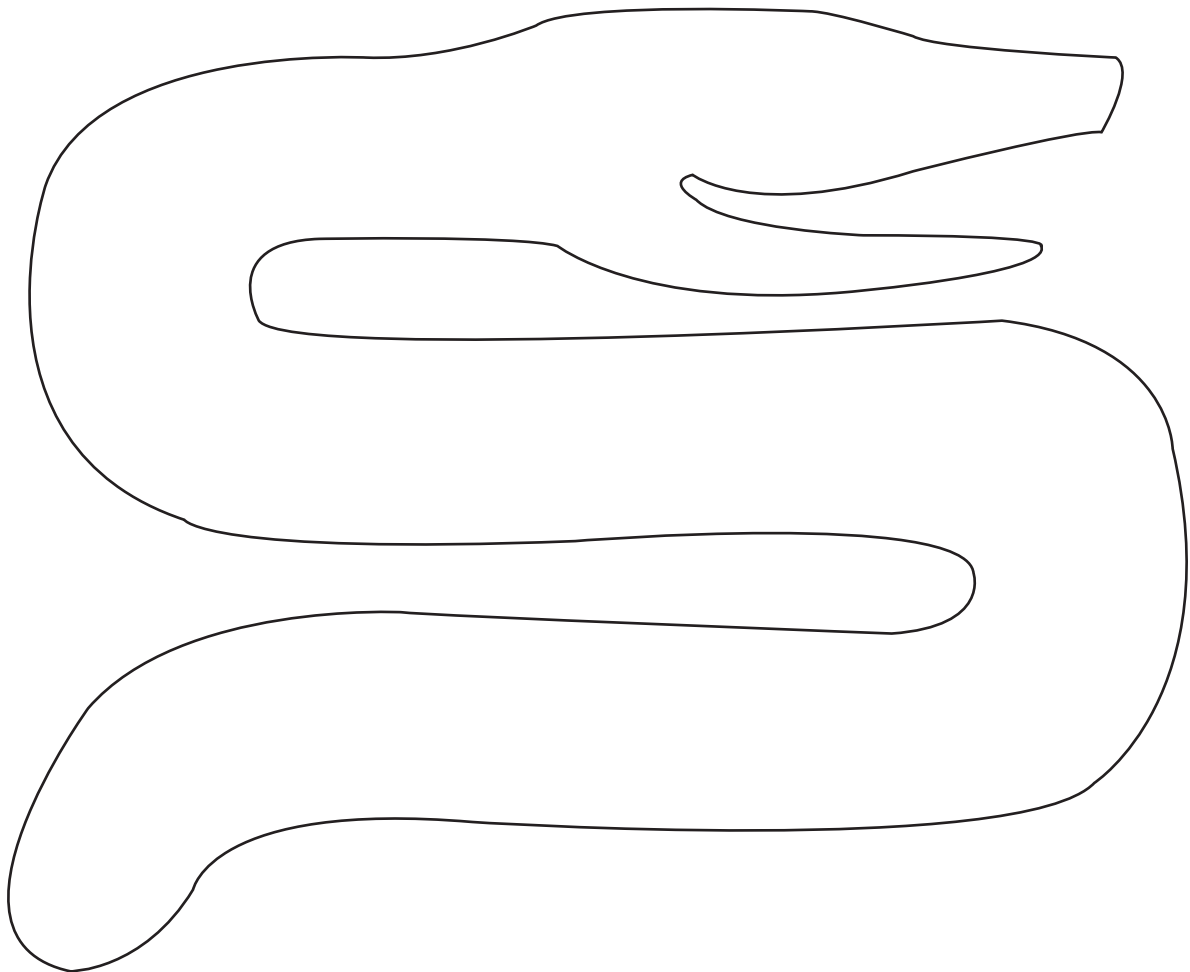
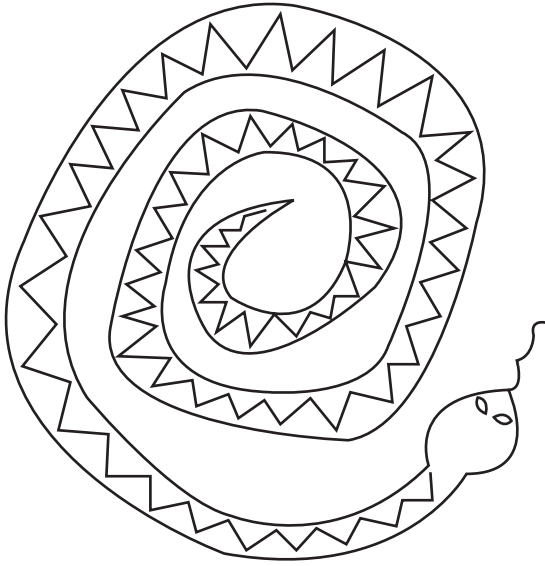


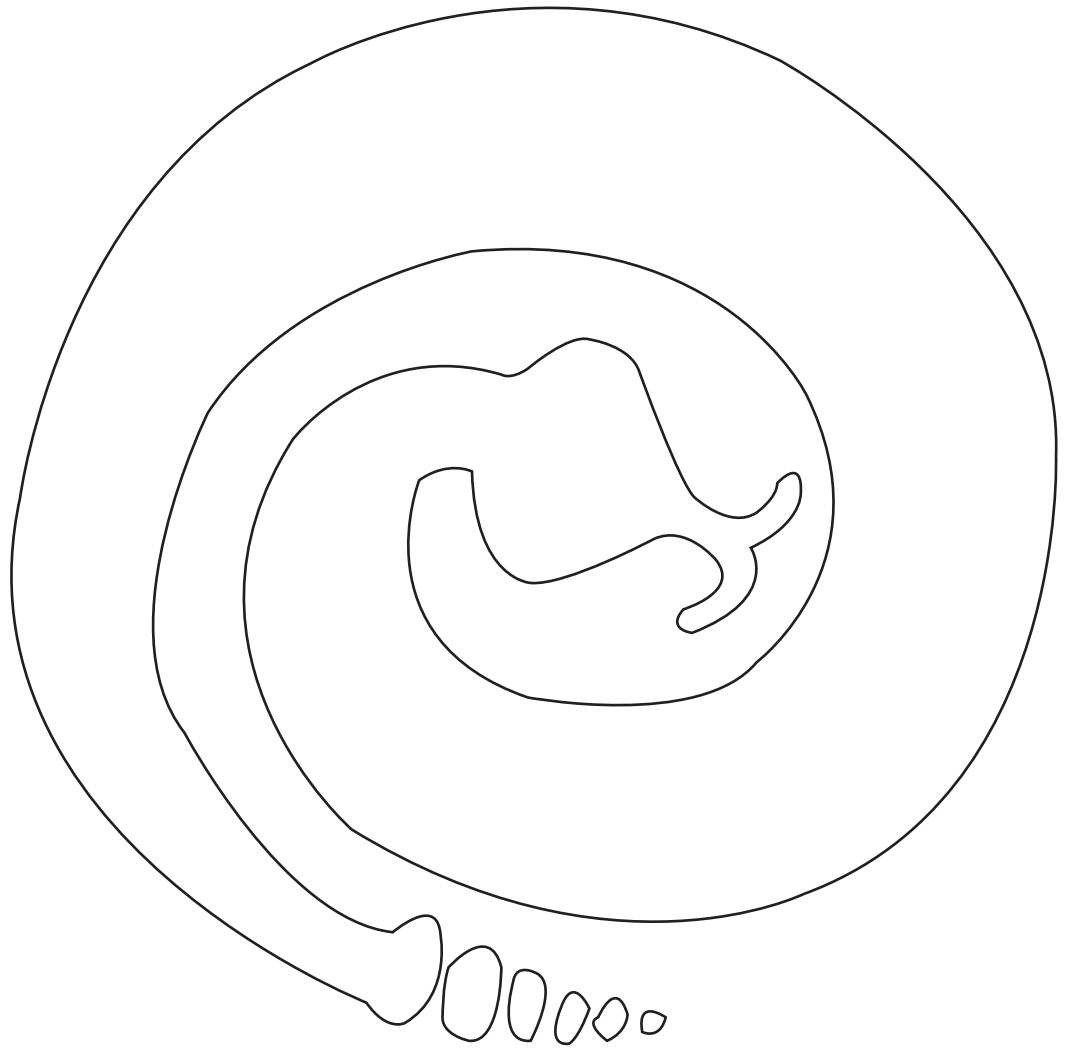


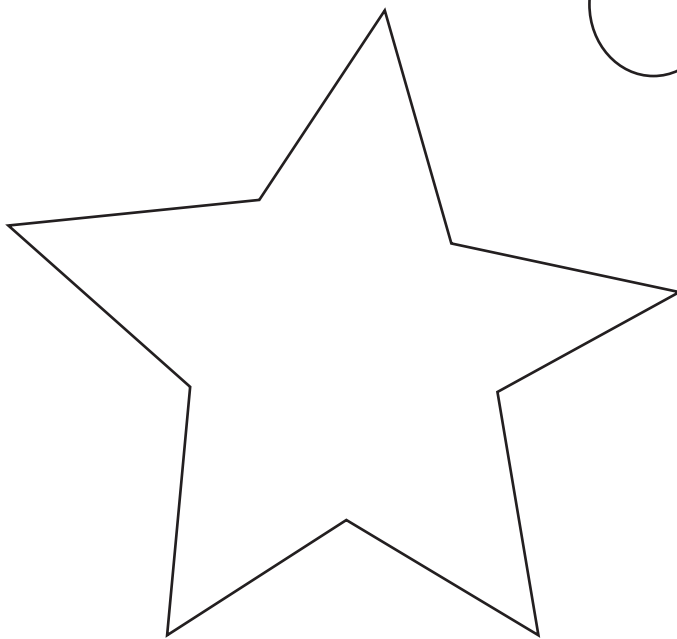
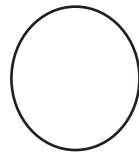
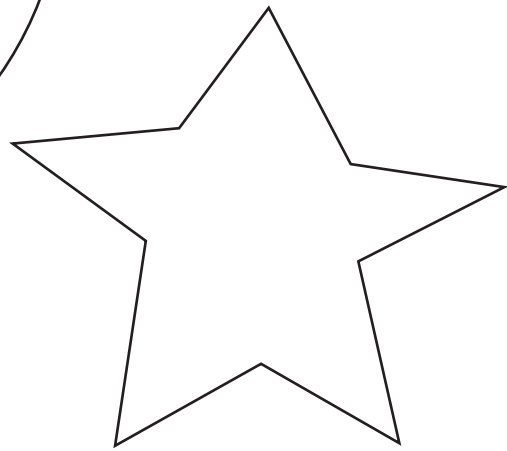
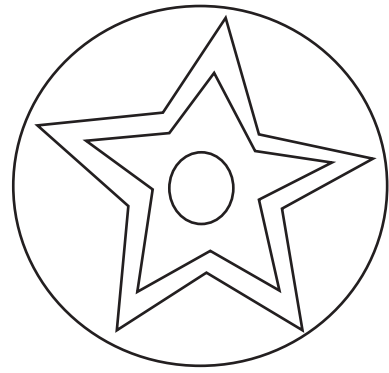
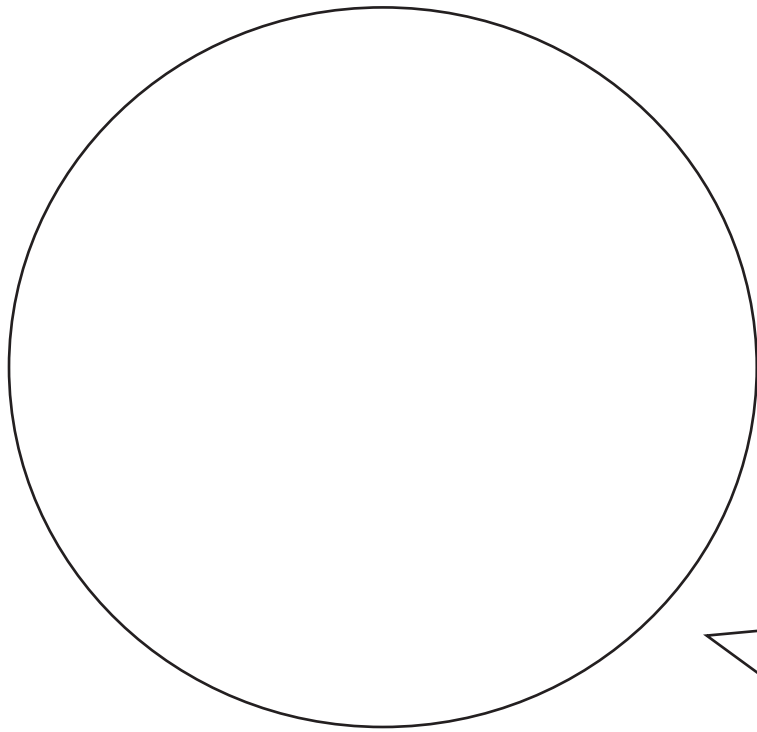


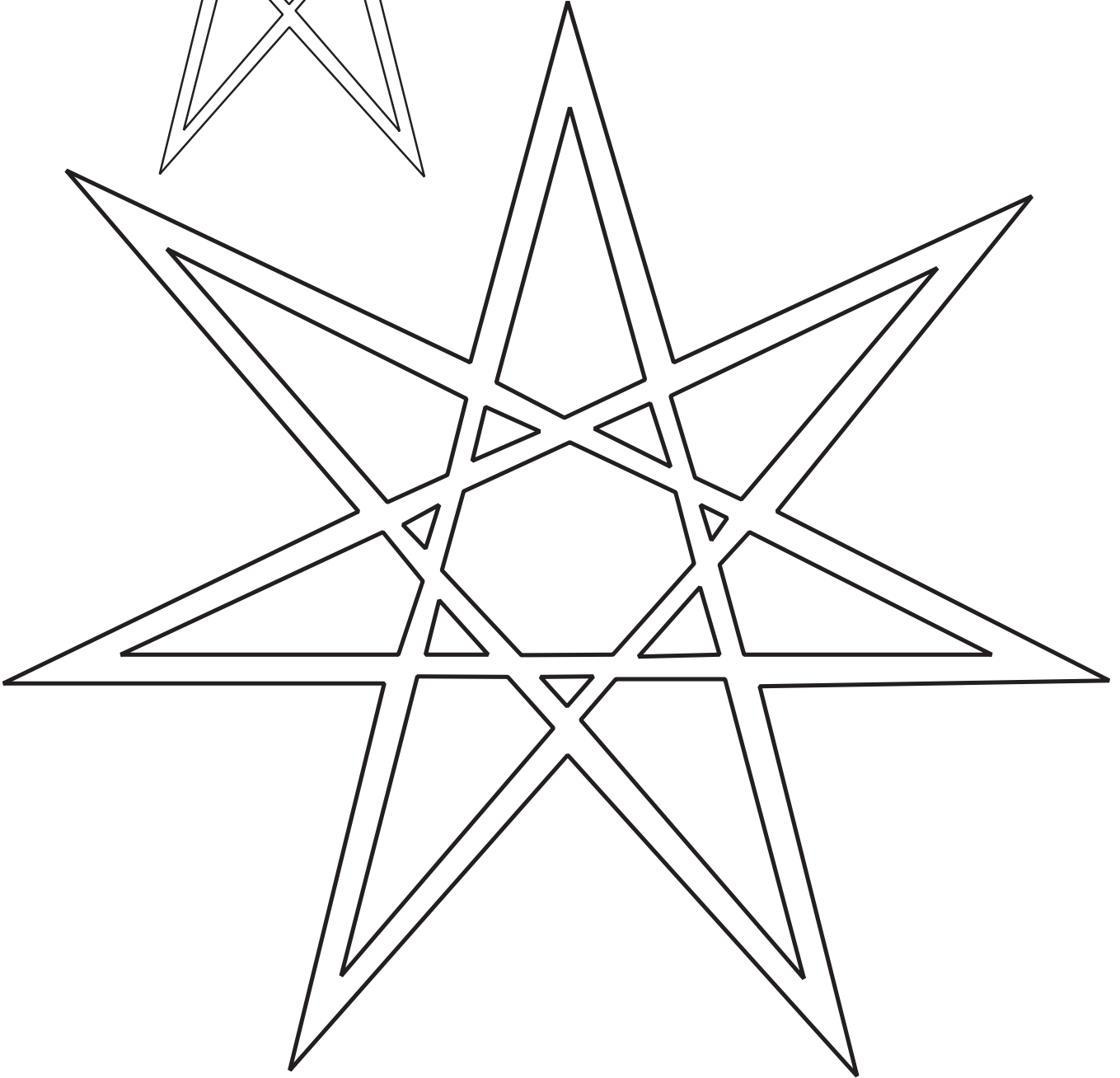
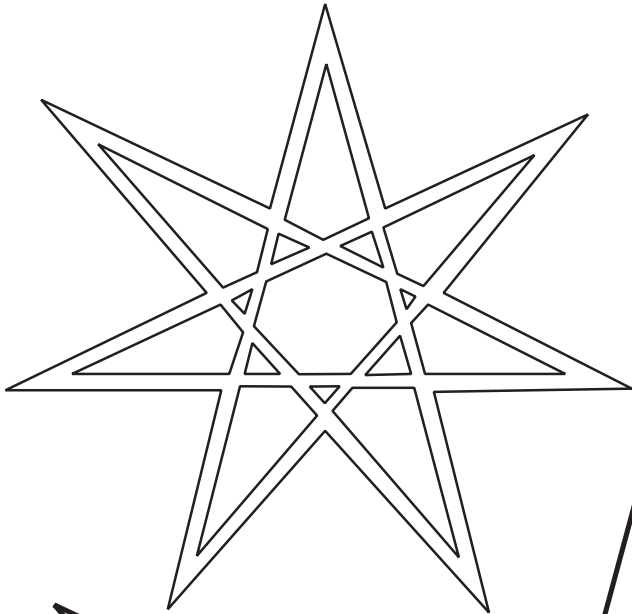


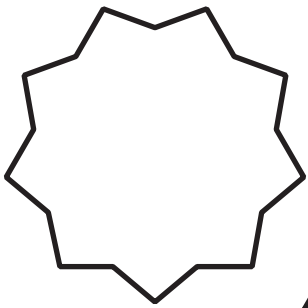
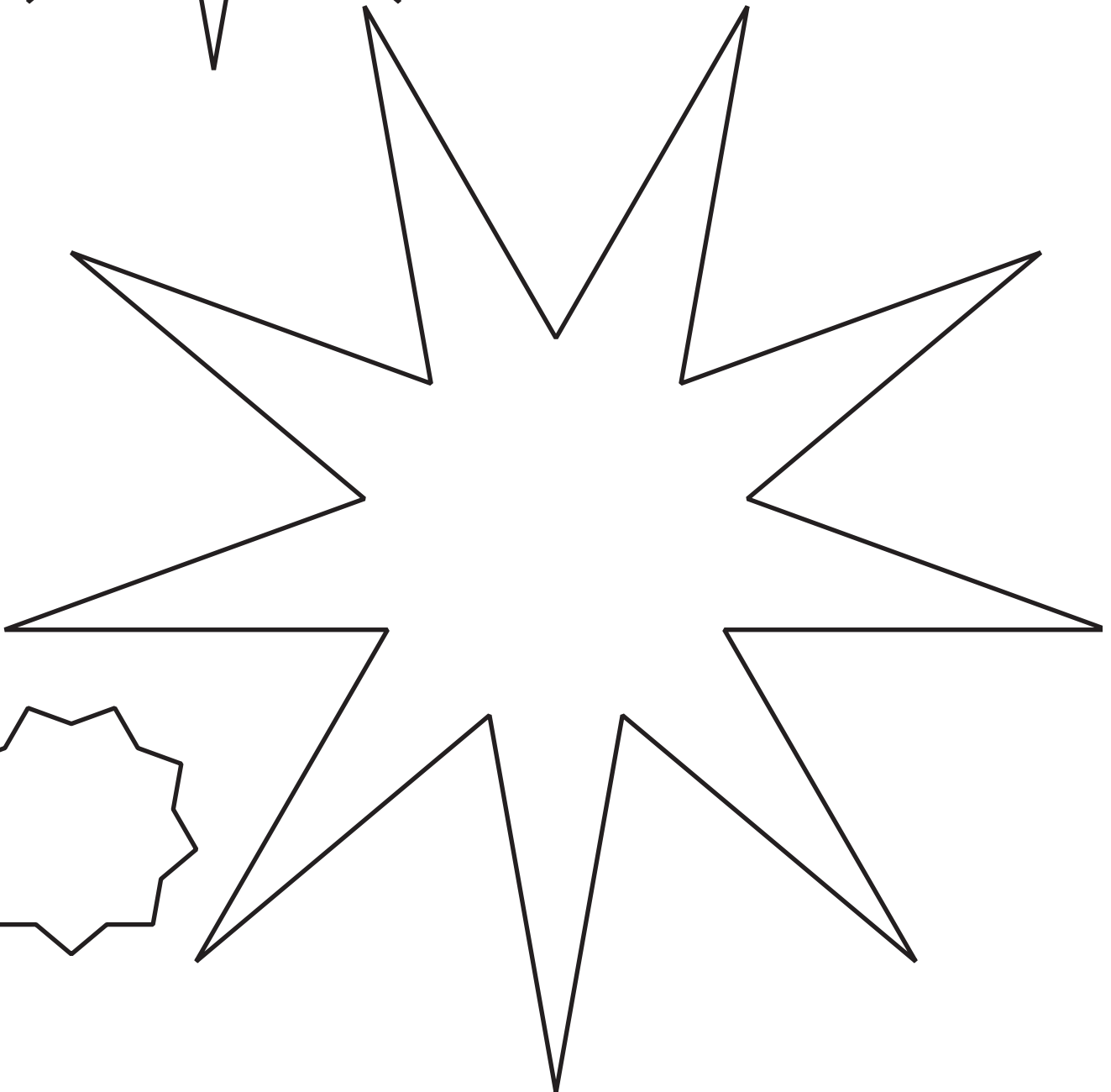
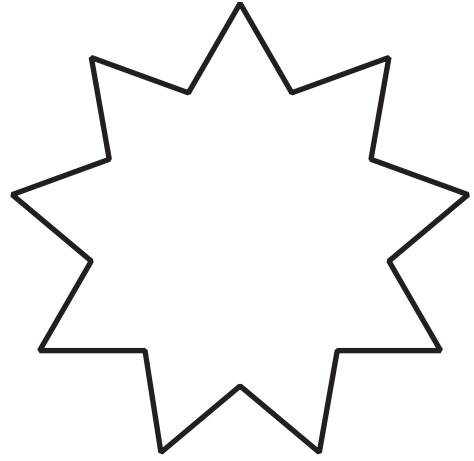
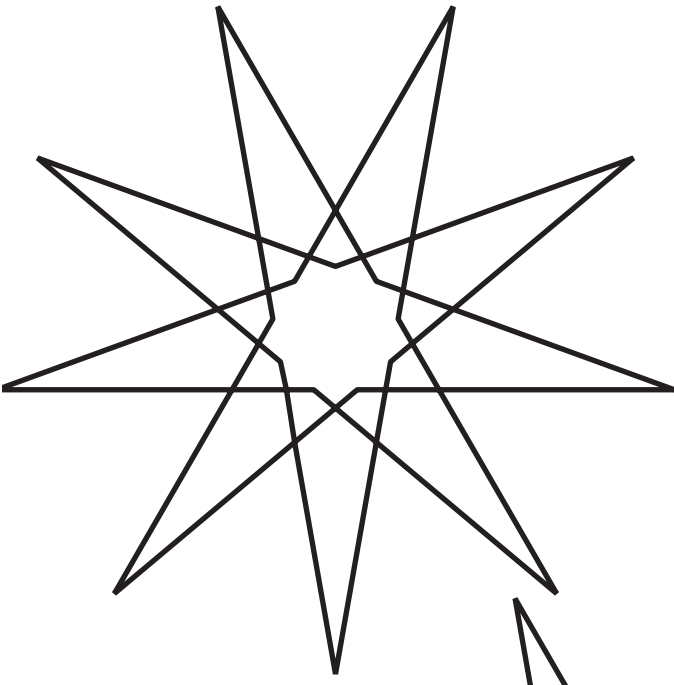


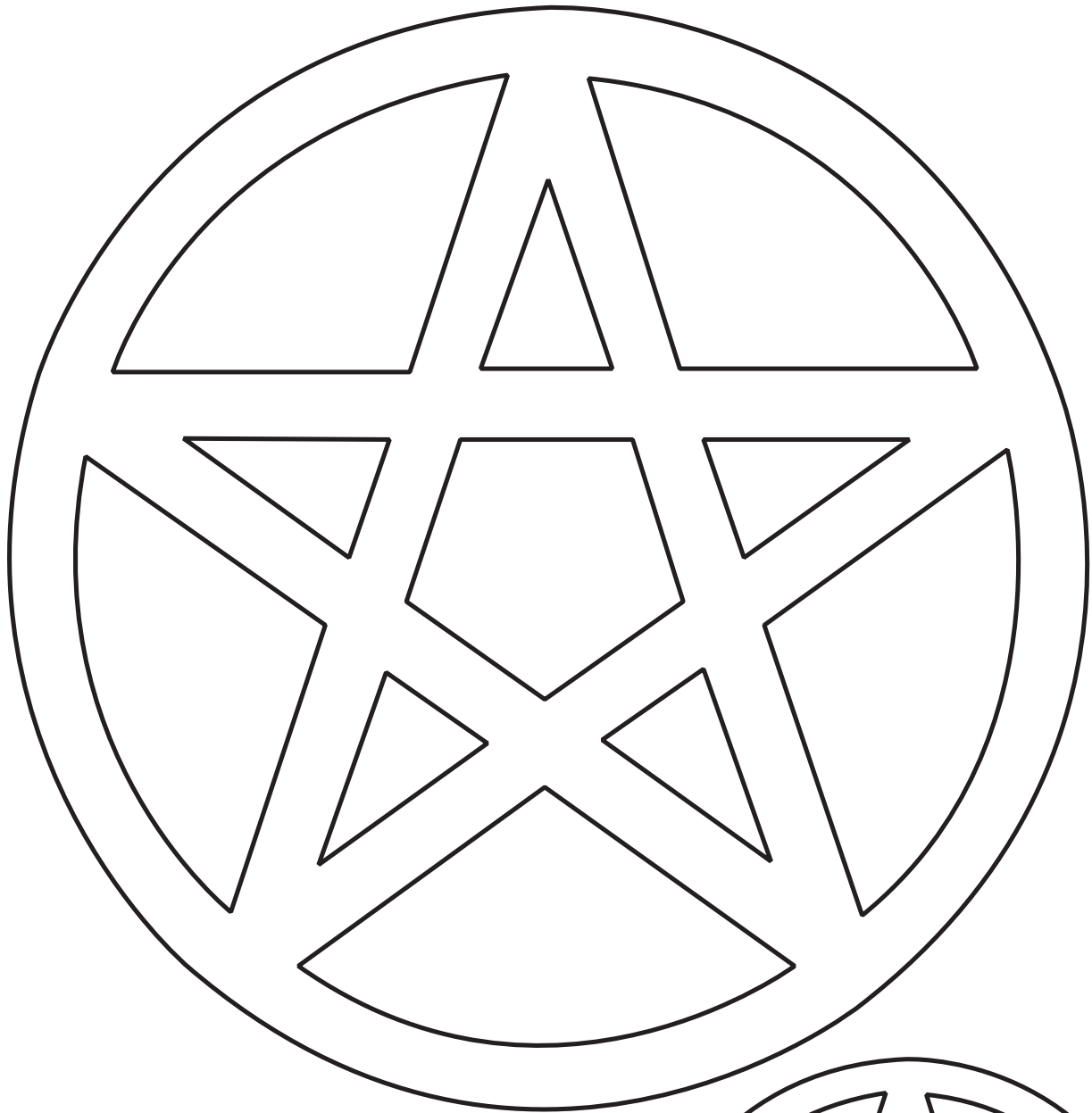


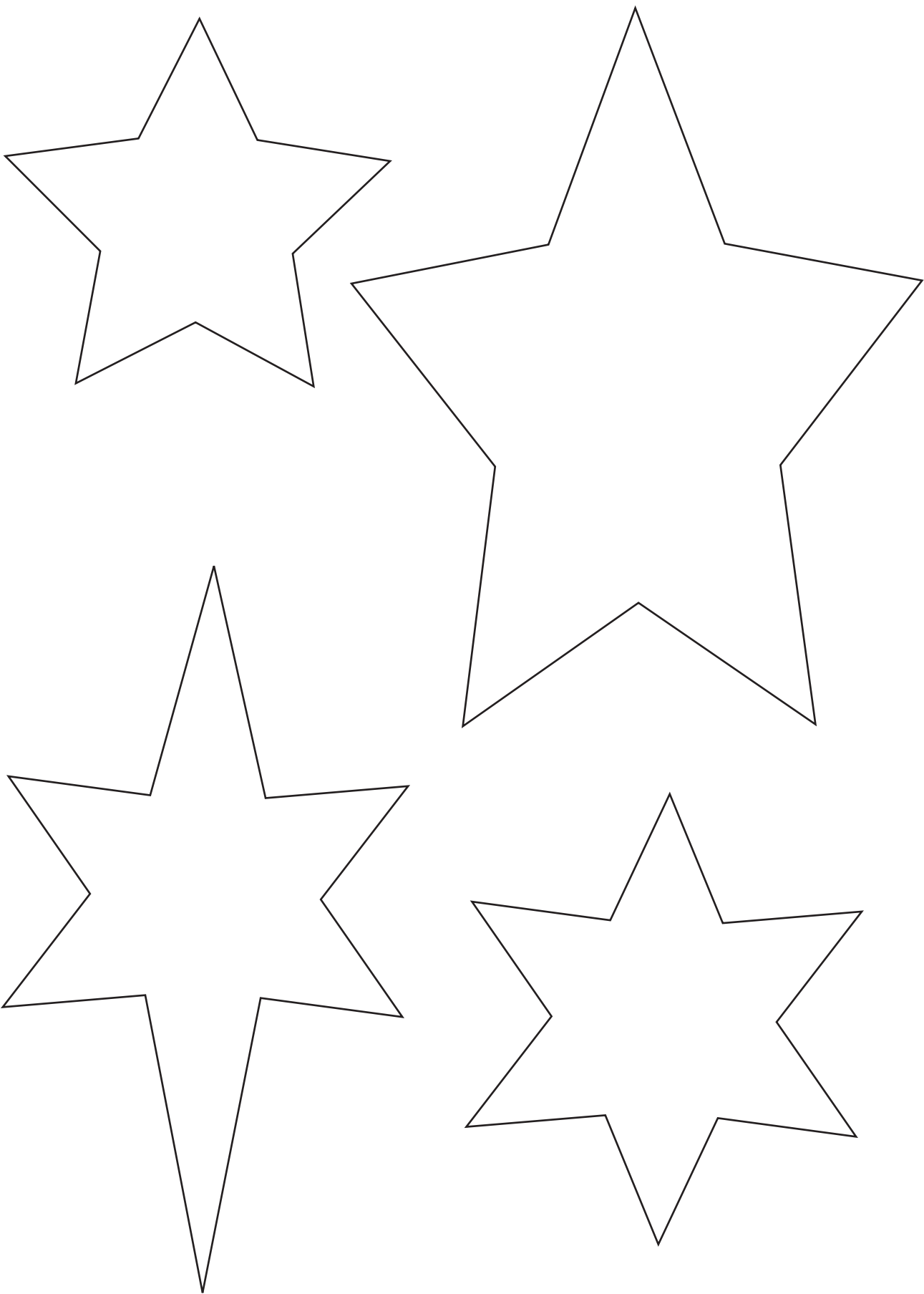


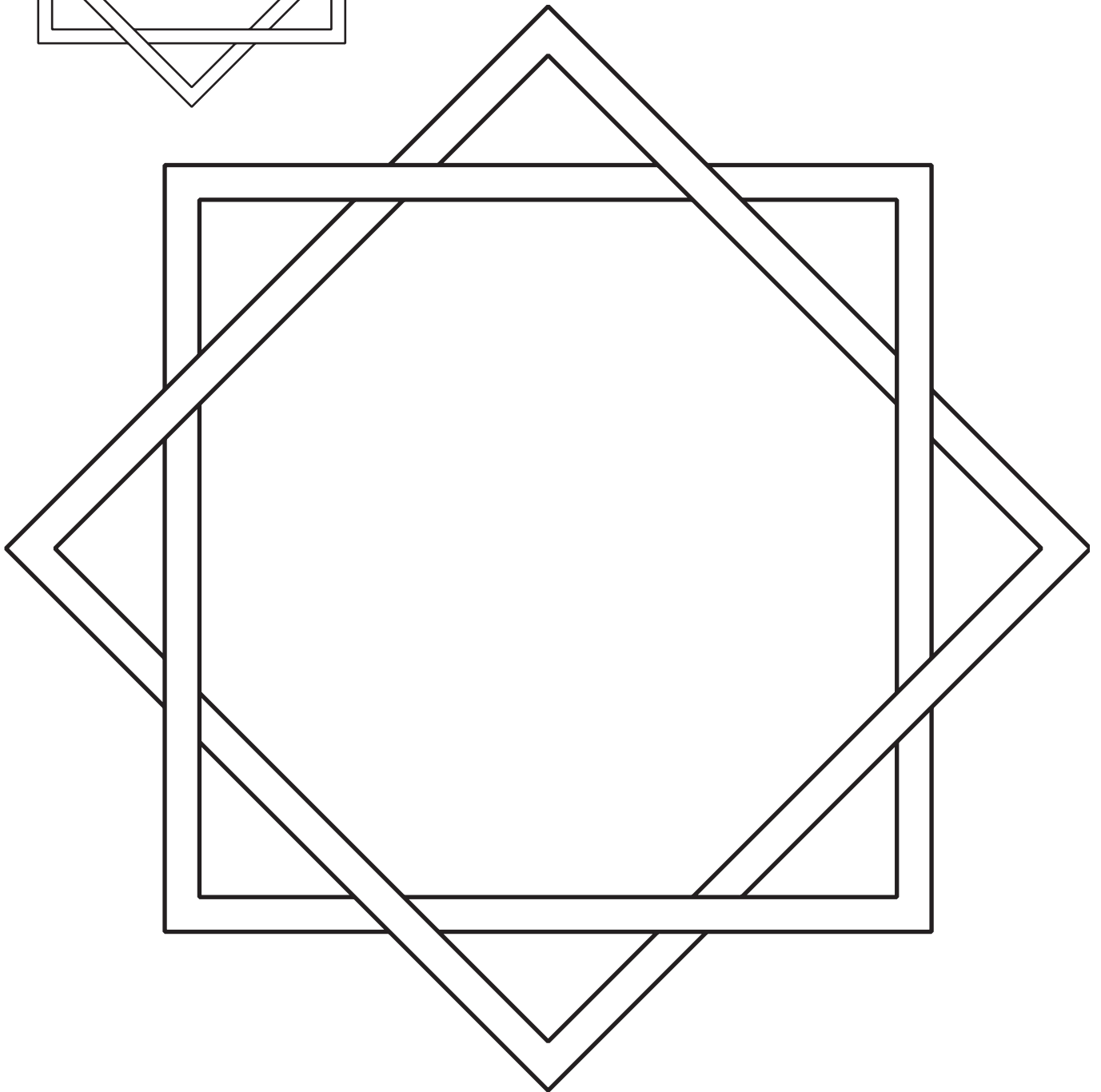
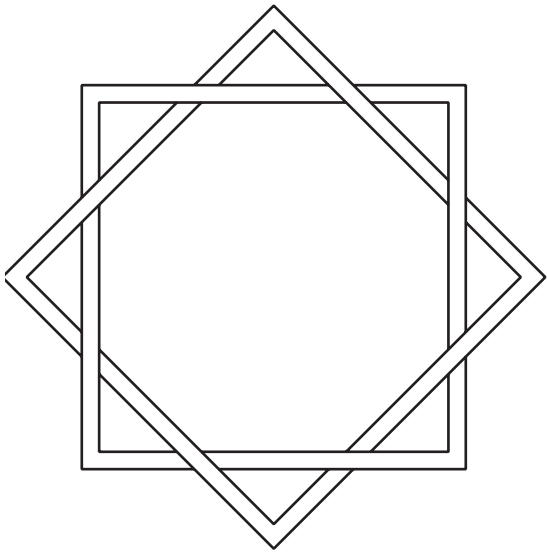


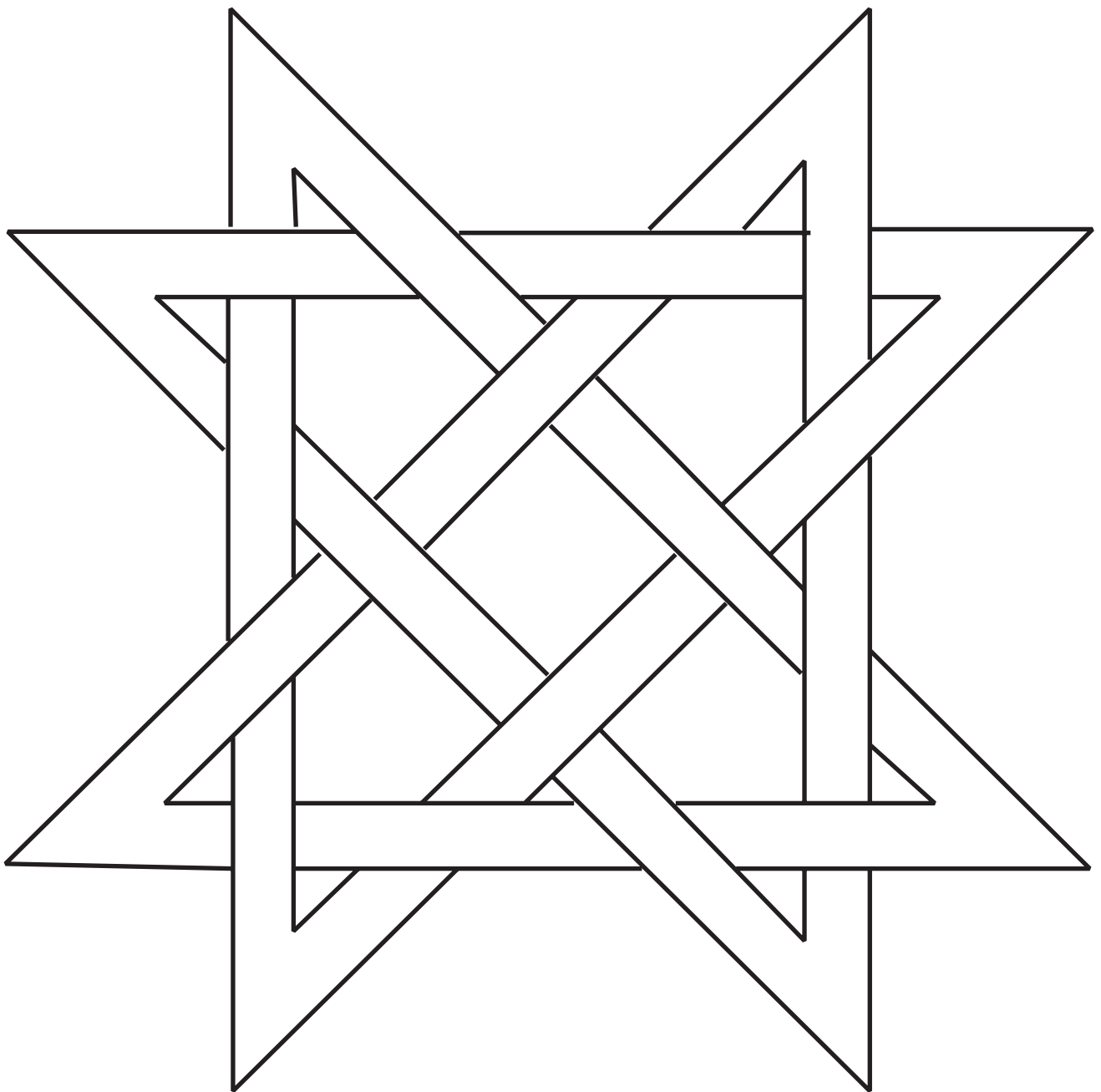
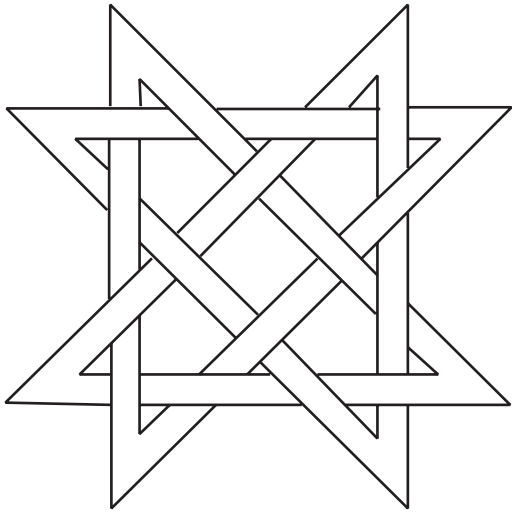


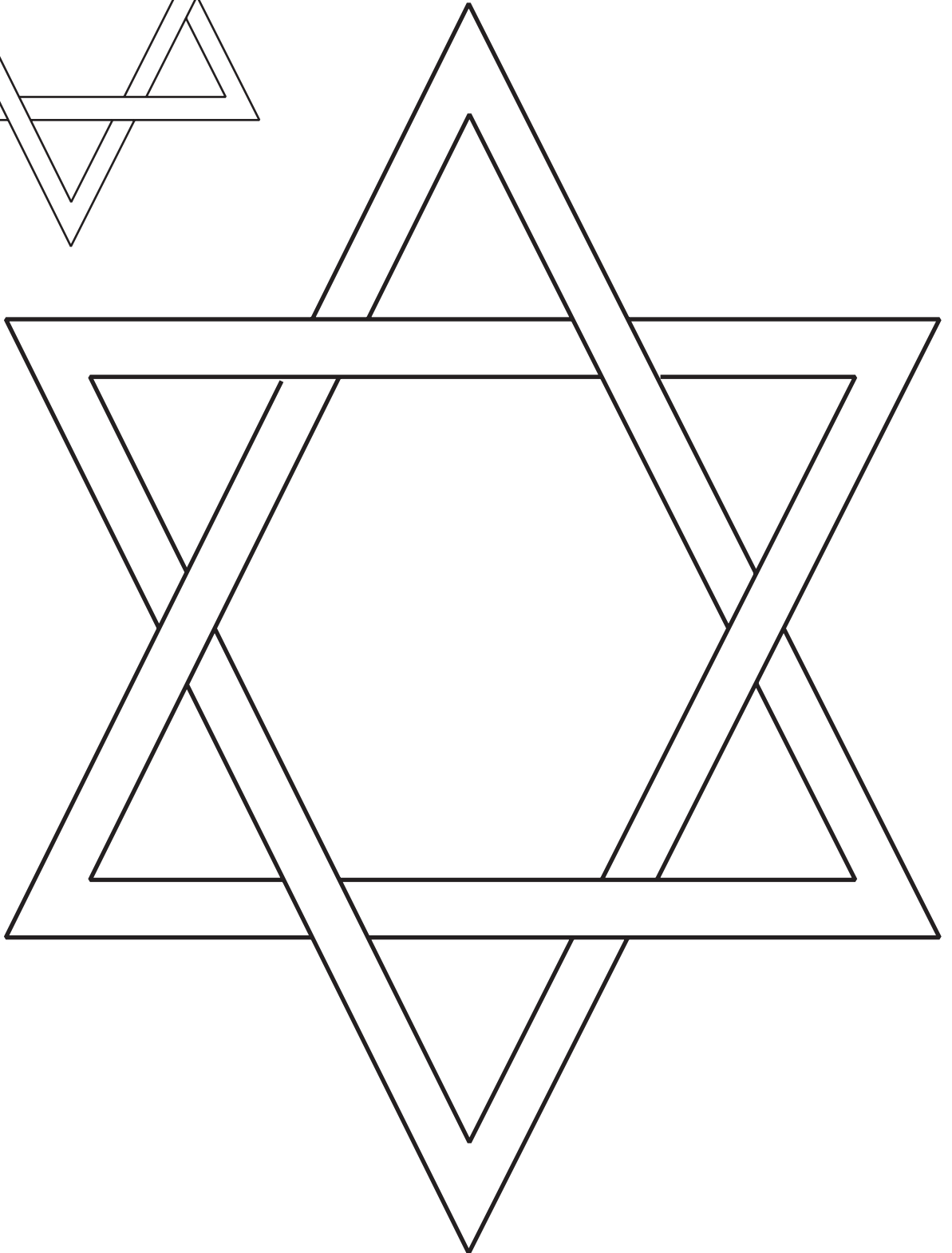
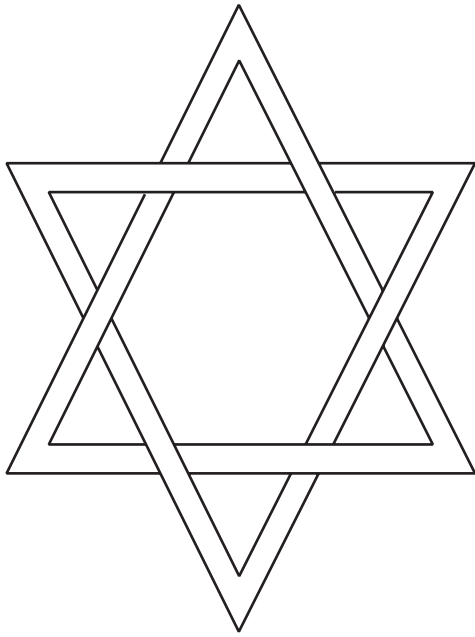


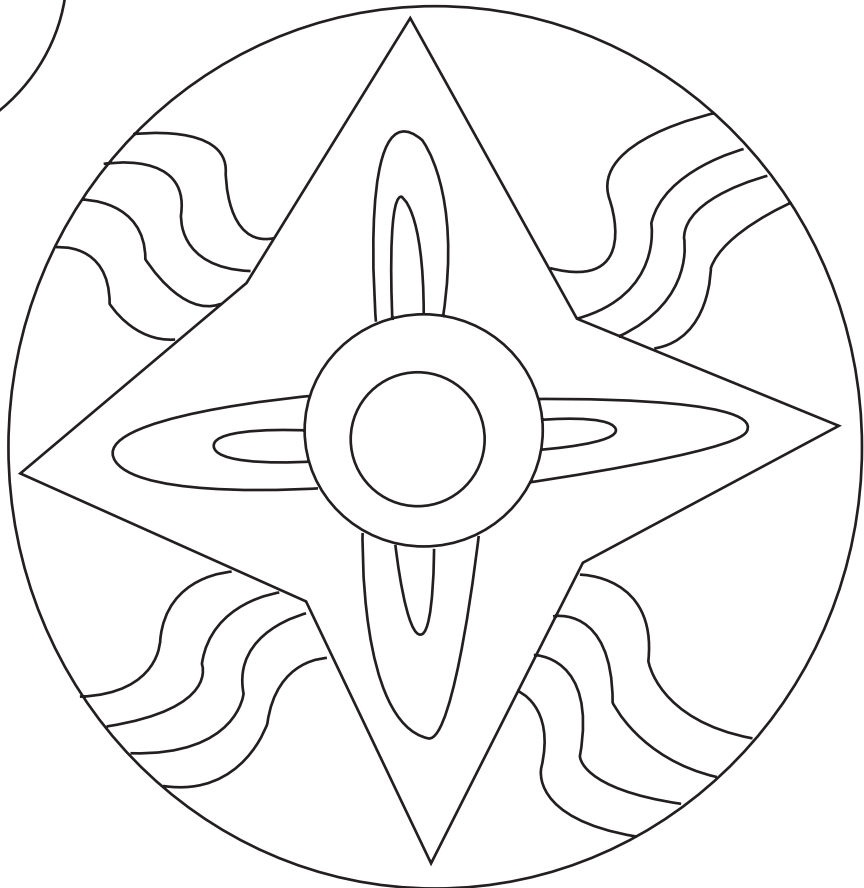
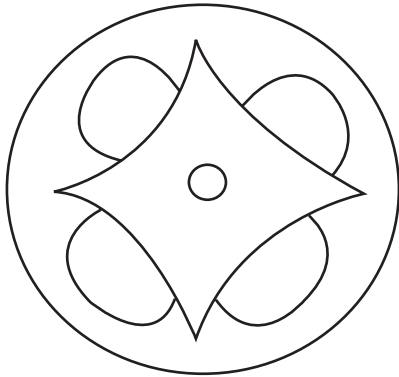
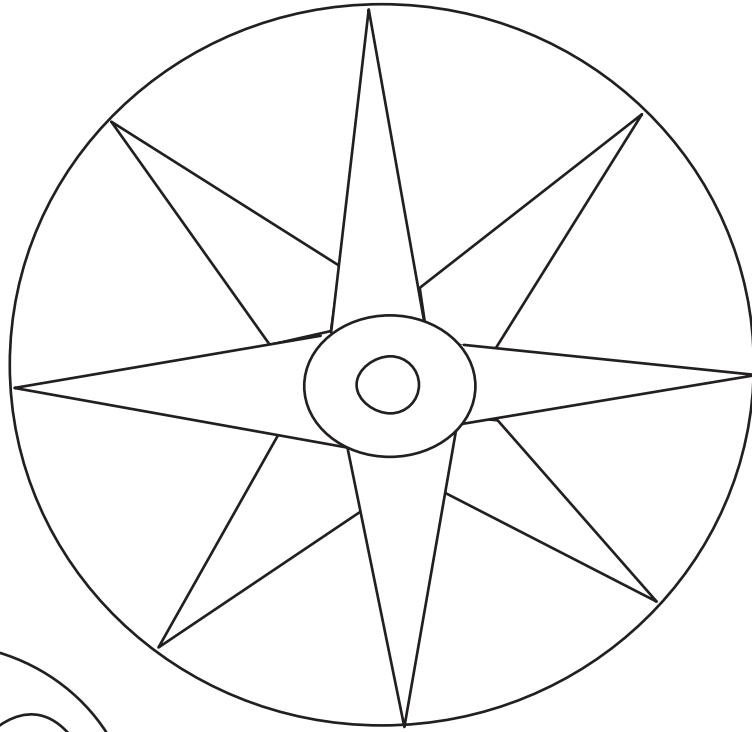


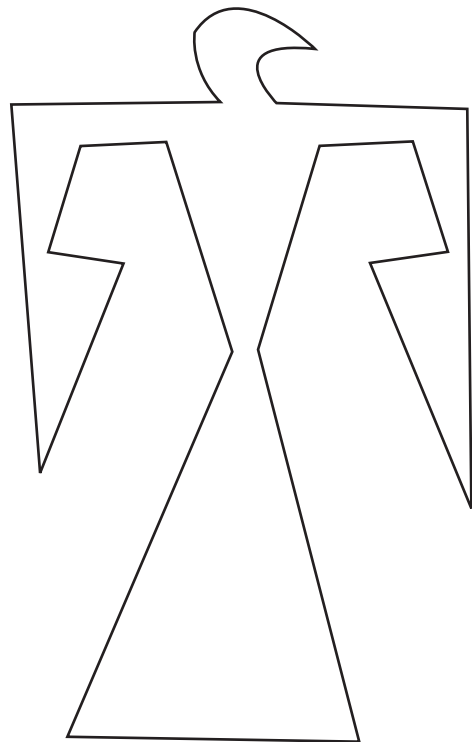
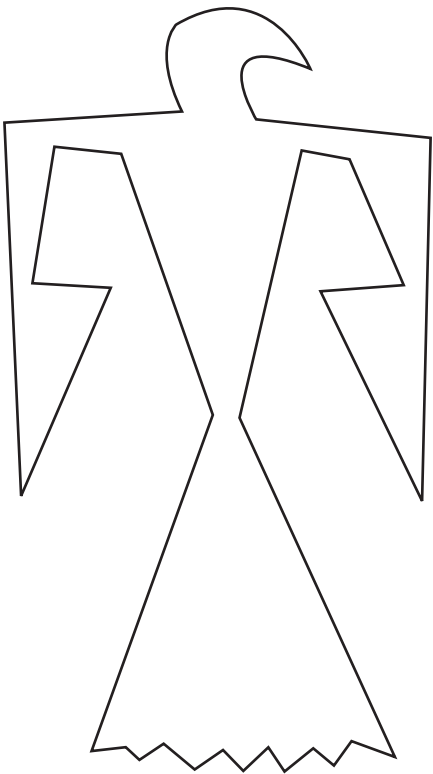
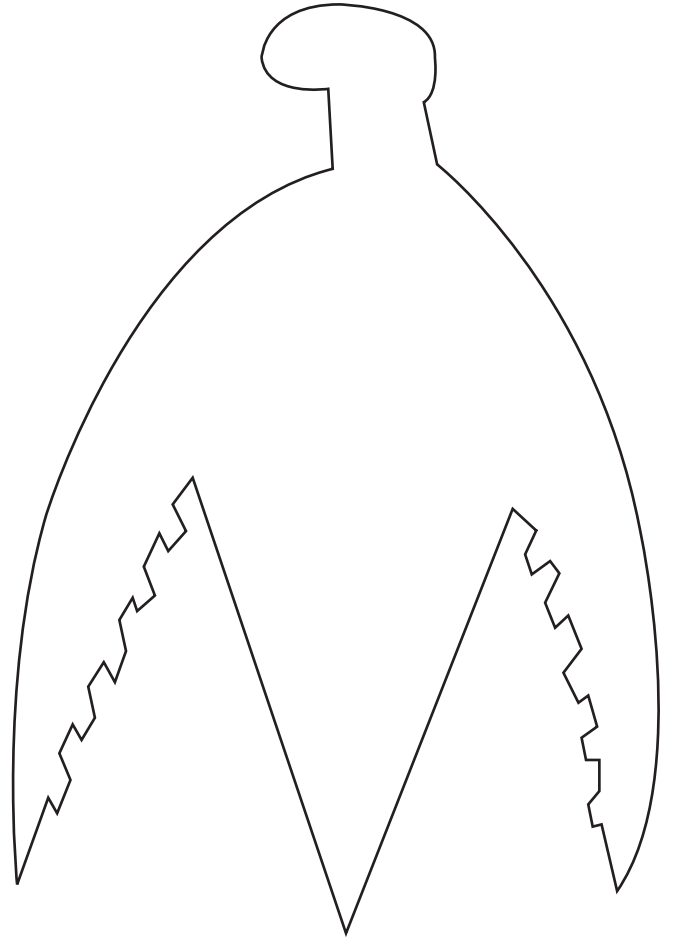
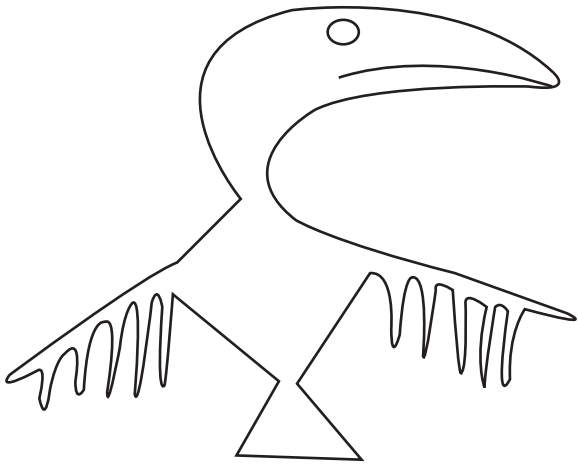


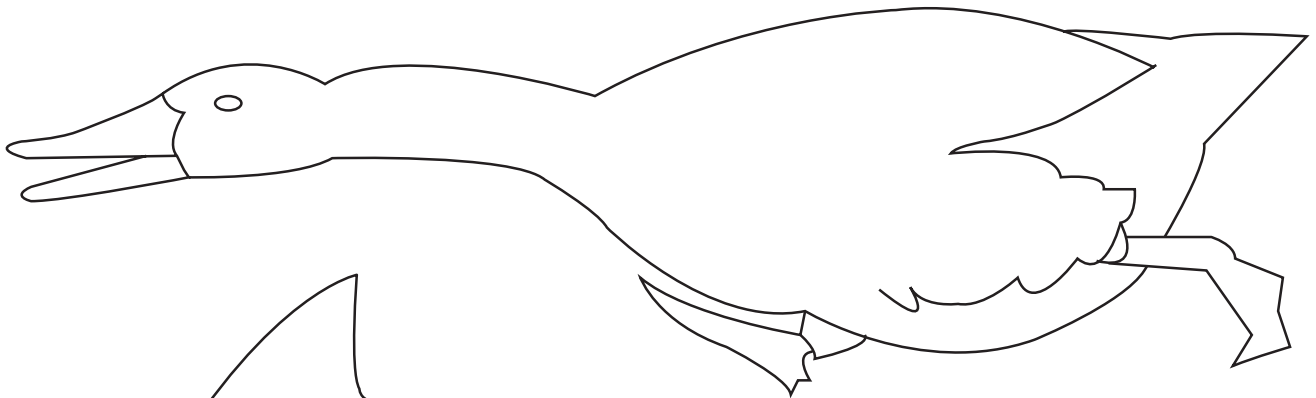
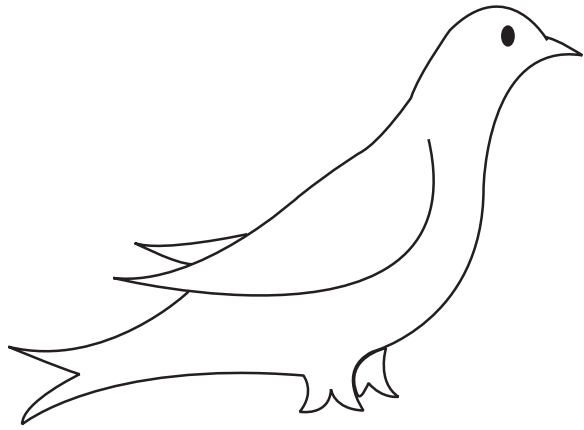


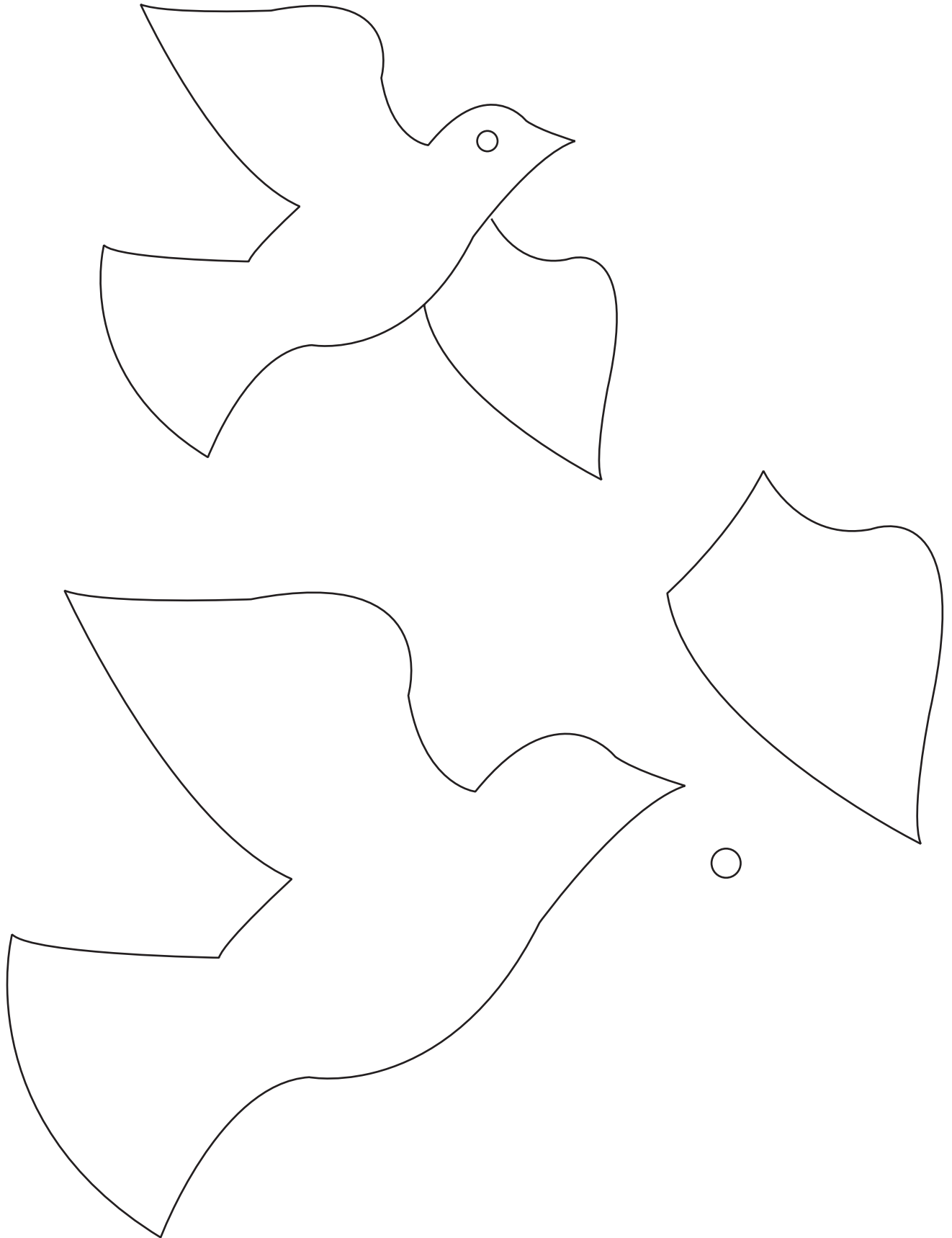


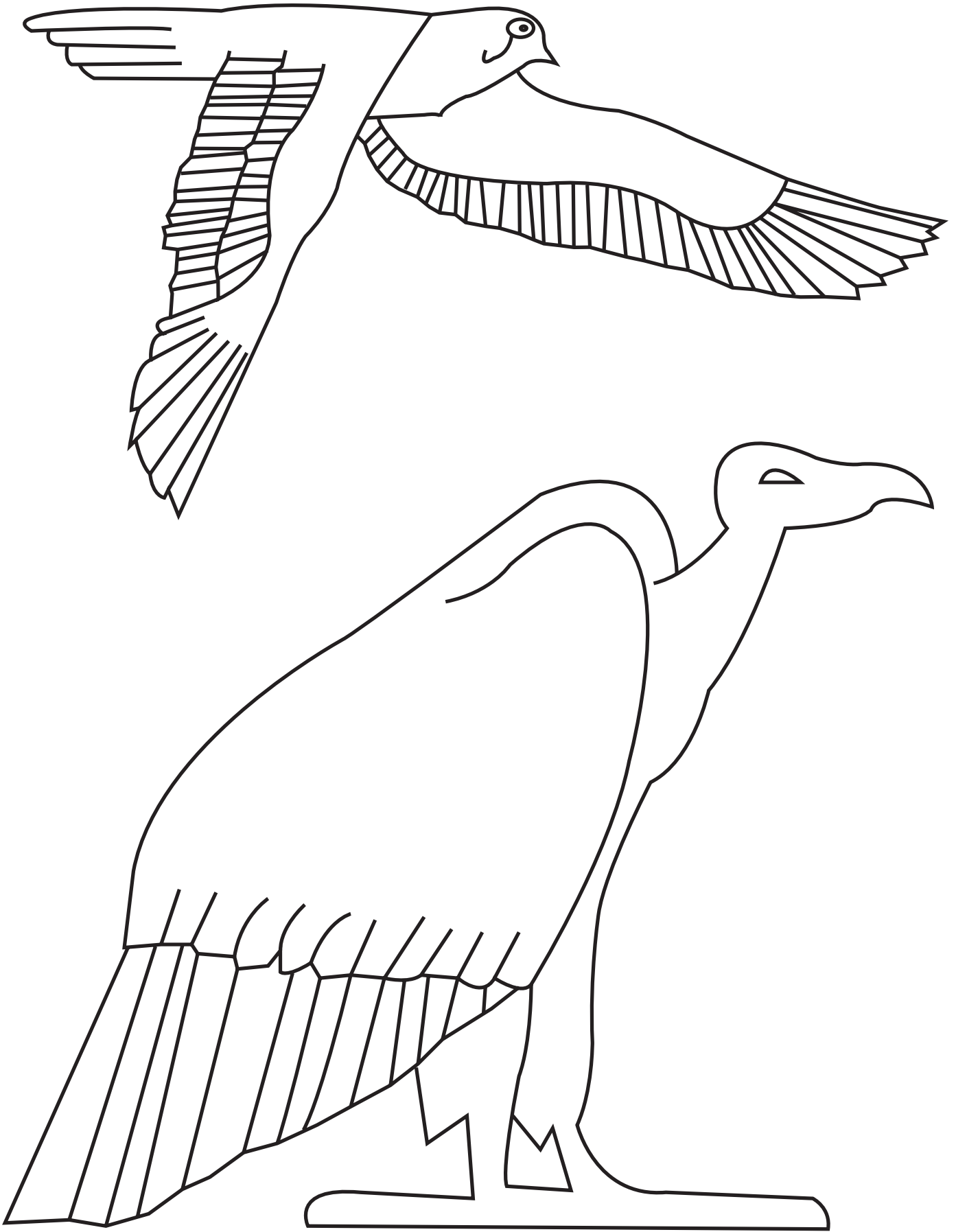


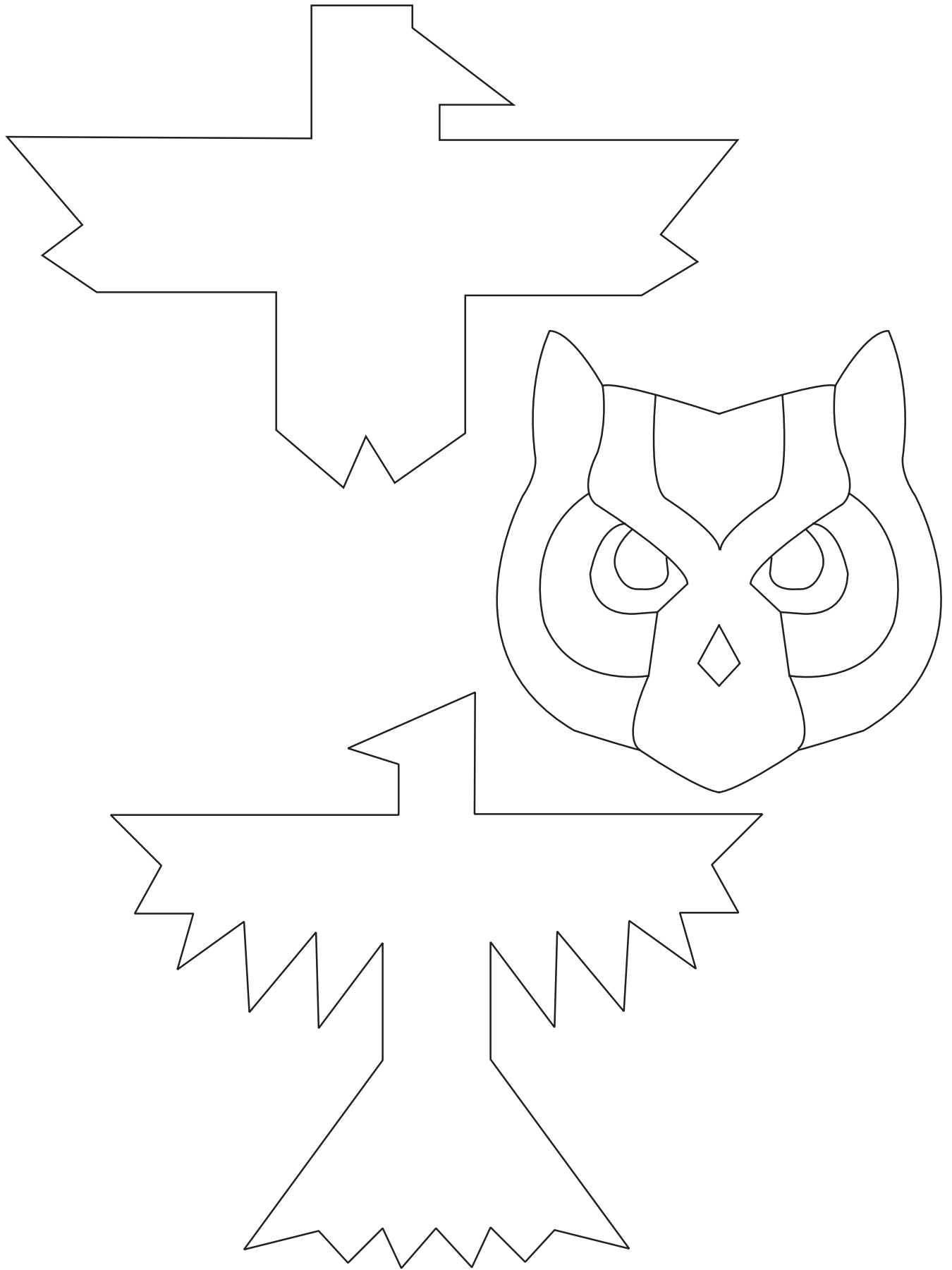




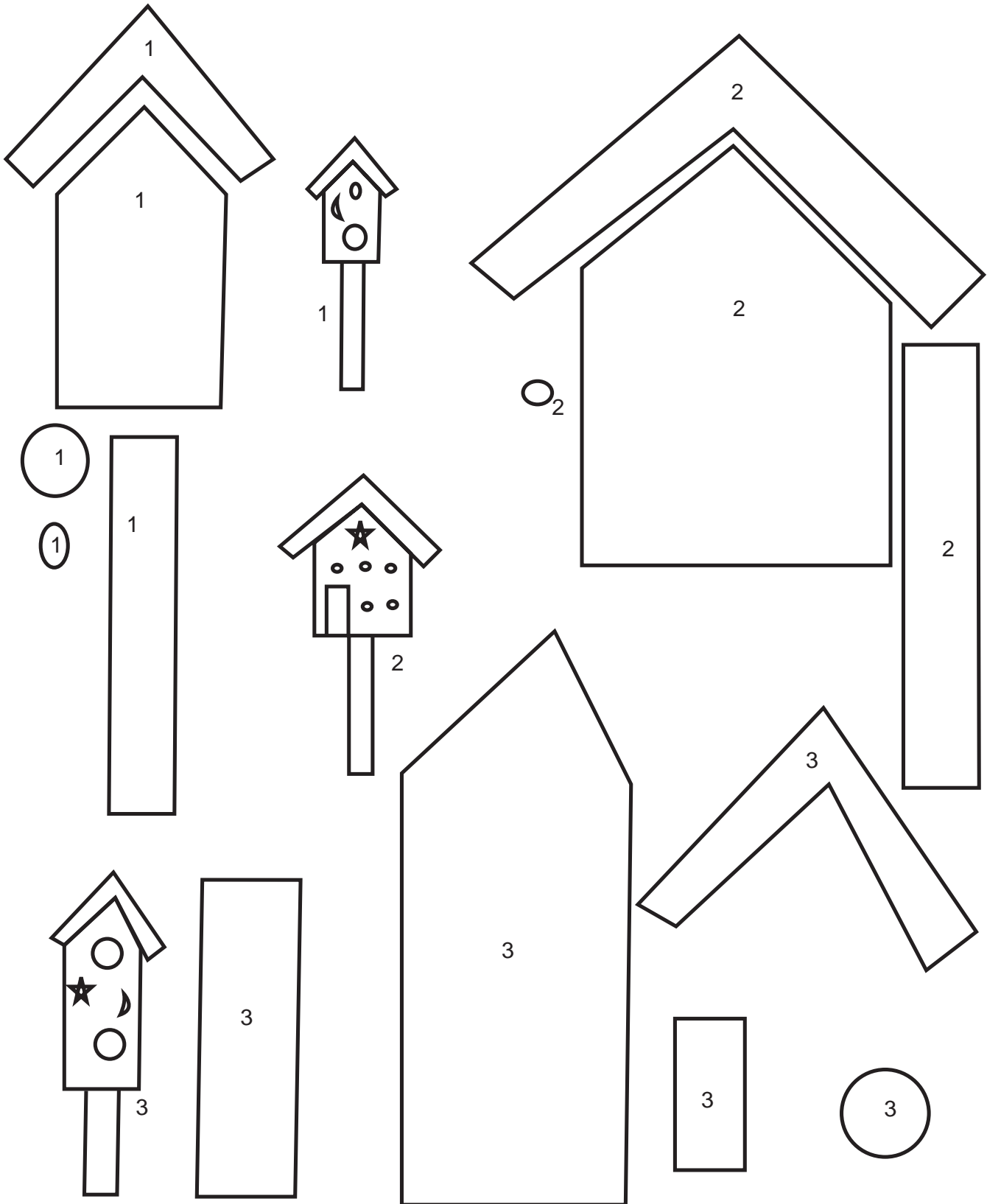


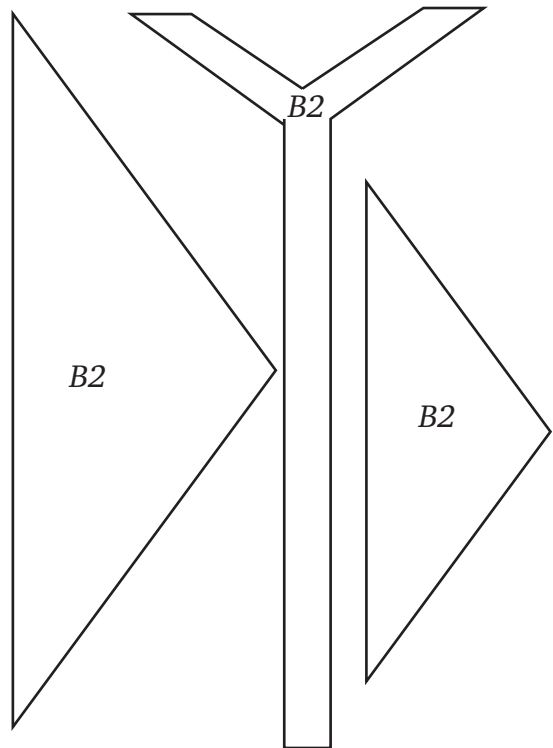
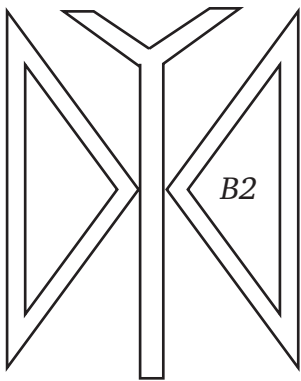
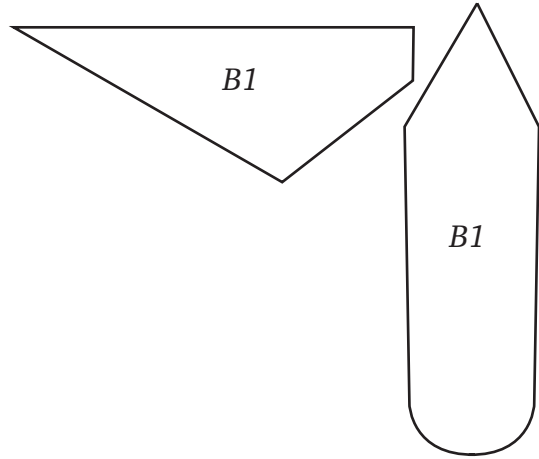
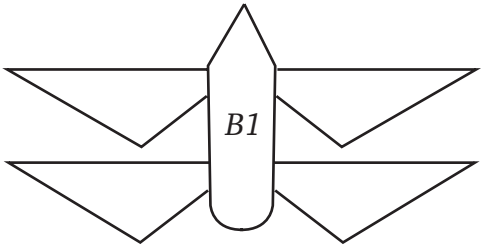


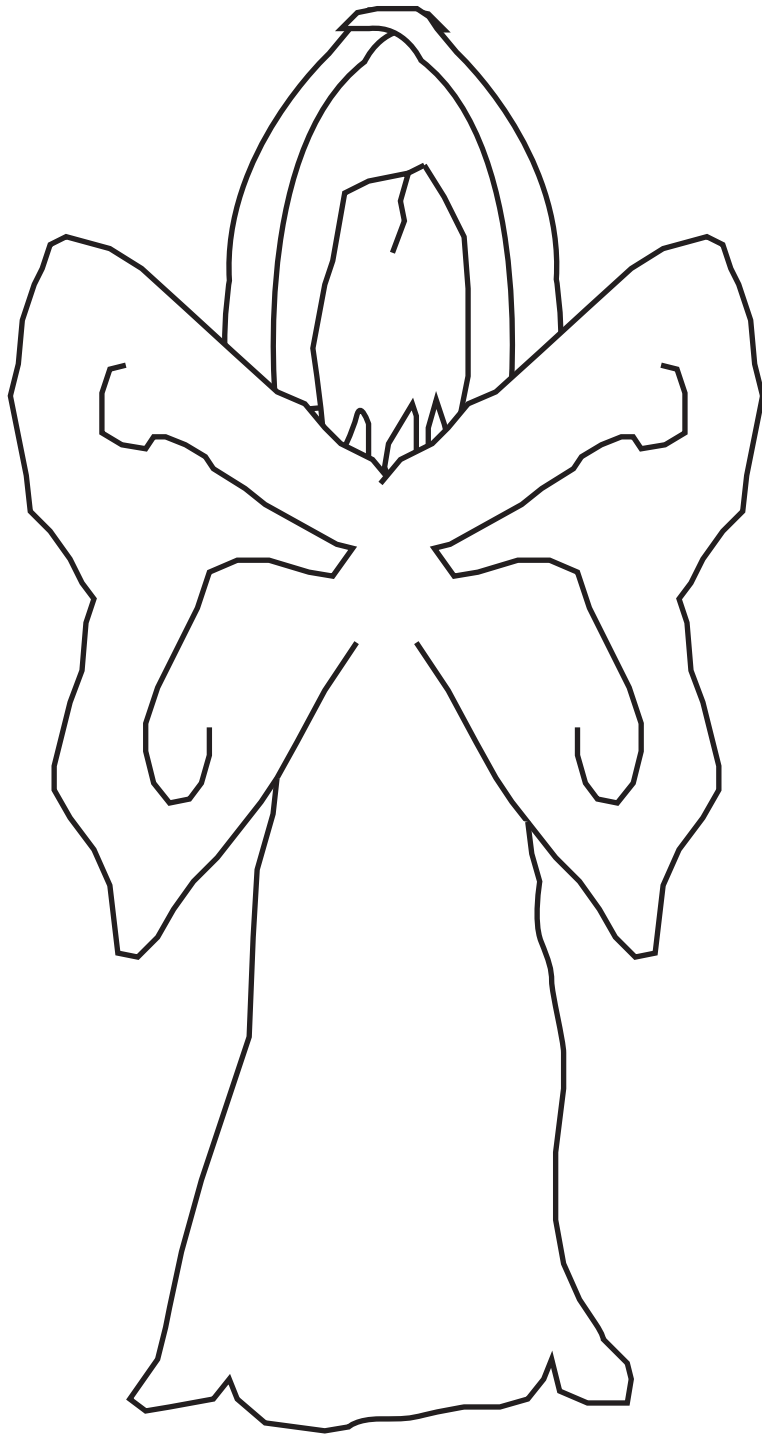


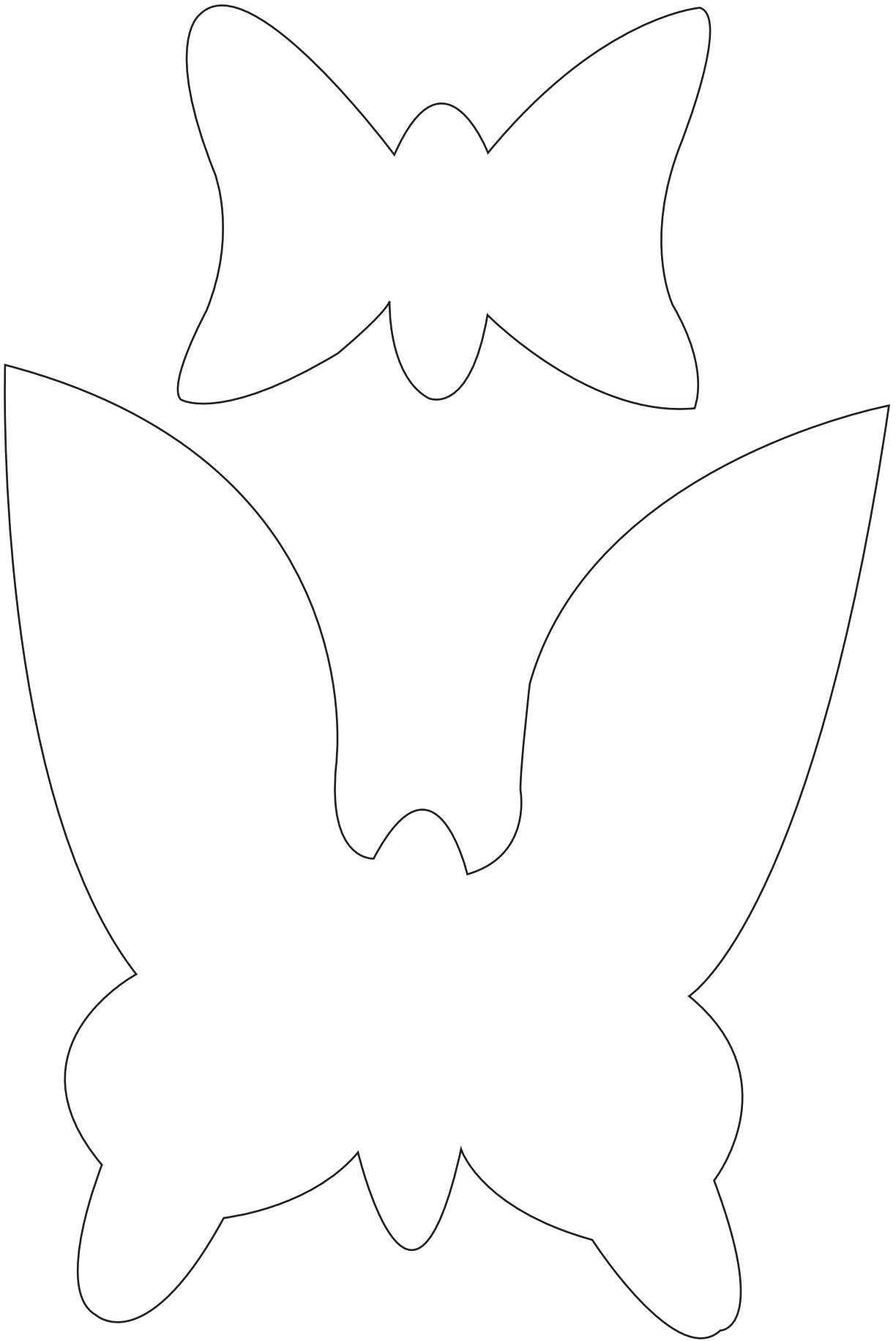


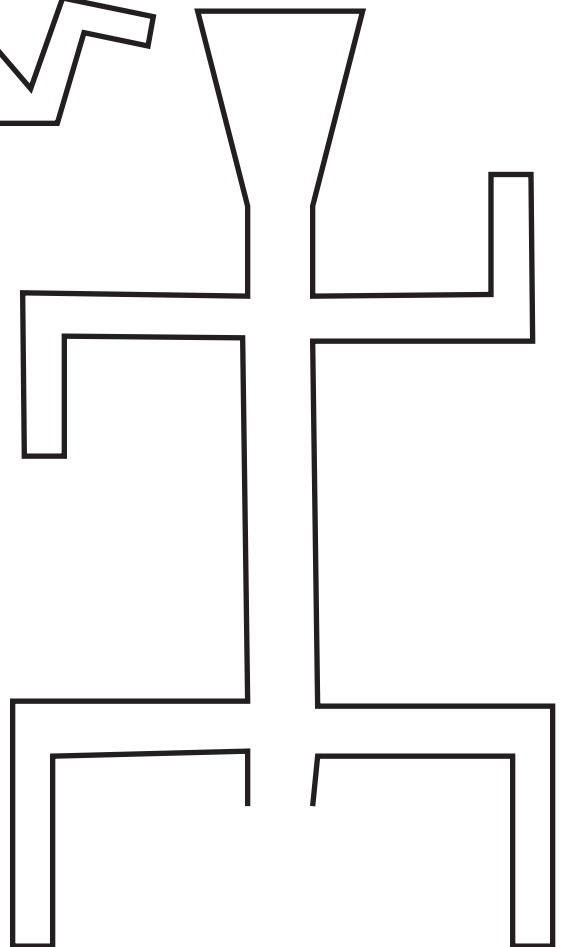
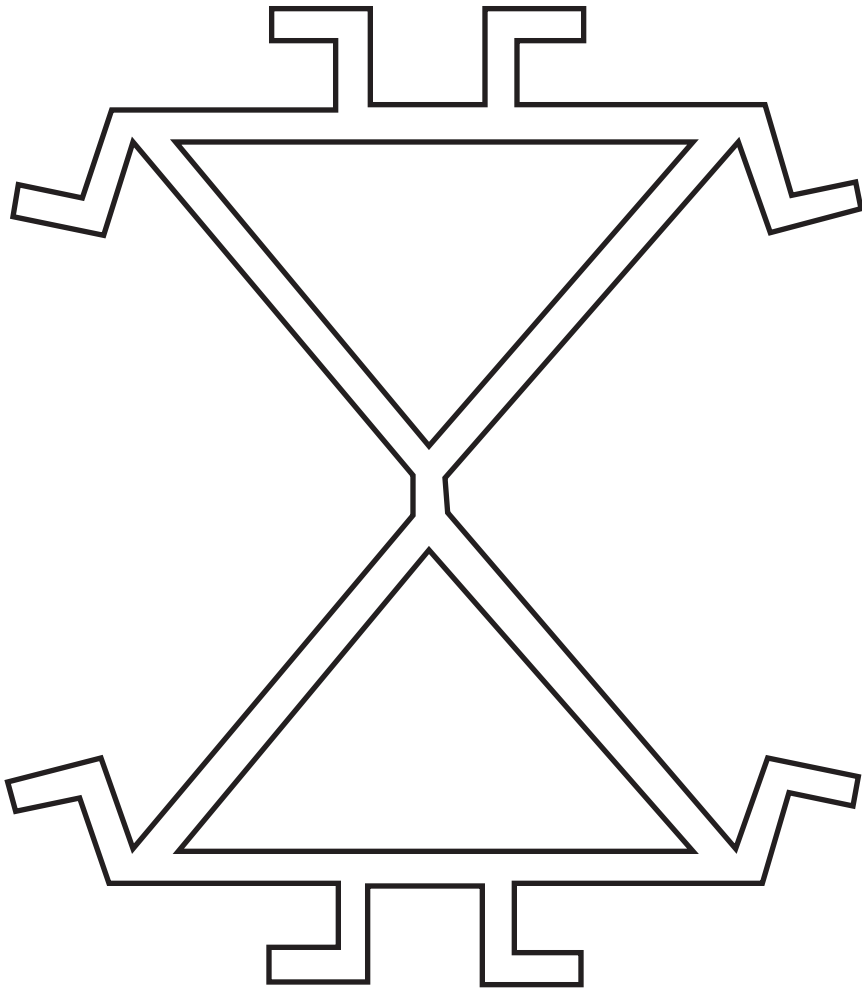

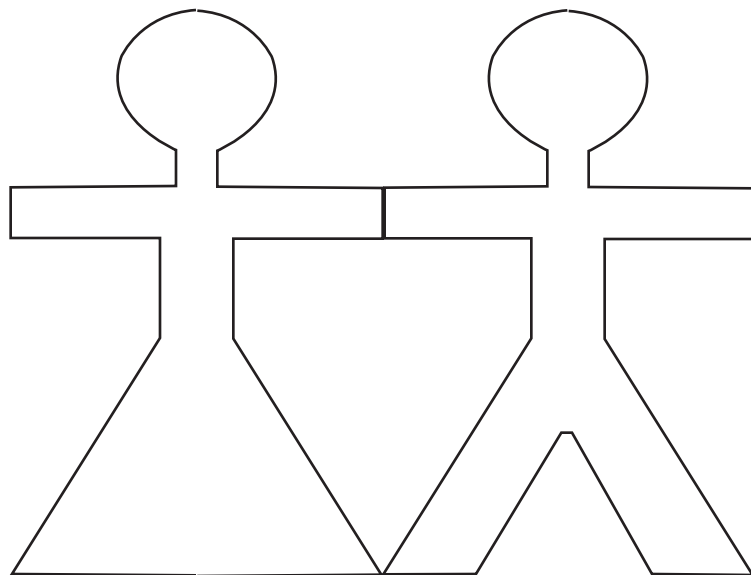
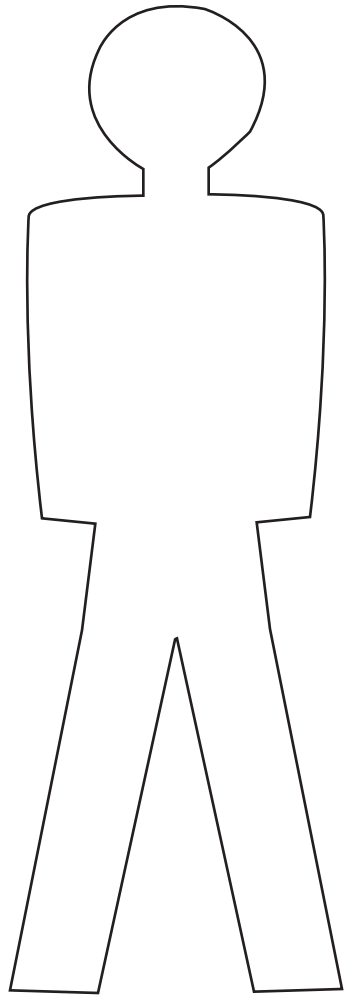
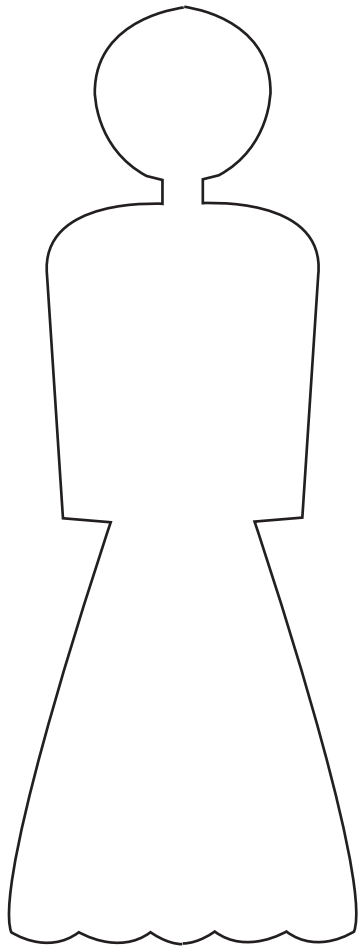


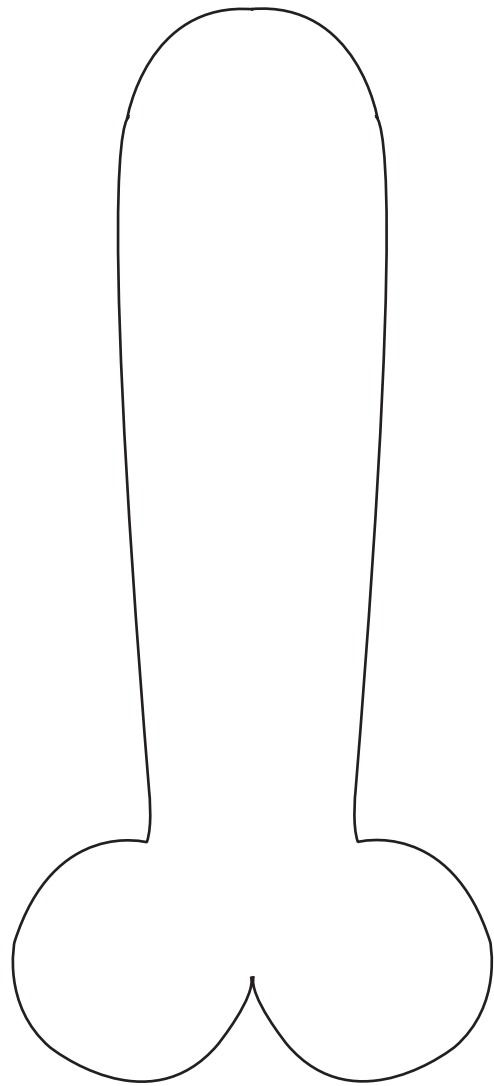
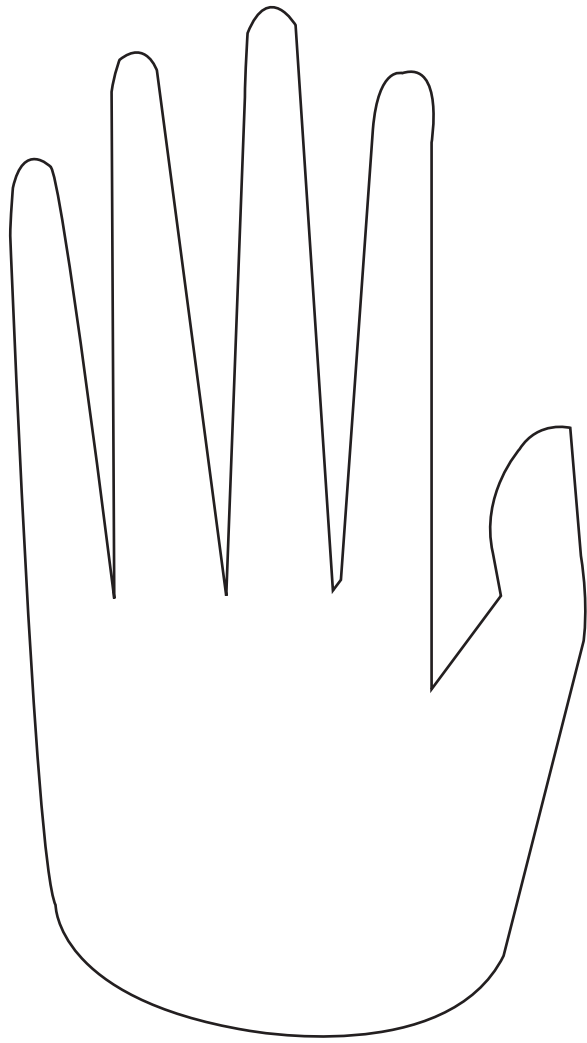


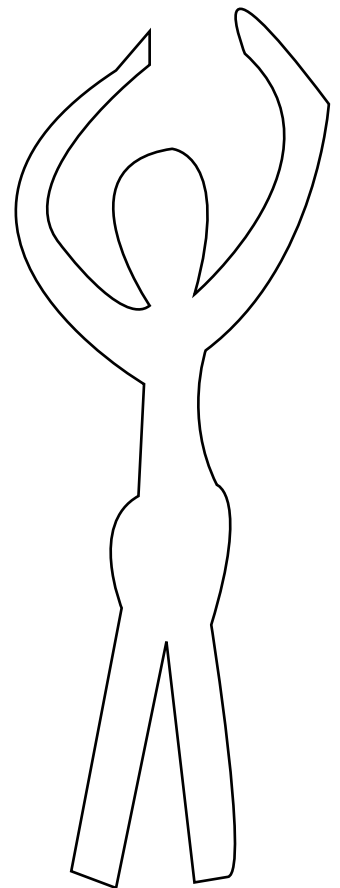
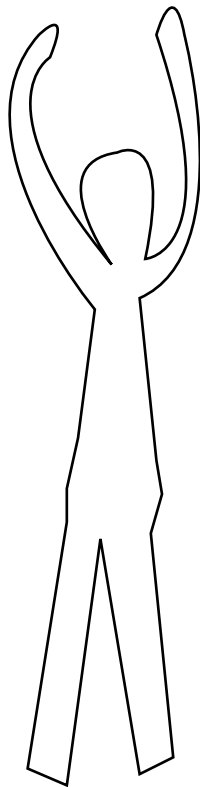
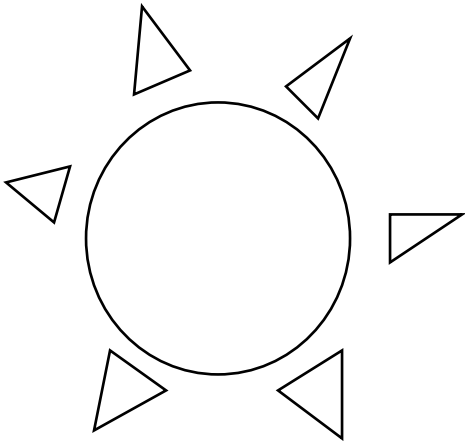
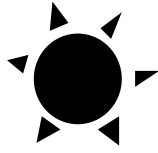


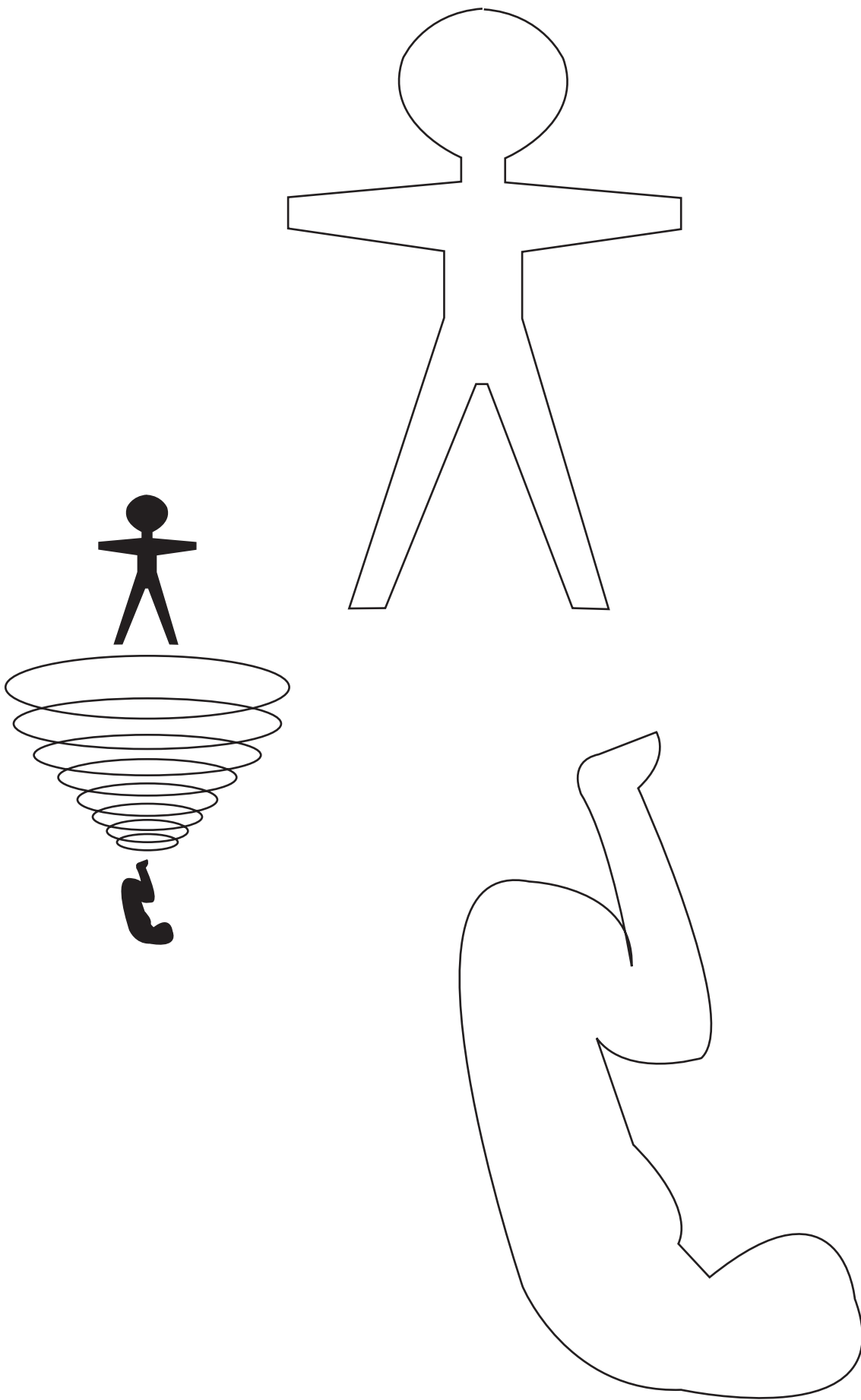


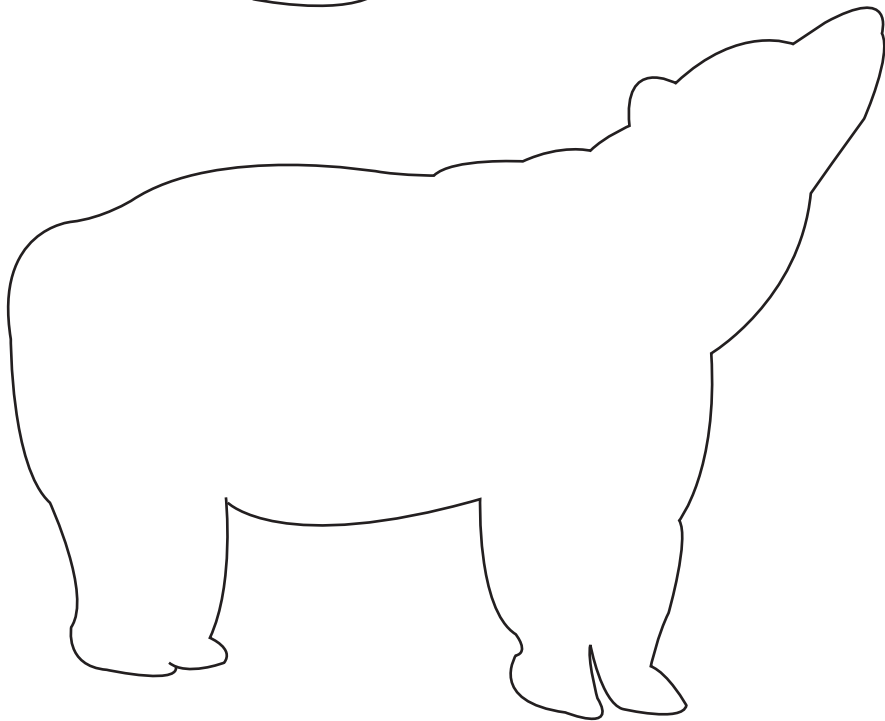
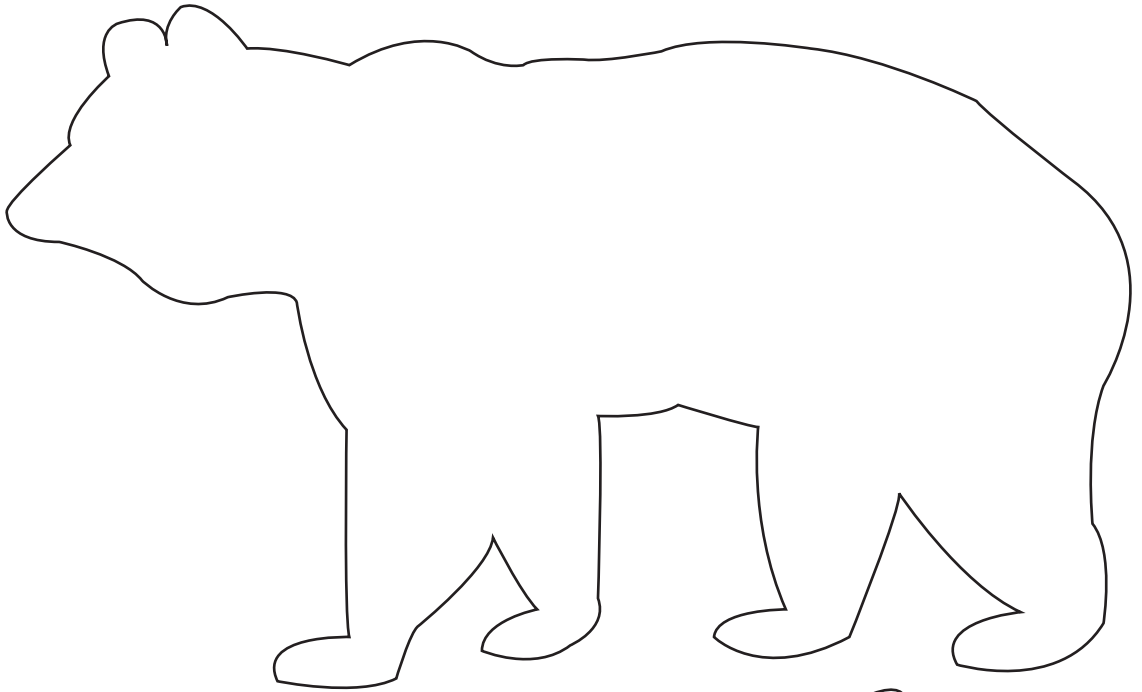
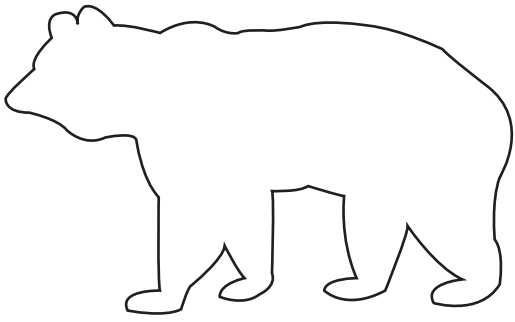


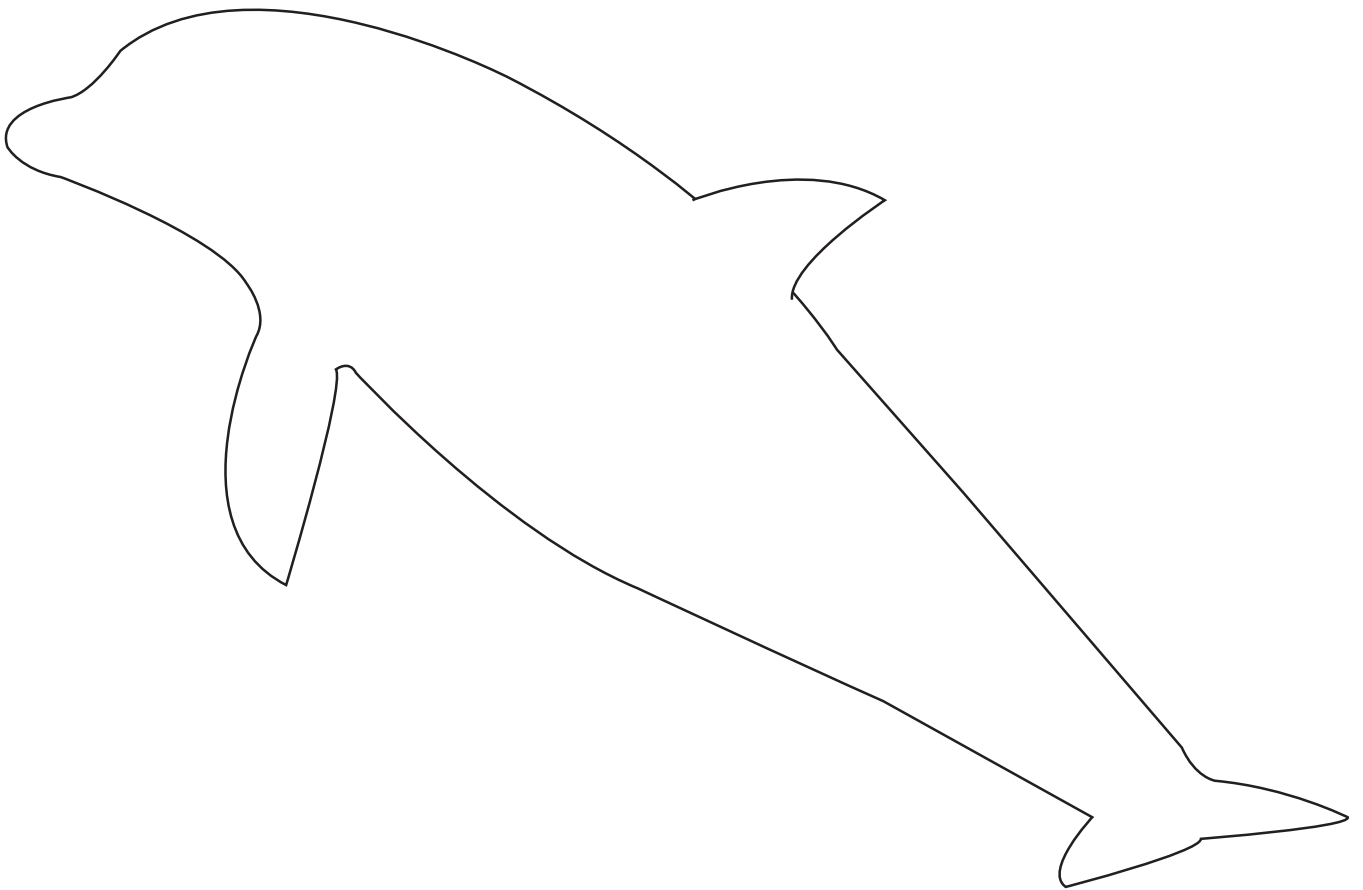
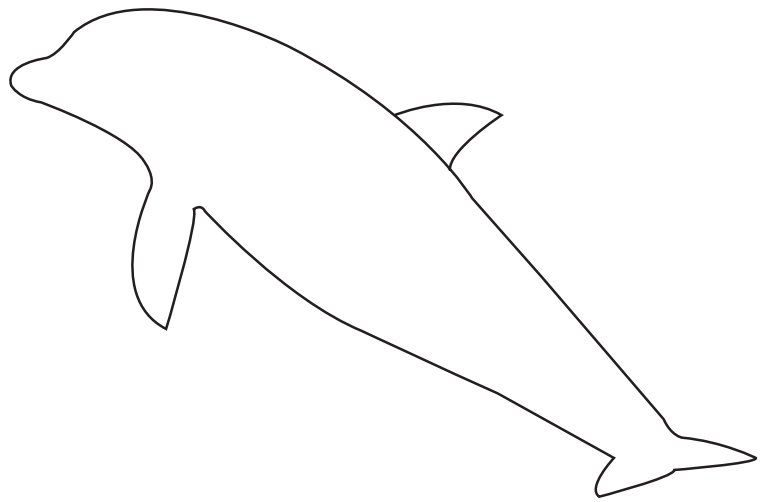








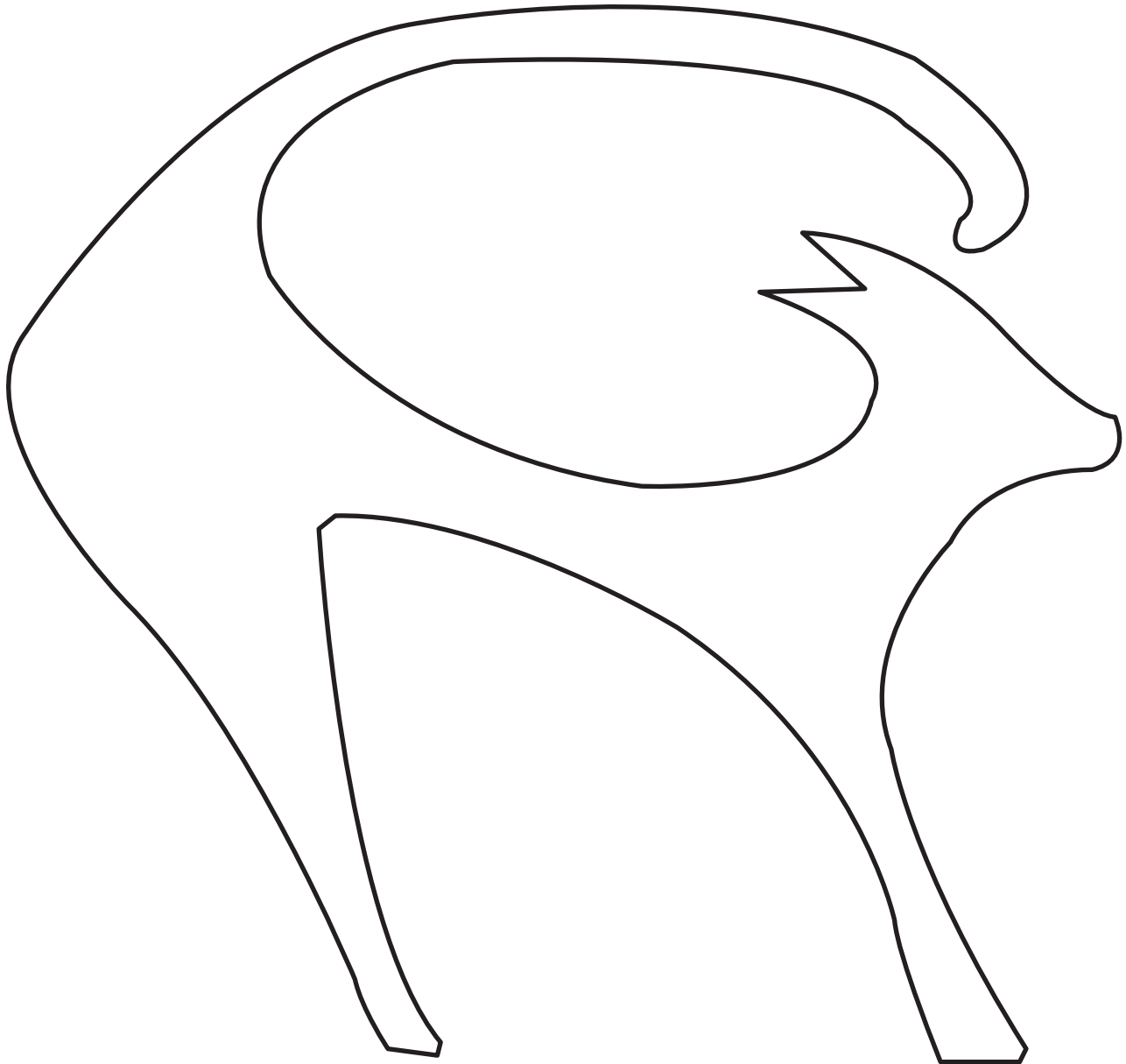




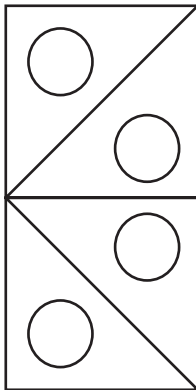
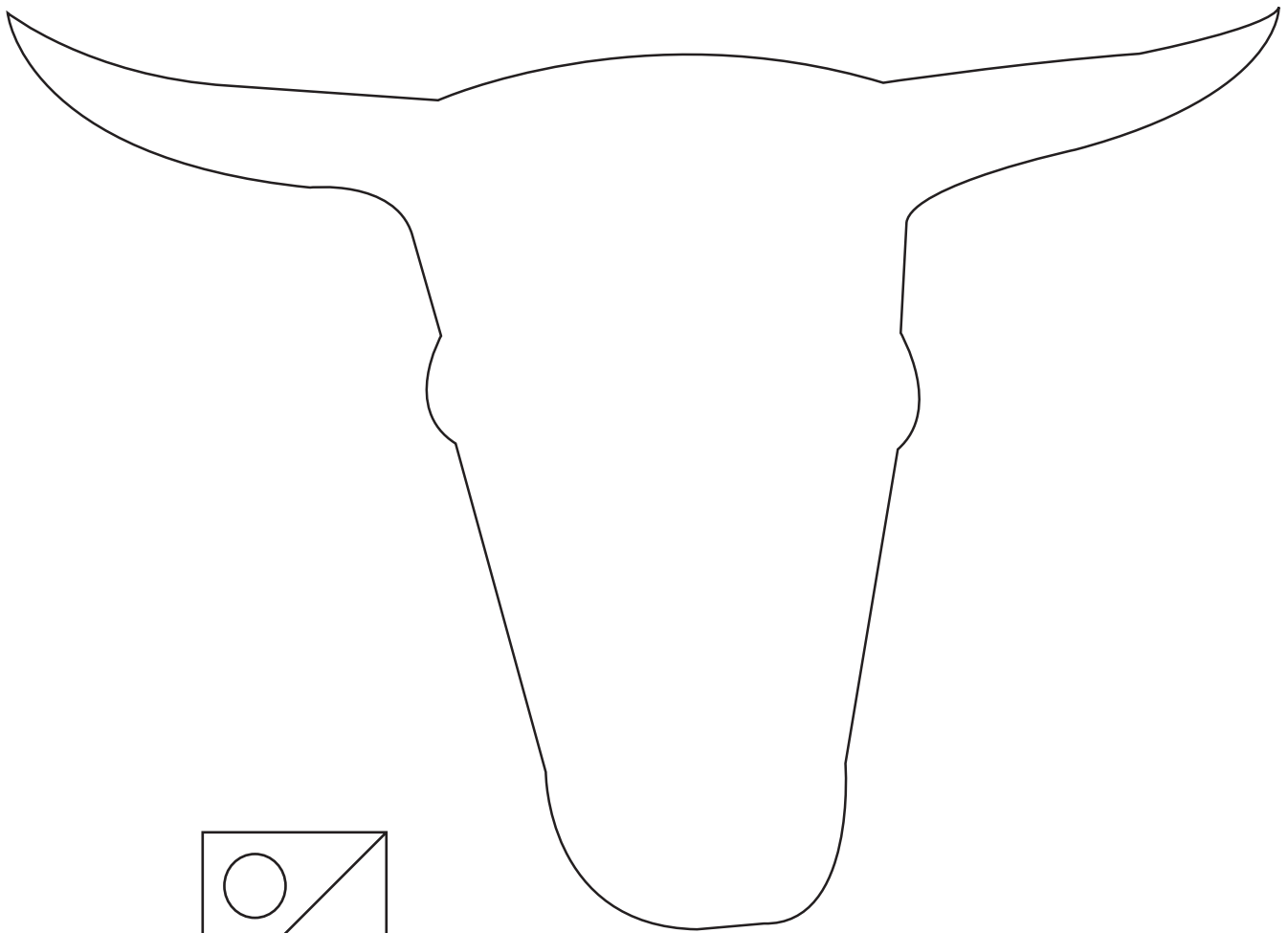


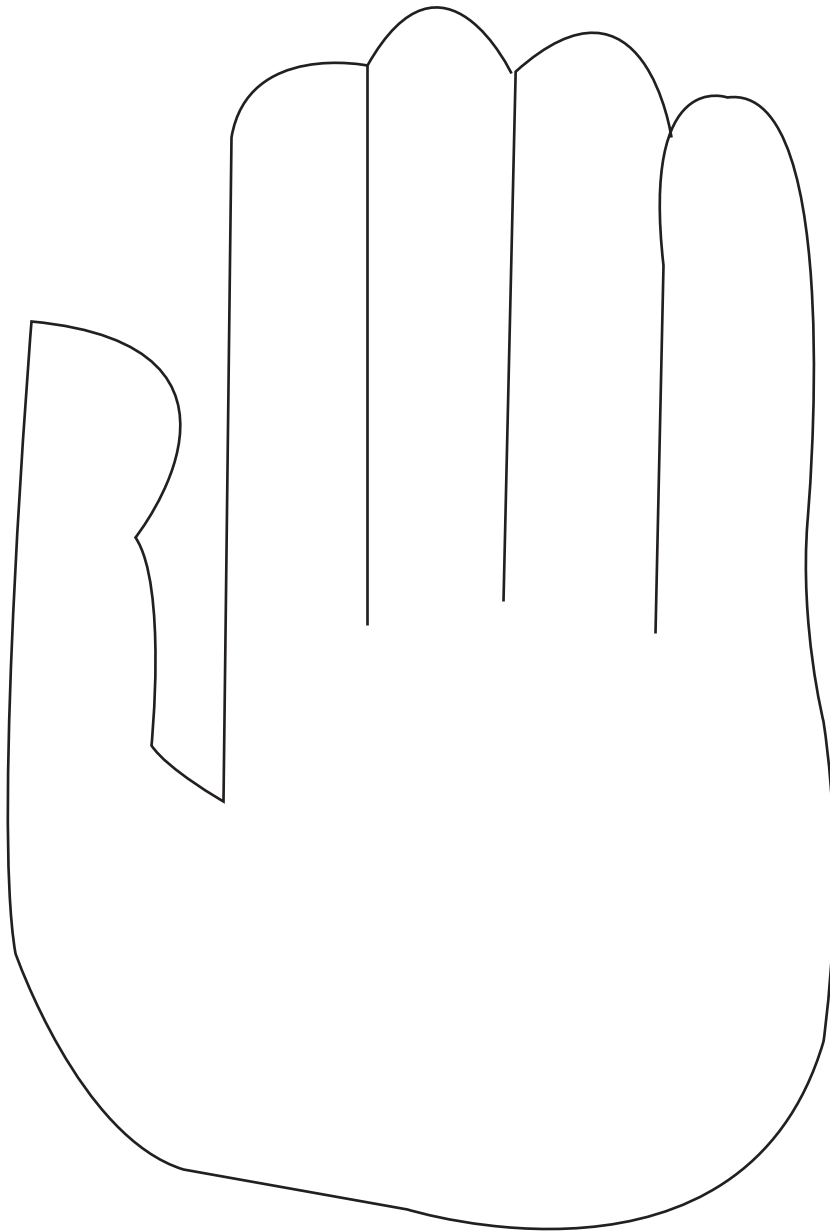
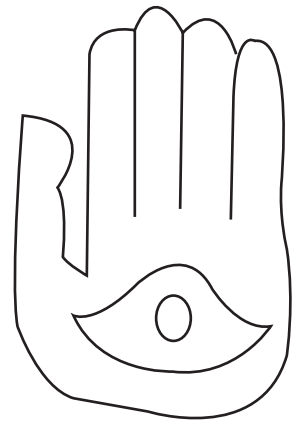
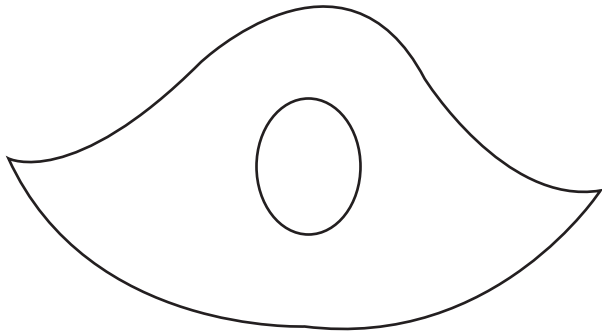


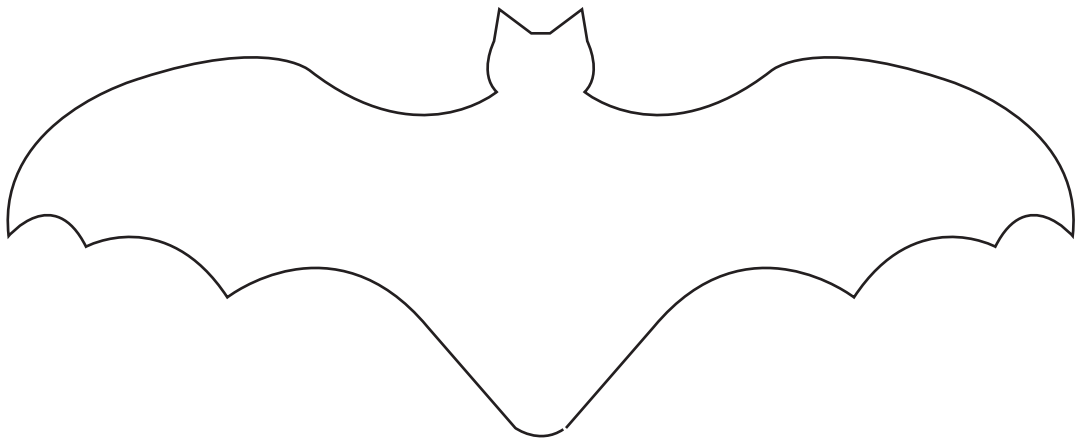
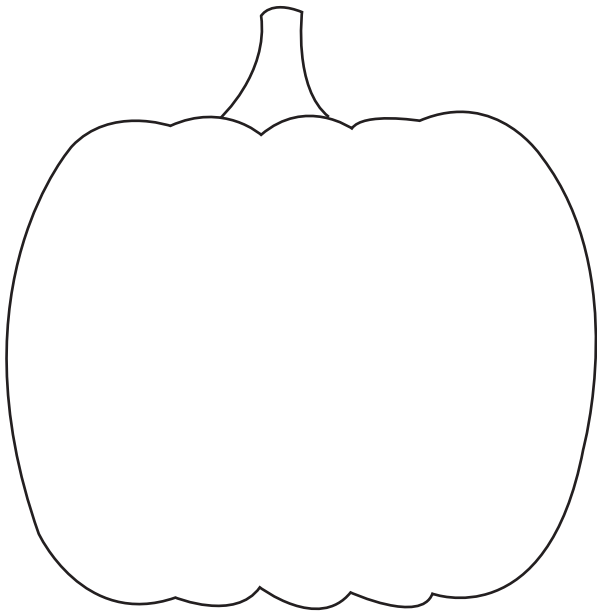
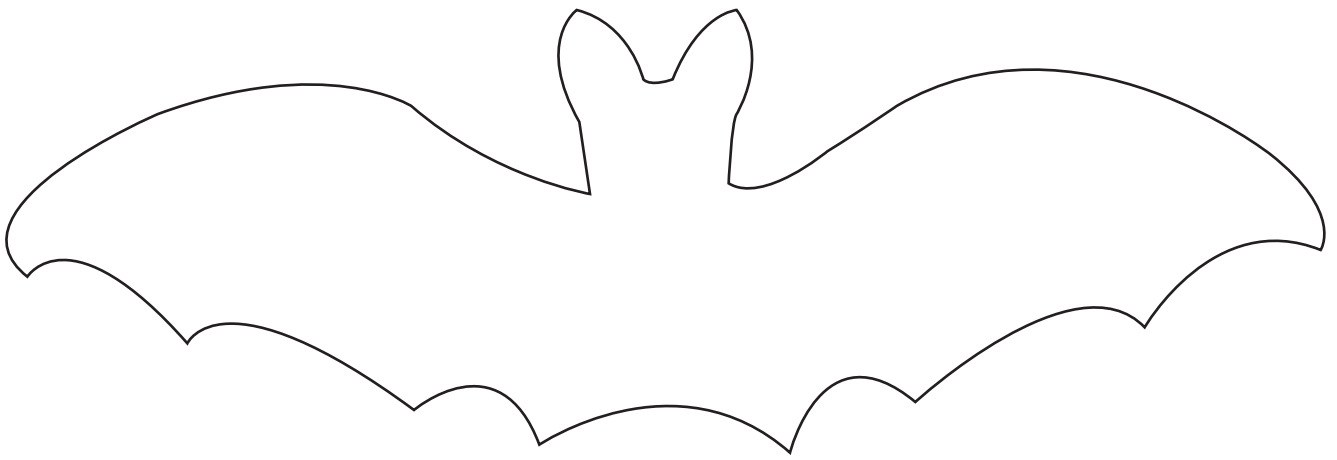
Patterns can also be used to render images from wire.

Warning: Please wear safety glasses when cutting wire.

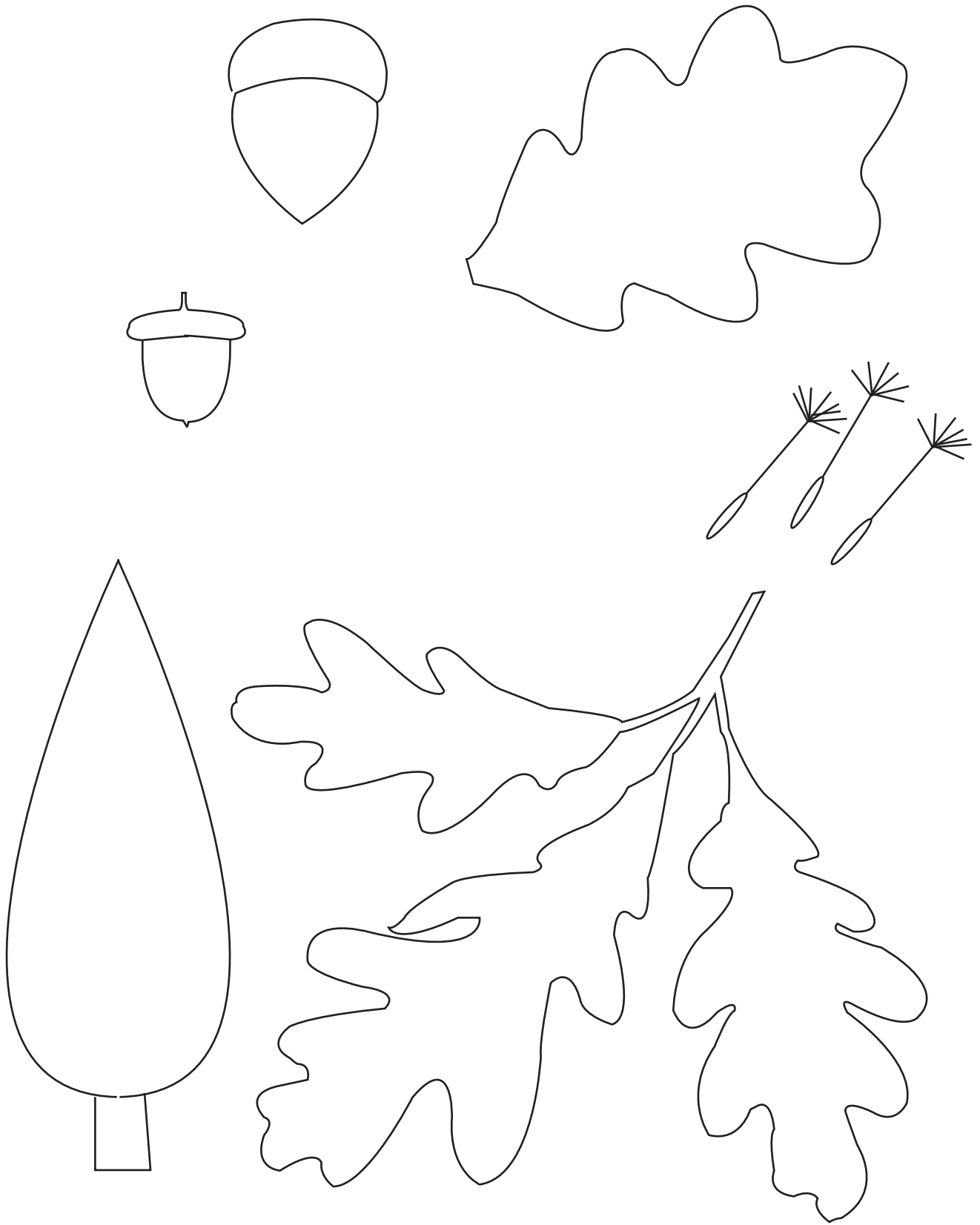


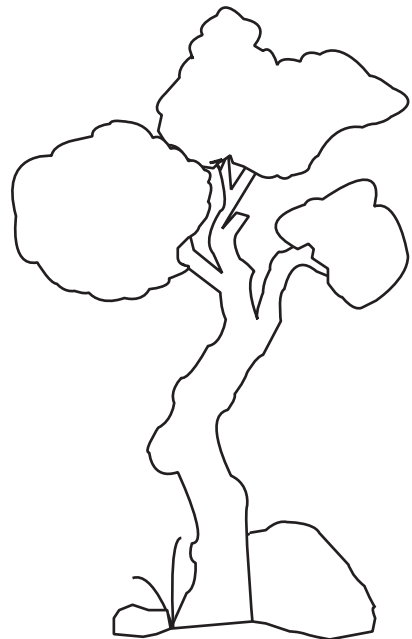
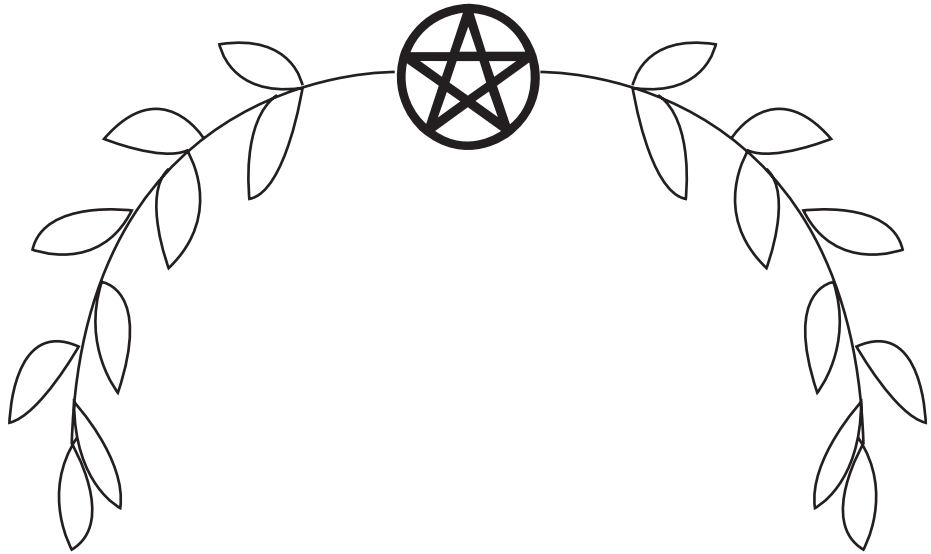
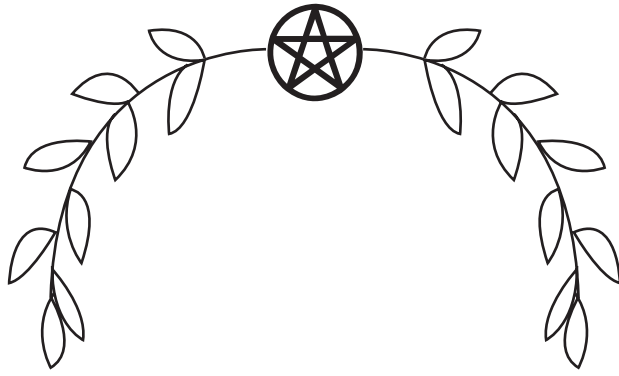
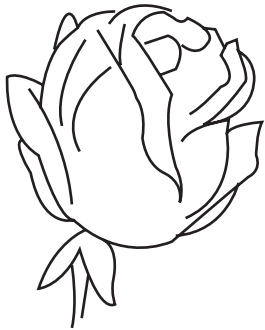
